Sir,

FPS is not "patrolling the streets" in Portland. It is necessary, however, to operate around and between our facilities in order to protect them. Here's a common example of what this looks like. DHS assigns squads to the five federal facilities in Portland that are being impacted by civil disorder. A large group of violent opportunists gathers in front of one of the buildings and begins encroaching on the property and attacking the doors in a breach attempt. What generally happens next is:

**Situation:**

This is a continuation of ongoing 1<sup>st</sup> amendment events occurring in the Portland, Oregon area of operations. On July 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2020, the Mark O. Hatfield US Courthouse had been heavily vandalized and federal officers assaulted while stationed at the facility. Bad actors have become emboldened and are becoming increasingly violent and hostile to include brandishing weapons in the vicinity and pointing at federal facility.

**Mission:**

FPS along with partner agencies will take a proactive posture in order to prevent violence, vandalism, and civil unrest at federal facilities in the downtown Portland area. Assigned teams will proactively deny unauthorized access and damage/destruction to federal facilities. Identify bad actors and execute arrest.

**Execution:** (see map overlays for detailed info)

At onset of this operational period, FPS and partner agencies will be staged in Hatfield Courthouse and (b)(7)(E) FPS is the agency primarily responsible for protection of federal facilities and will take lead in the protection mission and the processing of arrested subjects for July 4, 2020, operations. Proactive law enforcement actions will be triggered by one or more or a combination of any of the following:

**Trigger events:**

Direct action by protester(s) against facility such as rocks, bricks, fireworks, firearms or other activity showing intent to breach federal facility

Attempts by protester(s) to secure doors to courthouse from the outside which creates a life safety issue for personal within facility

Large number of protesters in proximity of entrance/exits to federal facility thereby diminishing the capability for LEOs to observe action of crowd via video security system.

