Mr. Secretary: Good evening/morning. Below is a summary of the NCR coordination call requested by A/SecDef Miller. The call started on time at 1700 EST and concluded approximately 1745 EST. Please let me know if you have any additional questions. v/r Chris

Call participants: A/SecDef and Dep SecDef; DCNG Commanding General; Acting AG and Dep Dir FBI; Sec Interior; Sec Army; Army Chief of Staff; APDNSA and other Pentagon reps.

Order of Call:

Intro by A/SecDef: Feels everything coming together. Will ask first for update from Sec Army and then hear from interagency partners.

Sec Army: Expect crowd sizes similar to 11/14 and 12/12 with the possibility of maybe more violence. Approved DC request for (b)(7)(E) DCNG. Teams will be used for crowd control at Metro stations, traffic check points and will have a CBRNE team and medical/command-and-control. No aviation assets, intel assets or active duty troops. DCNG members will be paired with Metro PD cops. Missions start tomorrow (Tue). Looking for a lead federal agency to coordinate.

DCNG Commanding General: Concurred with Sec Army assessment. Thanked all on call for support. Will have (b)(7)(E) members staged at Andrew (b)(7)(E)

Sec Interior: 3 permits issued for the ellipse. No expectation that Interior/USPP will need or request any DOD support.

DHS: I passed that our LEO force posture projections and crowd size estimates remain the same from yesterday. DHS is aware of 26 protest groups with permits from 5-7 Jan. We are in coordination with both DC Metro and US Capitol Police who will both be at full activation on 6 Jan. (b)(7)(E)

(b)(7)(E)

(b)(7)(E) A/SecDef Miller thanked for the update and asked how well we were connected with USCP? I explained that the USCP has an assigned LNO to the NOC and he was pleased to hear that. No additional questions or asks of DHS by A/SecDef Miller or anyone else on call.

A/AG: Stated he had FBI Dep (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) with him. (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) stated reps could be sent but it will be a smaller footprint than over the summer due to COVID. (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E). Agreed with everyone else's crowd size estimates of between 10k-25k.

Dep SecDef: Nothing to pass

CJCS: Chairman's math equals about (b)(7)(E) fed and local LEOs available in the NCR. (b)(7)(E) DCNG potentially available. Given crowd size, should be plenty of LEOs without needing additional DOD. Expects White House to be center of gravity in the morning and remain relatively peaceful...focus shifts to the Capitol in the afternoon and the most vulnerable will be after dark when crowds splinter off into smaller groups. He suggested that a group should prebrief Congress on security planning. Glad that he heard A/AG say that DOJ will be LFA (**Note: A/AG did not use those words but implied the same and the A/AG didn't correct the Chairman when the Chairman stated that DOJ will be LFA**). DOD forces will be in standard issued field uniform without weapons, helmets, flak jackets...All should consider uniforms and being in a de-escalatory posture.

APNSA: Nothing to pass.

Summary by A/SecDef Miller that it appears that everything is coming together well and this group should back out and let the experts work it. Suggested no need for any further calls. Asked if anyone thought differently...silence.

Decisions made:

- DOJ is LFA
- No further calls scheduled at this point in time.
- DOD approved DCNG support
- DOJ is activating the (b)(7)(E) WFO command posts

Follow ups:

- OPSDEP call tomorrow (tue)...will review overall plans with OPSDEPS. Will stress issues about uniform and being perceived as de-escalatory. (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E)
- No one took lead on the CJCS suggestion about briefing Congress but we will be postured to lend our support to any interagency effort. Will loop in OLA/OPA if a request is received from the LFA to support an interagency Congressional brief.
- Will ensure we are connected with reps for the FB (b)(7)(E) WFO Command Post and MP (b)(7)(E)

Good morning Mr. Secretary and senior leaders. Please find below this morning's summary of civil unrest. Washington, DC and multiple cities throughout the US experienced civil unrest, including many state capitals.

