

### **UNCLASSIFIED / /LAW ENFORCEMENT SENSITIVE**

Good morning Mr. Secretary and senior leaders. Please find below this morning's summary of civil unrest. Washington, DC and Portland OR were the only locations that experienced unrest. Kenosha, WI remained peaceful despite the Kenosha District Attorney announcing on Tuesday there will be no charges made against the police officer involved in an August 2020 domestic incident response shooting.

**BLUF:** There were **NO** incidents of criminal or illegal activity directed at federal facilities or personnel and **NO** events where DHS law enforcement were deployed.

**Washington, DC:** In DC, approximately 3,000 gathered in Freedom Plaza during the day and into the night. Speakers addressed the crowd and protests remained peaceful until dark. The crowd began to dissipate after dark, but there were numerous altercations near BLM plaza. MPD deployed pepper spray while keeping opposing groups separated during the march / demonstration.

- \* MPD made at least six arrests during the unrest. Two were for firearm charges, two
  for possession of carrying unregistered ammunition / magazines, one for simple assault,
  and one for possession of a prohibited weapon (taser).
- \* There were no reported injuries.

Roughly 26 demonstration permits were approved by the US Park Police for 5 to 7 January including Freedom Plaza, Washington Monument, the National Mall Area and the Capitol. Permit application estimates indicate there could be approximately 30,000 people in attendance. At least 55 additional demonstrations have been mentioned on social media for 6 January, but it is unclear whether any are permitted, or if they are subgroups associated with larger demonstrations. Committed attendees for these smaller events appears to be minimal.

POTUS is scheduled to speak at 1100 EST 6 January at a permitted Women for America First event to be held on the White House Ellipse. Per National Park Service, expected attendance is around 5,000 participants. The event is scheduled from 0900 to 1200 EST; USPP is the lead federal agency for the event and USSS is in support.

**Portland, OR:** About 50 people marched to the Portland Police Bureau (PPB) North Precinct. Violent Opportunists threw glass bottles, paint and other objects toward police, blocked traffic with two dumpsters lit on fire, spray-painted graffiti on multiple store fronts, damaged police vehicle tires using spikes, and repeatedly moved temporary fencing in place outside the precinct.

- \* PPB deployed several times to clear roads, restore the fencing, and keep agitators back from the precinct entrance.
- \* PPB gave several warnings and made five arrests but did not declare an unlawful assembly or use non-lethal munitions.
- \* There were no reported injuries.

**Kenosha, WI:** The Kenosha District Attorney announced there will be no charges made against the police officer involved in a 23 Aug 2020 domestic incident response shooting. Ensuing demonstrations remained peaceful, peaking at around 60 protesters.


There are National Guard Personnel in GA, WI and DC who remain activated or on standby for civil unrest. The DC National Guard has activated personnel, with additional activations possible today.

As of today, DHS OPS and National Operations Center coordinated with Federal departments and agencies to identify any additional precautionary actions for enhanced security postures

and stood up the DHS Virtual Situation Room effective 0600 EST, 5 Jan to facilitate department and interagency communication and coordination. There are currently no unmet needs.



Good morning Mr. Secretary and senior leaders. Please find below this morning's summary of civil unrest. Washington, DC and Portland OR were the only locations that experienced unrest. Kenosha, WI remained peaceful despite the Kenosha District Attorney announcing on Tuesday there will be no charges made against the police officer involved in an August 2020 domestic incident response shooting.

**BLUF:** There were **NO** incidents of criminal or illegal activity directed at federal facilities or personnel and **NO** events where DHS law enforcement were deployed.

**Washington, DC:** In DC, approximately 3,000 gathered in Freedom Plaza during the day and into the night. Speakers addressed the crowd and protests remained peaceful until dark. The crowd began to dissipate after dark, but there were numerous altercations near BLM plaza. MPD deployed pepper spray while keeping opposing groups separated during the march / demonstration.

- \* MPD made at least six arrests during the unrest. Two were for firearm charges, two
  for possession of carrying unregistered ammunition / magazines, one for simple assault,
  and one for possession of a prohibited weapon (taser).
- • \* There were no reported injuries.