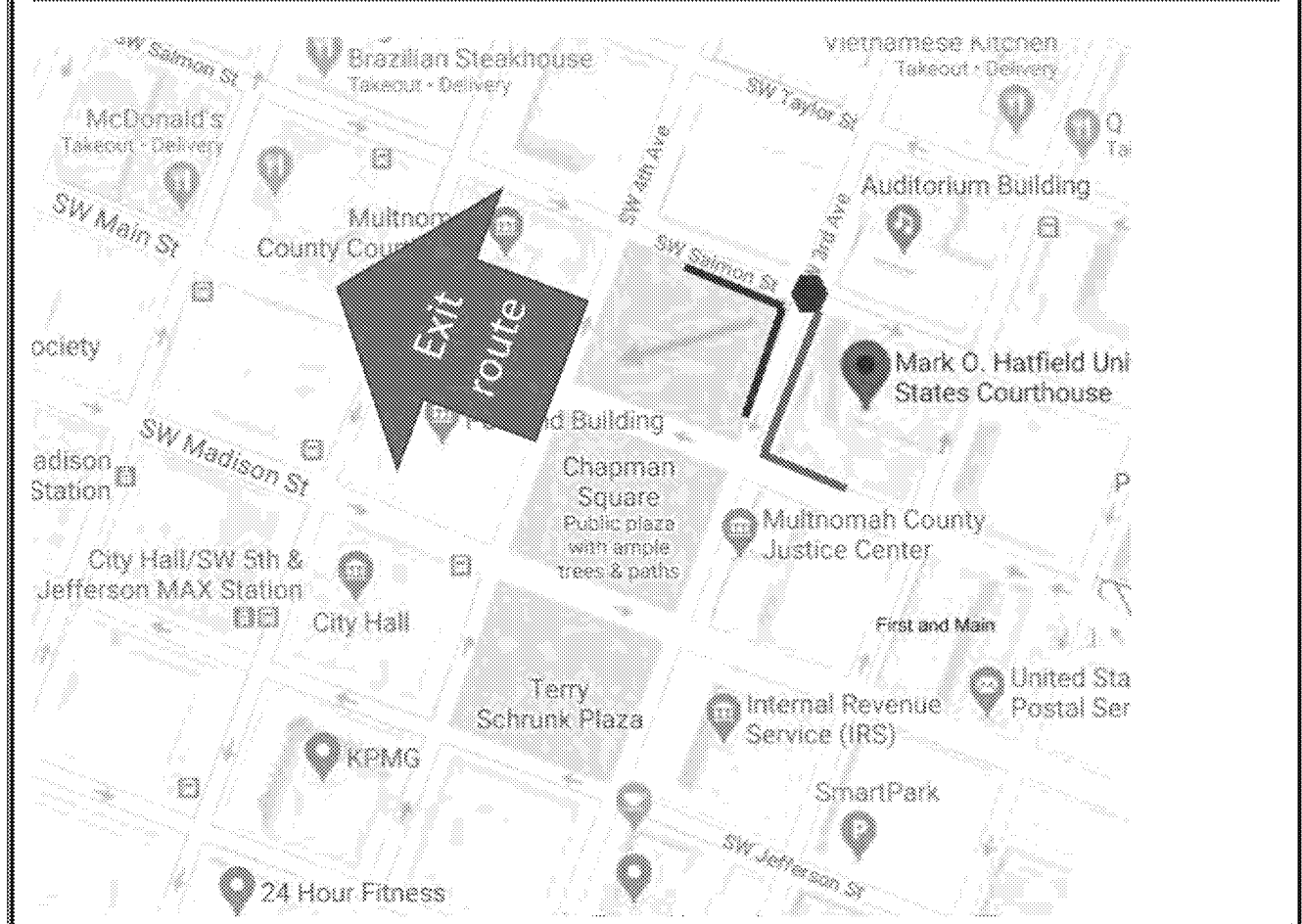

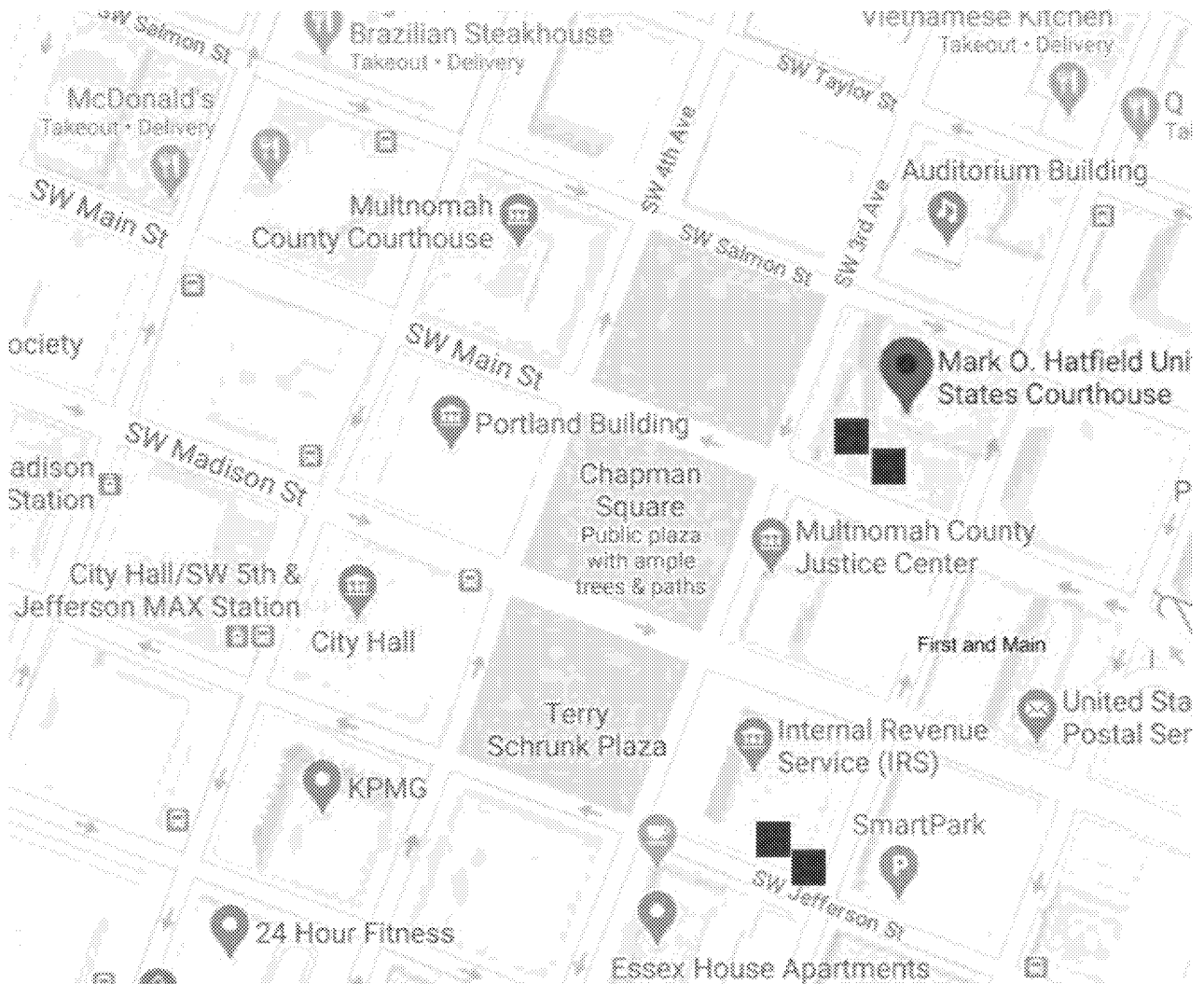

Approximately 21:50 PDT, approximately 50 protestors threw flares towards the boards on the front the Hatfield USCH. Approximately 500 demonstrators gathered adjacent to Hatfield USCH.