BLUF: There was **ONE** incident of illegal activity directed at a federal facility where also DHS Law Enforcement officers were deployed. Violent opportunists (VOs) breached and overran portions of the US Capitol building in Washington, DC during a joint session of Congress to certify presidential electoral college voting. FPS and USSS along with numerous law enforcement agencies deployed personnel to assist in securing the building. At least 50 arrests were made. 14 DC Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) officers were injured, with no reported DHS LE officers injured. There were no reports of criminal activity directed at federal facilities or federal law enforcement responses in other cities.

As of 0430 EST 7 Jan, there were (b)(7)(E) National Guard personnel in GA, WI, and DC activated for civil unrest. The DC National Guard has been fully mobilized to provide law enforcement support. Additional National Guard support from other states, including MD, NY, VA, PA, DE and NJ is being coordinated, (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) State troopers from VA, MD, and NJ were also deployed to DC to assist.

Washington, DC: At approximately 0800 EST, crowds began forming at the Ellipse and Washington Monument. By 1000 EST the crowd near the Ellipse had grown to 25,000. (b)(7)(E)

(b)(7)(E)
(b)(7)(E) Following event speeches on the Ellipse, a large group marched to the US Capitol Building where Congress had begun the electoral vote certification process.

At approximately 1330 EST, a large group of agitators pushed through portable crowd control barricades and entered the US Capitol grounds. The group vastly outnumbered US Capitol Police (USCP) and used chemical irritants to help gain access. At 1429 EST, VOs breached the Capitol building, prompting relocation of the Vice President and members of Congress to safe locations.

DHS LEOs (FPS and USSS), DC National Guard (DCNG), VA State Police, and various other LE agencies responded to augment the USCP. (b)(7)(E)

(b)(7)(E) At 1800 ET, the USCP Sergeant at Arms announced the U.S. Capitol secure. By 2100 all DHS LE personnel, less 6 K-9 teams from the USSS, were released from support.

Soon after the breach began, an agitator who was attempting to access the Speaker's Lobby behind the House chamber via a broken-out entry door sidelight was shot in the neck by a USCP officer. The 35-year-old US Air Force veteran from San Diego, CA later succumbed to her injuries. MPD is currently leading the investigation into the death. Three others died of medical emergencies during the day. At least 14 MPD officers were injured.

MPD reported over 50 arrests during the demonstrations, four of which were on gun charges. Bomb squads responded to render safe two pipe bomb devices discovered outside both the DNC and RNC headquarters. (b)(7)(E) A cooler containing Molotov cocktails was also found on the Capitol building grounds.

Congress reconvened at approximately 2000 EST to complete their joint session after the Capitol building was cleared and an extensive LE presence was established (b)(7)(E)

The DC Mayor ordered a Wednesday night curfew from 1800 to 0600 EST and declared a citywide 15-day state of emergency. She has the option of ordering similar nightly curfews during that period as needed. MPD has made at least 40 additional arrests Wednesday night for curfew violations. The Governor of VA declared a State of Emergency and ordered a Wednesday night curfew for the City of Alexandria and for Arlington County.

Portland, OR: About 75 people gathered downtown outside the Justice Center, moved to the Multnomah County Courthouse (across Lowndale Square from the Hatfield Federal Courthouse) and began trying to pry open the doors. Violent Opportunists then vandalized local businesses in the area by breaking windows.

- PPB gave several warnings before declaring an unlawful assembly.
- No injuries or arrests were reported.
- No federal buildings were impacted, and no federal officers were deployed.
- The FPS force laydown in Portland, OR on Wednesday evening was (b)(7)(E)

Salem, OR: A group of about 300 gathered at the Oregon Capitol building. After counter-protesters arrived, a few incidents of violence between groups took place. The Salem PD declared an unlawful assembly and dispersed the crowd. SPD reported two arrested were made.

