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## Maritime Transportation Security Act Regulations (33 CFR parts 101-106)

- Regulations cover national, port, vessel, facility, and outer continental shelf security
- Generally, require vulnerability assessment at each level, followed by development of security plans to address vulnerabilities
- USCG reviews and approves plans for vessels and facilities



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# Maritime Transportation Security Act Regulations (33 CFR parts 101-106)

- Plans required to be kept on vessel and facility
- Plans are SSI per both the MTSA regulations and TSA's SSI regulations
  - 33 CFR 104.400(c) [vessels]
  - 33 CFR 105.400(c) [facilities]
  - 33 CFR 106.400(c) [OCS facilities]
  - 49 CFR 1520.5(b)(1)(ii) [all]



## TSA SSI Regulations (49 CFR 1520(b))

- Additional information used by U.S.C.G. qualifies as SSI:
  - Maritime Security Directives, including comments, instructions, and guidance
  - Navigation and Vessel Inspection Circular (NVIC), when related to maritime security
  - Performance specs
  - Vulnerability assessments
  - Threat information
  - Specific Security Measures
  - Screening information
  - Information on certain USCG personnel