**07/04/20**

Between 21:50 and 00:59 PDT at Hatfield USCH, protestors spray painted and shot fireworks at the building and broke a surveillance camera off the building. The (b)(7)(E) team supporting FPS at the USCH arrested the suspects from the spray painting and camera vandalism. The crowd grew to an estimated 1,000+ and continued to throw rocks and paint-filled balloons and attempt to breach the doors. Combined DHS (FPS/CBP/ICE) teams utilized (b)(7)(E)

(b)(7)(E) to disperse the crowd. Portland Police Bureau continued to push the crowd away from the area. In the area, multiple individuals were seen carrying rifles, including the driver of a vehicle which attempted to strike a PPB officer in front of Hatfield USCH. PPB continued to push crowds further away.

**07/05/20**

Approximately 00:50 PDT, a large hostile crowd of about 250 has returned to vicinity of Hatfield USCH. This crowd vandalized and attacked numerous facilities and police while failing to comply with dispersal order. When DHS went to re-enter Hatfield USCH, rioters surrounded/blocked them and attacked with thrown projectiles and large mortar style fireworks. DHS deployed (b)(7)(E) to protect and move back into building. Two PPB officers were injured by the crowd (possible concussion). PPB took 5 in custody for directing lasers against aircraft.

Approximately 01:30 PDT, protestors built a fire in road in front of Hatfield Courthouse. Protesters also set numerous fires in Chapman park. Protesters then began throwing large fireworks, and other dangerous objects, at entrance to Hatfield Courthouse and DHS officers. Joint FPS/CBP/ICE/USMS unit conducted second push and drove crowd away from Hatfield Courthouse and past Lownsdale and Chapman parks. PPB is continuing to push crowd out of area. At this time there has been one protester taken into custody and no injuries to LEOs or protesters.

PPB continues to push violent protesters out of the downtown area. DHS units continue protecting federal assets and preparing for potential 3rd wave of violence.

(Updated 05:30 EDT 07/13/20)

Significant activities this period included FPS coordination and utilization of multi-component support to operations in Portland, OR to address continuing (but potentially decreasing) civil unrest.

### Portland, OR

07/11/2020

Between 00:01 and 01:00 PDT DHS Team deployed from Hatfield Courthouse to provide support to Portland FD responding to Chapman Park for a report of a protestor who apparently overdosed. Portland FD departed the scene with victim. DHS Team returned to Hatfield Courthouse without incident.

Between 01:00 and 02:00 PDT protestors attempted to break down the barricade on Main Street near the Hatfield Courthouse. A subject began to strike the main entrance of the Hatfield Courthouse with a large hammer. DHS Team deployed and made contact with the subject. As the team exited a U.S. Marshal was struck with blows from a hammer and suffered minor injuries to their left shoulder. As the team tried to detain the subject, he resisted detention, causing the DHS Team to (b)(7)(E). Some protestors actively fought to interfere with the detention; several protesters attempted to shine lasers in the eyes of team members. The agitated crowd attempted to converge on the team. The DHS Team in turn (b)(7)(E) to push the crowd back and return to the courthouse.

Four (4) subjects were arrested throughout the protest:

- Subject #1: (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) Charge: 18 USC 111 Assault on a Federal Officer. Will be cited and released.
- Subject #2: (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) Charge: 41 CFR 102-74.380 Preservation of Property. Will be cited and released.

- Subject #3: (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) Charge: 18 USC 111; Assault on Federal Officer (hammer). Will be transferred to Multnomah County Jail.
- Subject #4: (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) / Charge: 18 USC 111; Assault on Federal Officer (laser).

Between 2000 and 2400 hours PDT, protests started near the Hatfield Courthouse and the Edith Green - Wendell Wyatt Federal Building. Protesters encroached upon the Hatfield Courthouse multiple times throughout the night. Announcements were made to protestors that the courthouse was closed, and trespassers would be arrested.