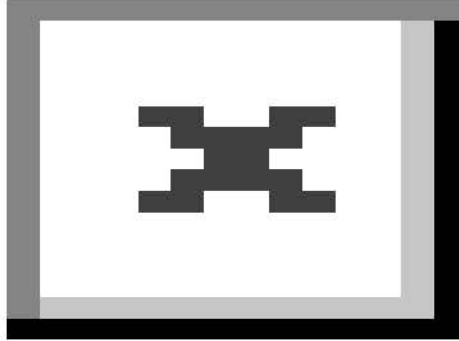
Olympia, WA: At approximately 1600 EST, roughly 50 member of a crowd breached the fence to the Governor's mansion. Washington State Patrol responded and the crowd became compliant. There were no reports of damage or injury.

Sacramento, CA: Several hundred protesters converged on the CA Capitol building during the afternoon. Over 200 Sacramento police (SPD) officers were assigned to the gatherings. SPD arrested eleven members of the crowd for charges related to illegal possession of pepper spray. SPD also reported one demonstrator was assaulted but not injured and there were no injuries to police officers. A large police presence remained in the area overnight.

OUTLOOK: As of reporting from 06 Jan, there are only two permitted demonstrations within the NCR scheduled for today with a combined estimate of 25 attendees. FPS, CBP, ICE, USSS, USCG and TSA have identified additional LE officers on standby but there is currently no request for DHS LE assistance.

Preparations for Civil Disturbances - Week of 4 January 2021

Situational Overview

Large groups of demonstrators are anticipated to travel to Washington, DC as early as 4 January in advance of the Congressional certification of the electoral vote on 6 January. Past encounters between opposing protest groups have occasionally led to violence between them and against law enforcement personnel, as well as damage to private and government property.

Roughly 26 demonstration permits have been approved by the US Park Police for 5 to 7 January including Freedom Plaza, Washington Monument, the National Mall Area and the Capitol, and (b)(7)(F)

(b)(7)(E) permit application estimates indicate there could be approximately 28,000 people in attendance for these events. At least 55 additional demonstrations have been mentioned on social media for 6 January, but it is unclear whether any are permitted, or if they are subgroups associated with larger demonstrations. Committed attendees for these smaller events appears to be minimal.

DHS Operations Coordination (DHS OPS) conducted a Law Enforcement Operations Deputies coordination call on 3 January (b)(7)(E)

(b)(7)(E), and identify operational gaps. DHS OPS and National Operations Center is coordinating with Federal departments and agencies to

identify any additional precautionary actions to enhance their security posture as described below and invite them to collaborate (b)(7)(E)

DHS Preparations

DHS HQ

(b)(7)(E)

- The DHS OPS-NOC is host to several major metropolitan and regional Law Enforcement liaison officers who are available 24/7 for matters in their jurisdictional areas.
 - DHS NOC LE LNOs available include: US Capitol Police, Supreme Court of the US, DOT
 - DHS NOC has established direct links with: US Park Police, FBI WFO, FB (b)(7)(E)
- The NOC has a permanent FPS liaison officer who is also available 24/7.

(b)(7)(E)

FPS

- FPS is not aware of any specific federal facilities being targeted, but based on the nature of this event, FPS areas of concern will be Lafayette Square and any federal buildings in the vicinity of the Capitol building.
- FPS intends to staff (b)(7)(E) law enforcement officers (LEOs) on 6 January. FPS has completed coordination with CBP and ICE for coverage at the Ronald Reagan Building and ICE HQ.

(b)(7)(E)

- • Approximately 31 federal facilities are located along projected protest march routes.

USSS

- (b)(7)(E) USSS Office of Protective Operations / Presidential Protective Division advised that POTUS will hold an event on the Ellipse on Wed, 6 January from approximately 0900 to 1200 EST (see additional event information in DOI update below).

NOTE: The Ellipse falls under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Park Police. USSS full normal security measures (b)(7)(E) will be in place. (b)(7)(E)

(b)(7)(E)

- • Viewing stands that were being set up for inauguration are being dismantled, with a portion of Pennsylvania Ave closed.
- • The 10 to 12-foot US Park Police fence at Lafayette Park remains in place.