Roughly 26 demonstration permits were approved by the US Park Police for 5 to 7 January including Freedom Plaza, Washington Monument, the National Mall Area and the Capitol. Permit application estimates indicate there could be approximately 30,000 people in attendance. At least 55 additional demonstrations have been mentioned on social media for 6 January, but it is unclear whether any are permitted, or if they are subgroups associated with larger demonstrations. Committed attendees for these smaller events appears to be minimal.

POTUS is scheduled to speak at 1100 EST 6 January at a permitted Women for America First event to be held on the White House Ellipse. Per National Park Service, expected attendance is around 5,000 participants. The event is scheduled from 0900 to 1200 EST; USPP is the lead federal agency for the event and USSS is in support.

**Portland, OR:** About 50 people marched to the Portland Police Bureau (PPB) North Precinct. Violent Opportunists threw glass bottles, paint and other objects toward police, blocked traffic with two dumpsters lit on fire, spray-painted graffiti on multiple store fronts, damaged police vehicle tires using spikes, and repeatedly moved temporary fencing in place outside the precinct.

- \* PPB deployed several times to clear roads, restore the fencing, and keep agitators back from the precinct entrance.
- \* PPB gave several warnings and made five arrests but did not declare an unlawful assembly or use non-lethal munitions.
- \* There were no reported injuries.


**Kenosha, WI:** The Kenosha District Attorney announced there will be no charges made against the police officer involved in a 23 Aug 2020 domestic incident response shooting. Ensuing demonstrations remained peaceful, peaking at around 60 protesters.

There are (b)(7)(E) National Guard Personnel in GA, WI and DC who remain activated or on standby for civil unrest. The DC National Guard has activated (b)(7)(E) personnel, with additional activations possible today.

As of today, DHS OPS and National Operations Center coordinated with Federal departments and agencies to identify any additional precautionary actions for enhanced security postures and stood up the DHS Virtual Situation Room effective 0600 EST, 5 Jan to facilitate department and interagency communication and coordination. There are currently no unmet needs.





Please find below this morning's summary of civil unrest overnight. Peaceful First Amendment-protected activity occurred in Portland OR, Minneapolis MN and Los Angeles, CA.

**BLUF:** There were <u>no</u> incidents of civil unrest directed at federal facilities or personnel. FPS made <u>no</u> arrests and reported <u>no</u> injuries and <u>no</u> damage to federal property.

**Portland, OR:** Approximately 50 peaceful protesters marched ¼ mile from Director Park to the Multnomah County Justice Center and back, dispersing by 0145 EST. Although social media indicates damage to a few businesses along the group's path, there has been no official reporting by Portland Police Bureau.

**Minneapolis, MN:** Approximately 100 peaceful protesters gathered in downtown Minneapolis to protest a fatal police shooting which occurred last night.

- Police effected a traffic stop of a felony suspect at a filling station, where the suspect exited his vehicle and shot at them. The suspect was killed in the ensuing exchange of gunfire, but his female passenger was unharmed.
- Police established a heavy presence when protesters gathered near the scene of the incident. All remained peaceful, dispersing by 0100 EST.
- Law enforcement officials plan to release bodycam recordings of the incident today.

**Los Angeles, CA:** A group protesting the state mandate for wearing masks scuffled with a counter protest group wanting to shield the local homeless population from

possible COVID infection. There are no reported injuries, arrests or confrontations with police.

Please find below this morning's summary of civil unrest. Salem OR was the only location that experienced unrest.

**BLUF:** There were **NO** incidents of criminal or illegal activity directed at federal facilities or personnel and **NO** events where DHS law enforcement were deployed. There was **one** report of demonstration-related unlawful activity in Salem, OR.

**Salem, OR:** In the afternoon, a crowd of about 200 people started at the capitol building and marched to the governor's residence. After several hours of peaceful demonstrations, a small group clashed with a counter group as they returned downtown. Salem Police declared an unlawful assembly and made numerous arrests. There was no violence reported at the governor's residence.

- Salem Police, Oregon State Police and the Marion County Sheriff's Office were deployed and monitored the crowd.
- Salem Police declared an unlawful assembly after incidents of violence between groups of counter protesters.
- Aggressive VOs used pepper spray or some other chemical against officers.
- Law enforcement officials made numerous arrests for unknown charges. They did not employ less than lethal munitions to disperse the crowd.

On 31  $\text{Dec}_{0}^{(b)(7)(E)}$  National Guard personnel in TX demobilized. GA is now the only state with National Guard personnel activated or on standby for civil unrest.


