

## Members of the Southwest Border Task Force



**William "Bill" Webster** (Chair) served as the Director of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) from 1987 to 1991. Prior to his service as CIA Director, he served as Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and as a Judge on the United States Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit. Judge Webster has been awarded the Distinguished Intelligence Medal, Presidential Medal of Freedom, and the National Security Medal. Following his tenure as CIA Director, Judge Webster worked with the Law Firm Milbank, Tweed, Hadley, & McCloy.



**James "Jim" Jones** (Vice-Chair) is a partner with Manatt, Phelps & Phillips, LLC and Chairman and CEO of Manatt Jones Global Strategies. Jones served as U.S. Ambassador to Mexico from 1993 to 1997. Ambassador Jones served as President at Warnaco International and Chairman and CEO of the American Stock Exchange in New York from 1989 to 1993. Ambassador Jones represented Oklahoma in the House of Representatives for 14 years. At 28 years old, President Lydon Johnson selected him as the youngest Appointments Secretary (current Chief of Staff).



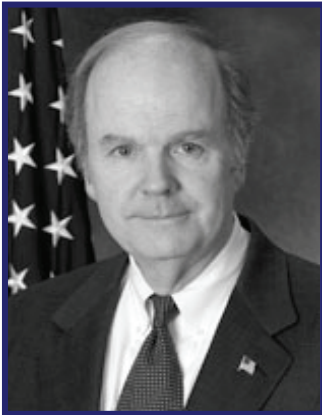
**Guadalupe "Lupe" Trevino** (Vice-Chair) is serving his second term as Sheriff of Hidalgo County, Texas. Sheriff Trevino started his law enforcement career with the Edinburg Police Department, was later hired by the Austin Police Department and then worked in the Hidalgo County District Attorney's Office as Chief Investigator and Commander of a street level drug task force and a state/federal HIDTA federal drug task force. Sheriff Trevino currently serves on the State of Texas Homeland Security Office Mass Migration Committee and on the Executive Committee of the Texas Radio Interoperability Coalition.



**Ruben Barrales** is the President and CEO of the San Diego Regional Chamber of Commerce. He served in the White House for five years as deputy assistant to President George W. Bush, where he was the President's liaison to state and local elected officials. Prior to joining the President's staff, Mr. Barrales was president and CEO of Joint Venture: In 1992, Mr. Barrales was elected to the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors and later became president of the Board of Supervisors in 1996. In 2005, Mr. Barrales received the "Ohtli Award" from the government of Mexico for his commitment to improving the well-being of Hispanics in the United States.



**Andrea Bazan** is President of Triangle Community Foundation. She served as the first Executive Director for El Pueblo, an advocacy and public policy organization in North Carolina. She serves as Chair of the Board of Directors of the National Council of La Raza (NCLR), and is a member of the Leadership Council of Hispanics in Philanthropy. She also sits on the boards of BlueCross BlueShield of North Carolina, and Wachovia Bank /Wells Fargo in Raleigh. Andrea is the recipient of numerous awards and recognitions including the 2006 Women of Achievement Award of the Federation of Women's Clubs.



**Robert "Rob" Bonner** is a senior principal of the Sentinel HS Group, a homeland security consulting firm. He is also a partner of Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher, LLP. Mr. Bonner served as the first Commissioner of U.S. Customs and Border Protection. Mr. Bonner has served as Commissioner of U.S. Customs Service, as Administrator of the Drug Enforcement Administration, as U.S. District Judge for the Central District of California, and as the U.S. Attorney for the Central District of California.



**Ray Borane** served as the Mayor of Douglas, Arizona, from 1996 to 2008. Prior to his service as Mayor, Mr. Borane was Assistant to the President of Northern Arizona University, Deputy State Superintendent of Public Instruction, and Superintendent of the Douglas Unified School District. While in Arizona, Mr. Borane served as Policy Advisor on Border and Immigration Issues to then Governor Napolitano. Mr. Borane was also an FBI Special Agent and currently serves as a Policy Advisor to the Governor of Arizona on Border and Immigration issues.