CBP

- • CBP has identified (b)(7)(C) law enforcement personnel in the NCR available to support FPS as needed (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) They will be on a two to three-hour recall to support FPS as needed (b)(7)(E)

(b)(7)(E)

- • CBP and FPS are coordinating for both the security of CBP buildings (RRB) and available augmentation to FPS to protect federal facilities.

ICE

- • ICE and FPS are coordinating the security of ICE buildings (ICE HQ) and have identified augmentation to FPS to protect federal facilities.

(b)(7)(E)

TSA

- • TSA (b)(7)(E) teams will be active at Reagan National and Dulles International Airports on 5 and 6 January.
- • The number of FAMS at Reagan National and Dulles will be increased as well.

Interagency Preparations

Washington Metropolitan Police Department (MPD)

- (b)(7)(E) planned protests.
- • MPD will have all staff reporting for response on 5 and 6 January.
- • The DHS OPS National Operations Center is in direct contact with the MPD (b)(7)(E)

US Capitol Police (USCP)

- All personnel will be on duty or standby from 4 through 6 January.
- Off-watch personnel are considered response assets and (b)(7)(E)
(b)(7)(E)
(b)(7)(E)
- 'Bike rack' and 'snow' type fencing around the Capitol grounds has been added in advance of the State of the Union Address, which will also assist with crowd control this week.

DOI – US Park Police (USPP)

- • POTUS intends to speak at 1100 EST 6 January at a permitted Women for America First event to be held on the White House Ellipse. Per National Park Service (NPS), expected attendance is around 5,000 participants for this 0500 to 1630 EST 6 January event. Previous similar First Amendment demonstrations have led to widespread violence in the downtown DC area.
- • USPP has a detail of personnel identified/assigned for increased operations support on 5 and 6 January.
- • On 6 January, USPP will have all personnel originally scheduled to be "Off", resourced to support operations, along with the detailees.

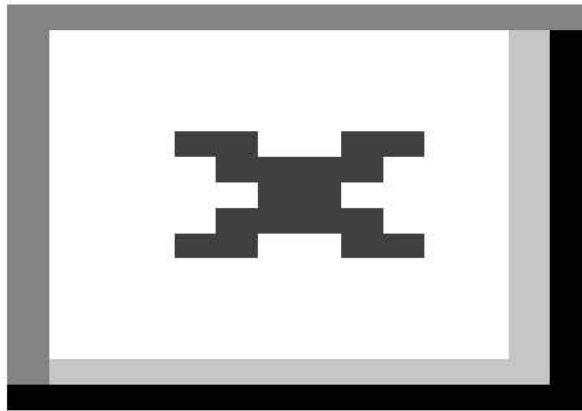

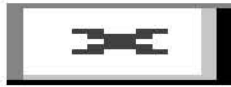

The MD Gov and the VA Gov have authorized their state police and national guard to assist DC Police and US Capitol Police. NJ State Police also sent state troopers to assist.

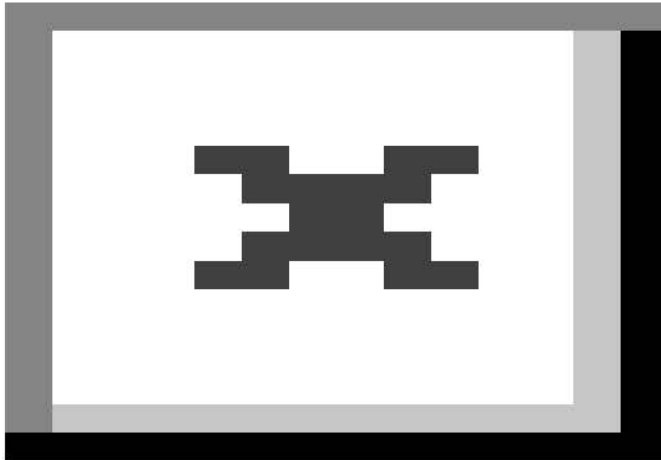
Media reported a possible explosive device outside of RNC HQ which was later rendered safe by LE. A second possible device was reported on the grounds of the U.S. Capitol and later rendered safe.

