



# Instructor Development Threat Evaluation and Reporting Course (ID-TERC)

LSU NCBRT/Academy of Counter-Terrorist Education provides Department of Homeland Security (DHS) certified courses, taught by expert instructors, and will deliver all course materials to your training facility at no-cost to your agency.

## Course Summary

The ID-TERC is provided by LSU NCBRT in partnership with the Department of Homeland Security, Office of Intelligence & Analysis, National Threat Evaluation and Reporting (NTER) Program Office.

The ID-TERC is a four-day in-person, or five-day virtual, training that prepares Federal, State, Local, Tribal, and Territorial (F/SLTT) partners to train their local communities and empower homeland partners to mitigate threats and prevent acts of targeted violence.

The ID-TERC is exclusively available for those who apply to, and are accepted into, the NTER Master Trainer Program (MTP).

## Target Audience

The target audience for the ID-TERC is public sector, F/SLTT partners who work in the fields of public safety, emergency response, or violence prevention.

At this time, the ID-TERC is not available to private sector employees, including employees of Non-Profit Corporations, and Private Universities.

## Cost

There will be no tuition costs for students attending the ID-TERC.

Students or their home agencies will bear the cost of all travel related expenses, including flights, hotels, meals, and incidentals.

## Master Trainer Program

The MTP is an instructor development program that certifies F/SLTT partners in the instruction of Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management (BTAM) techniques and best practices.

To be certified as a Master Trainer, an applicant must first be accepted to, and attend, the ID-TERC.

Once accepted, an applicant will be considered a Master Trainer candidate.

Accepted Master Trainer candidates must complete the Master Trainer Certification Roadmap and may complete it in any order.

Master Trainer candidates will be selected based on the following criteria.

## Minimum Qualifications

- Current employee of a F/SLTT agency\*\*
- Minimum of two years' experience in public safety or a related field
- Participation endorsed by supervisor

## Preferred Qualifications

- Supervisory employee at a F/SLTT agency
- Professional or academic experience in targeted violence prevention or BTAM
- Certified Instructor/Trainer