**Raymond Cobos** is the Sheriff of Luna County in Deming, New Mexico. Sheriff Cobos' career began in the U.S. Army. After returning from Vietnam, Sheriff Cobos joined the Luna County Sheriff's Department, where he worked for fifteen years. Later he joined the Federal Police at Ford Ord, California. He returned as the Detention Administrator and later Undersheriff of the Luna County Sheriff's Department before being elected Sheriff in 2006. Sheriff Cobos is also a volunteer with the GED Tutor Literacy Program.



**John Cook** has been the Mayor of El Paso, Texas since 2005. Prior to becoming mayor, Mr. Cook served as president of the El Paso Health Care Facilities Financing Corporation and El Paso Housing Finance Corporation. In his capacity as Mayor, Mr. Cook serves as Chairman of the Mass Transit Board. Mr. Cook is a former member of the United States Army and recipient of the Army Commendation Medal for Meritorious Service.



**Jeffrey Davidow** is the President of the Institute of the Americas. Ambassador Davidow spent 34 years in the State Department, eventually serving as Ambassador to Venezuela, Zambia, and Mexico. He also served as the Assistant Secretary of the Department of State. After leaving Mexico, Ambassador Davidow went to Harvard University as a Visiting Fellow at the John F. Kennedy School of Government and the David Rockefeller Center for Latin American Studies.



**Richard Dayoub** is the President and CEO of the Greater El Paso Chamber of Commerce. Previously, Dayoub had a successful career as the owner, president, and CEO of a large regional travel company for nearly thirty years. Dayoub was selected as a Ford Foundation Fellow, participating in an 18-month study with the American Chambers of Commerce Executives regarding regionalism and sustainable development.



**Victor Flores** is the Director of Executive Projects with the Arizona-Mexico Commission. Currently, he is on the State of Arizona Transportation Board, the board of the Valley of the Sun United Way, President of the Arizona-Mexico Commission board of directors, board member of Children's Action Alliance and board member of Vision Quest 20/20.



**Francis "Pancho" Kinney** is the Vice President for HNTB Federal. Before joining HNTB, Mr. Kinney was the Deputy Director of International Affairs within the Office of the Secretary at the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). General Montano began his military career in 1954 enlisting in the New Mexico Air National Guard. General Montano is a Vietnam veteran and was assigned as Assistant Adjutant General (Air) in April 1992.



**Kenny Montoya** assumed the duties as Adjutant General for the New Mexico National Guard, Santa Fe, NM on April 26, 2003. As Adjutant General he commands the Army and Air National Guard, as well as, serves as the commander of the State Defense Force. In addition to his federal duties, Major General Montoya serves as military chief of staff to the Governor, and as the Governor's principal advisor on military affairs. He is also president of the State Armory Board and provides oversight for the New Mexico Civil Air Patrol.



**Ned Norris Jr.** is the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham Nation, having also served as Vice Chairman. Prior to this election he worked with the Tohono O'odham Gaming Enterprise as Director of Marketing & Public Relations; Casino Manager; and Director of Community Relations. Chairman Norris serves as Chairman of the Arizona Indian Gaming Association, Vice Chairman of the Pima Association of Governments, and Co-Chairman of the National Congress of American Indians Homeland Security/Border Issues Workgroup.



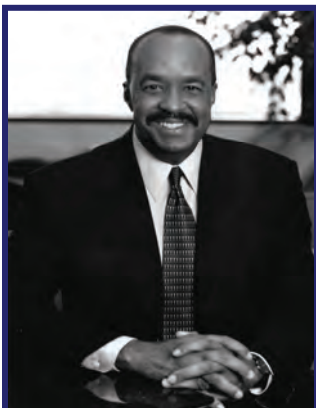