### 07/12/2020

Between 00:01 and 04:00 PDT

During the operational period of 0001 to 0400 hours, protester numbers grew to approximately 300 people. Protesters refused to comply with directions to not trespass on federal property. FPS (b)(7)(E) to push protesters back. Protesters responded by throwing objects and pointing lasers at law enforcement personnel. A protester encroached on a police barrier and refused to leave. Arrest Teams deployed and subject became combative while being detained. A crowd of protesters swarmed the Arrest Team and USMS (b)(7)(E) to protect officers as they returned to the Hatfield Courthouse. Another protester trespassed on the steps of the Hatfield Courthouse and when engaged by an Arrest team the subject swallowed a large amount of narcotics. The subject began to convulse, and EMS was requested to treat the subject.

FPS gave protesters more warnings to stay off federal property, and to cease unlawful activity. (b)(7)(E) was deployed again to push protestors back from Hatfield Courthouse. FPS contacted the Portland Police Bureau to have the protest declared an unlawful assembly. Protest size diminished to approximately 100 people. Teams from Hatfield Courthouse and Edith Green Federal Building pushed crowd towards park across from facilities. Portland Police Bureau (PPB) arrived and closed all roads in the vicinity of the facilities. PPB pushed protestors further out of the area with support from DHS/USMS Teams.

A total of 6 protesters were detained and cited for Assault, Failure to Comply with Lawful Directions of a Federal Officer and Vandalism. Two protesters were transported to a local medical facility for treatment.

### 07/12/2020

Approximately 200 peaceful protestors gathered in Chapman Park across from the Hatfield Courthouse. As the night progressed, the crowd became more agitated. Inspectors saw some protestors armed with sledgehammers, tasers or stun guns. Multiple protestors graffitied the

exterior of the Edith Green Federal building, while other protestors set up plywood blockades at entrances. Unknown damage was caused to the Justice Center as the result of protestors firing wrist rockets at the facility.

07/13/2020

During the period between 0001 and 0230 hours PDT, the crowd had increased to approximately 350 protestors, with some of the protestors pointing lasers at Inspectors. As the night progressed, the crowd dwindled down to approximately 150 protestors near the Hatfield Courthouse. There seemed to be two factions amongst the protestors; after one group had dragged burning debris up to the building, another group went and removed the burning debris.

Two subjects were arrested by FPS. One subject for assault on an officer with a laser light from a previous incident that occurred on 07/11/2020 and second subject was arrested for arson.

The three facilities were vandalized with graffitiing on external walls, windows and bollards. The crows later dispersed on their own.

We've had multiple incidents of subjects encroaching onto the Hatfield USCH property and when federal LEO have gone out to disperse them they have been attacked by hard projectiles, rocks and glass bottles. There have also been some fireworks and laser use.

In several of these exchanges federal LEO have used (b)(7)(E) to disperse the crowd and one protester was hit in the temple area with an impact munition. I have seen livestream video of the injury (b)(5) The subject was vomiting blood and had an indentation in his skull. We are trying to determine the wounded subjects disposition and status.

#### 2000 to 2100 PDT

From approximately a crowd of 400 protesters built at the Pioneer Square, across the street from the Pioneer Courthouse, and were peaceful.

#### 2200 to 2358 PDT

Protestors transitioned to parks in the vicinity of the Hatfield Courthouse and the Justice Center. There are reports that indicate protesters intended to establish an autonomous zone in Chapman and Lownsdale Parks. Protesters barricaded intersections in vicinity of the Hatfield Building. PPB came out during their planned/announced shift change and removed barricades when all protesters moved to rear of Justice Center. When PPB departed protesters replaced the barricades.

#### 0001 to 0430 PDT

A Small fire was started in Terry Schunk Plaza. FPS units responded and extinguished. Teams returned to Edith Green and were followed by approximately 150 protesters that are still in vicinity of Edith Green. Two groups of 2-3 individuals dressed all in black attempted to enter federal property via a north pedestrian gate and south pedestrian gate. Units responded and individuals departed. The timing and manner of departure indicated there are spotters in the area announcing response by LEOs.

Two identified subjects were witnessed pointing a laser at 2 ICE SRT members. One subject taken into FPS custody and is was transported to the Hatfield Courthouse for 2 charges of assault on a police officer.

## Current Operations Activity Rollup and SITREP



Protestors were blocking the entrance to the Edith Green Federal Building so that Border Patrol who were on foot could not enter. ICE ERO responded to assist and were met with resistance forcing them to retreat. Protestors threw canned food and other hard objects at Border Patrol and refused to comply with orders. Border Patrol deployed (b)(7)(E) into the area and pushed the protestors to the Hatfield Courthouse. FPS deployed out of the front of the Hatfield Courthouse, secured the front entrance and Border Patrol was able to safely get into the building. All units are now secure inside.