1850 ET, The U.S. Capitol Police confirmed the U.S. Capitol is cleared and secured. The Mayor of DC has ordered a District-wide curfew commencing tonight, January 6, 2021, at 6:00 pm and ending at 6:00 am on Thursday, January 7, 2021. During the hours of the curfew, no person, other than persons designated by the Mayor, shall walk, bike, run, loiter, stand, ride a scooter, or motor by car or other mode of transport upon any street, alley, park, or other public place within the District.

The Governor of VA has instituted a curfew from 1800 ET to 0600 ET on January 6-January 7 in Alexandria City and Arlington County. Governor Northam also announced plans to issue a State of Emergency in Virginia.

Program: WASO – Visitor and Resource Protection – United States Park Police

Key Points:

- The Women For America First will assemble on the Ellipse on January 6, 2021 for a First Amendment demonstration to protest the results of the 2020 elections.
- Expected attendance is around 5,000 participants.
- POTUS is expected to speak at the event at approximately 1100 hours.
- Previous similar First Amendment demonstrations have led to wide-spread violence in the downtown DC area.

Background:

On January 6, 2021, Congress will hold a joint session to formally certify the electoral votes from the 2020 election. It is expected that some members of Congress will object to the election results that the Biden-Harris ticket won the election. Numerous First Amendment demonstrations are expected in the downtown DC area to protest the results of this election. On November 14, 2020 and December 12, 2020, similar protests occurred. In both instances wide-spread violence occurred in the downtown DC area, perpetrated by both sides of the political spectrum.

Schedule of Events (January 6, 2021) (U//LES)

- 0500 hours: First wave of USPP personnel report for assignment.
- 0600 hours: USSS/USPP security sweeps begin.
- 0700 hours: Gates open to general public.

Preparations for Civil Disturbances - Week of 3 January 2021

Situational Overview

Large groups of demonstrators are anticipated to travel to Washington, DC as early as 4 January in advance of the Congressional certification of the electoral vote on 6 January. Past encounters between opposing protest groups have occasionally led to violence between them and against law enforcement personnel, as well as damage to private and government property. Numerous protest permits have been approved by the US Park Police including Freedom Plaza, Washington Monument, the National Mall Area and the Capitol, and several hotels are sold out on 5 and 6 January, both indicators of large crowds.

DHS Operations Coordination (DHS OPS) conducted a Law Enforcement Operations Deputies coordination call on 3 January to review the current DHS component posture, share and coordinate security planning, and identify operational gaps. DHS OPS and National Operations Center is coordinating with Federal departments and agencies to identify any additional precautionary actions to enhance their security posture as described below and invite them to collaborate in the (b)(7)(E)

- I&A further judges that violent extremists or other actors could quickly mobilize to violence or generate violent disruptions of otherwise lawful protests in response to a range of issues, including possible disputes over the results of the US presidential election.
- I&A remains in close coordination with DC-area Fusion Centers.

FPS

- FPS is not aware of any specific federal facilities being targeted, but based on the nature of this event, FPS areas of concern will be Lafayette Square and any federal buildings in the vicinity of the Capitol building.
- FPS intends to staff (b)(7)(E) law enforcement officers (LEOs) on 6 Jan and will coordinate as needed with CBP and ICE for coverage at the (b)(7)(E)

USSS

- (b)(7)(E) USSS Protectee Division stated there are early indications of a possible POTUS event on 6 Jan, but no official announcement or plans have been announced.
- Viewing stands that were being set up for inauguration are being dismantled, with a portion of Pennsylvania Ave closed.
- The (b)(7)(E) Park Police fence at Lafayette Park remains in place.

CBP

- CBP and FPS are coordinating for both the security of (b)(7)(E) and available augmentation to FPS to protect federal facilities.
 - CBP has identified (b)(7)(E) law enforcement personnel in the NCR available to support FPS as needed (b)(7)(E)

ICE

- ICE and FPS are coordinating the security of (b)(7)(E) and have identified augmentation to FPS to protect federal facilities.

