



OASIS

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) adopted the General Services Administration's (GSA) One Acquisition Solution for Integrated Services (OASIS), OASIS Small Business (OASIS SB), and OASIS 8(a) contracts to procure professional services. OASIS, OASIS SB, and OASIS 8(a) are government-wide Best-in-Class, multiple-award, Indefinite Delivery/Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contracts that provide mission support professional services across many areas of expertise and disciplines, including:

- Program Management – includes acquisition, intelligence, investigative services, regulatory compliance, risk management
- Management Consulting – includes change management, social media consulting, tactical and readiness planning, training and facilitation
- Scientific – includes research and development
- Engineering – includes communication, energy, environment, test and evaluation
- Logistics – includes disaster management, integrated logistics support, security, transportation
- Finance – includes accounting, auditing, budget, grant management

Key Contract Features:

- Provides a broad and comprehensive range of support services;
- Offers a large pool of highly qualified contractors – both large and small businesses – giving DHS access to industry expertise;
- Promotes and supports DHS socioeconomic goals – total small business set-asides and “targeted” set-asides in all five socioeconomic categories are available;
- Allows flexibility for all contract types, including hybrids and cost-reimbursement, at the task order level; and
- Provides standardized labor categories aligned with occupations outlined in OMB's Standard Occupational Classification system.

Period of Performance (POP):

OASIS contracts were awarded in 2014 with a 10-year ordering period (five-year base and five-year option period). Notwithstanding contractors that may have been awarded contracts on different dates, through on-ramps and award batches, all contractors for each contract family have the same contract end dates.

- OASIS Small Business and OASIS 8(a) Pool contracts will expire on December 19, 2024 - no extensions are available.
- OASIS Unrestricted contracts will expire on September 2, 2024 unless extended pursuant to FAR 52.217-8.
