



## Hack DHS: Crowdsourced Vulnerability Assessment Services (CVAS) IDIQ

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Hack DHS – Crowdsource Vulnerability Assessment Services (CVAS) Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contract is a multiple award vehicle. The scope under the Hack DHS IDIQ contract is to conduct crowdsourced vulnerability discovery and disclosure services across the full range of networks, systems, and information systems, including web applications, software, source code, hardware, software-embedded devices, and other technologies as solicited across the DHS Enterprise or other assets as deemed appropriate by the program office.

- Multiple vulnerability testing formats
  - Fixed duration
  - Continuous challenge
  - Live events
- Access to a range of expertise via 3 major CVAS research companies
- Ensures compliance with the 2018 law, "Strengthening and Enhancing Cyber-capabilities by Utilizing Risk Exposure Technology Act" or "SECURE Technology Act," Public Law 115-390, which requires DHS to establish a security vulnerability disclosure policy and develop and implement a bug bounty program for the Department