TSA

- TSA Visible Intermodal Prevention and Response (VIPR) teams will be active at Reagan National and Dulles International Airports on 5 and 6 January.

Interagency Preparations

US Capitol Police (USCP)

- All personnel will be on duty or standby from 4 through 6 January.
- Off-watch personnel are considered response assets (b)(7)(E)

- 'Bike rack' and 'snow' type fencing around the Capitol grounds has been added in advance of the State of the Union Address, which will also assist with crowd control this week.

DOI – US Park Police (USPP)

- USPP has a detail of personnel identified/assigned for increased operations support on 5 and 6 January.
- On 6 January, USPP will have all personnel originally scheduled to be "Off", resourced to support operations, along with the detailees.

DOJ - FBI

- FBI operations relative to the potential unrest will be conducted out of their (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) There are no current plans to activate the national SIOC.

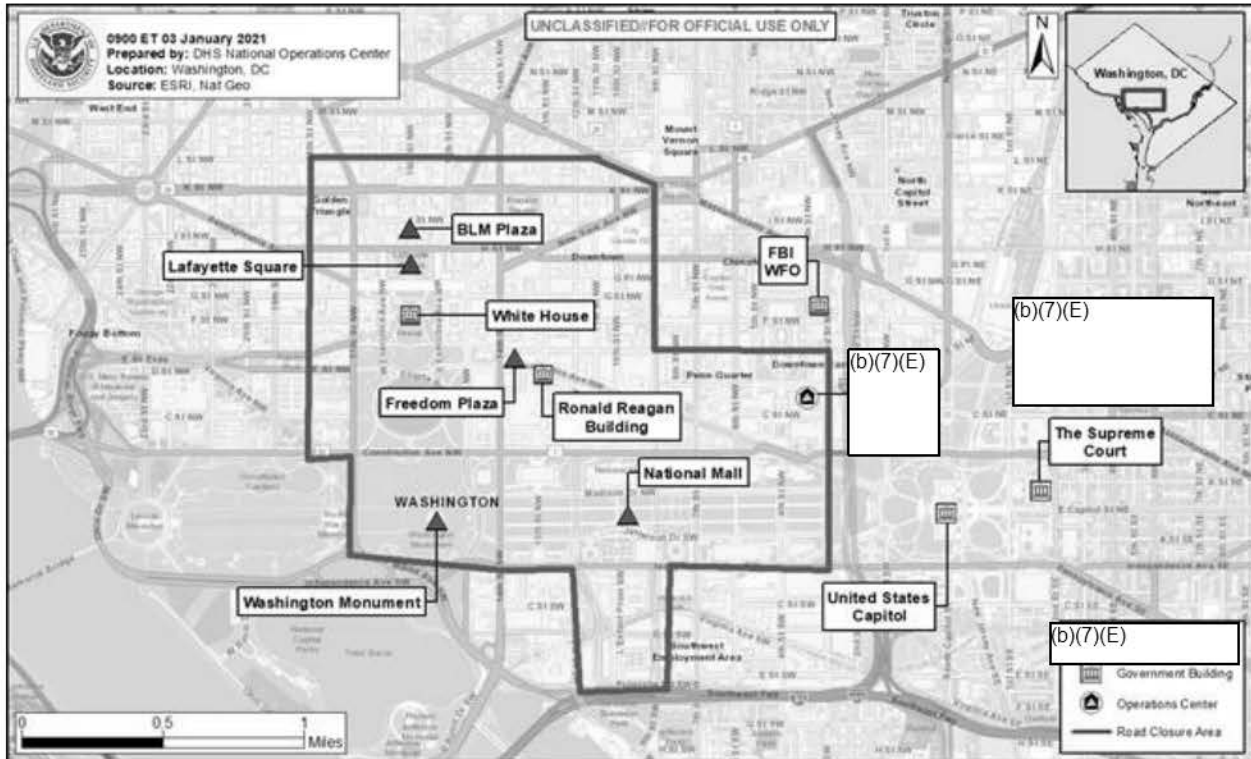