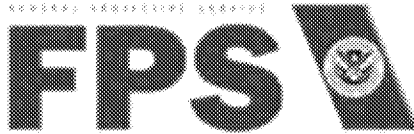

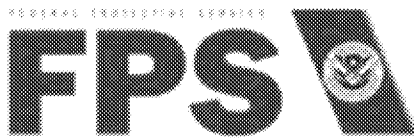

WASHINGTON D.C. -- Last night witnessed a significant level of escalation in violence against federal property and law enforcement officers in Portland, Oregon. Officers of the Department of Homeland Security's Federal Protective Service and U.S. Customs and Border Protection, as well as officers from the U.S. Marshals Service were assaulted with bottles, rocks, large commercial-grade fireworks and improvised explosives. Additionally, multiple attempts were made to blind officers using laser lights. Incendiary devices were also used and thrown into the Hatfield U.S. Federal Courthouse in an attempt to ignite the building with persons inside.

These actions are illegal and will not be tolerated. Perpetrators of violence and assaults on law enforcement officers and federal property will face arrest and prosecution to the fullest extent of the law.

These acts are not the reflection of peaceful or causal demonstration as protected under the 1<sup>st</sup> Amendment to the U.S. Constitution. This is simply violence without cause other than to disrupt the lives and create chaos within the city.

The Federal Protective Service and partner law enforcement agencies will continue to protect these federal facilities and will arrest and detain individuals caught in the act of violence against federal officers, personnel or property.

Two persons were detained during last evening's events under charges including damage to government property and attempted assault on a police officer, these incidents are still under investigation. One individual was released and the other was arrested.

## Current Operations Activity Rollup and SITREP



(Updated 06:00 EDT 07/08/20)

Significant activities this period included the continued movement and arrival of deploying FPS personnel from adjacent regions to support the continuing FPS coordination and utilization of multi-component support. Also significant was the FPS led multi-component operations in Portland, OR to address continuing (but potentially decreasing) civil unrest. An FPS Inspector suffered an ankle injury while pursuing an assault subject and will be evacuated back to his home region for orthopedic surgery.

### FPS Deployment (R10 Relief)

On July 4th FPS issued an order to deploy (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) to Portland to provide relief for R10 personnel. (b)(7)(E) deploying personnel had arrived by 19:00 PDT on July 7th.

### Portland, OR

The federal facilities consisting of the Mark O. Hatfield Courthouse and the Edith Green Federal Building saw protest activity during this period, accompanied by violent criminal activity.

#### 07/08/2020

Between 00:00 and 01:00 There were approximately 150 protestors in Lownsdale Park, which is across from the Mark O. Hatfield Courthouse. The activity of the crowd was like that of the previous night. There were multiple individuals providing live-streaming videos of the event. The crowd was given repeated instructions to not damage federal property or harm personnel on scene. Some protestors started to wander into the area between the bollards and the property. All DHS and USMS teams were standing by.

Between 01:00 and 02:00 The protestors conducted a sit-in on federal property, but adhered to directions to keep the sidewalk clear. In Chapman Park, a memorial service was held for Summer Taylor. Members from competing groups were attempting to take over the demonstrations by trying to speak over each other.

Between 02:00 and 03:00 an FPS Inspector observed an unidentified male subject using a green laser. When FPS attempted to make contact, a majority of the protestors moved onto the federal property of the E. Green – W. Wyatt Federal Building. At this point the crowd had grown to approximately 500 protestors and they were agitated. The protestors approached the main entrance and attempted to barricade the doors from the outside, but then backed away from the building.

Between 03:00 and 04:00 the crowd, which had dwindled down to approximately 250 protestors, left federal property and gathered in front of the adjacent Justice Center. The crowd did not show aggression towards law enforcement personnel on scene, but there were many instances of infighting which occurred within the crowd. One FPS Inspector was injured while pursuing an

assault suspect and has sustained a fractured ankle. The Inspector incurred the injury when he stepped off a low wall during the pursuit. The injury requires surgery and the Inspector is being evacuated to his home region today.

Between 04:00 and 05:00 most of the crowd had dispersed with approximately 90 protestors remaining. Two unidentified male subjects were seen spray painting the Mark O. Hatfield Courthouse, but they departed the scene before FPS could make contact. The adjacent Justice Center received an undetermined amount of damage. CBP teams prepared for deployment while DHS and USMS teams were on standby.

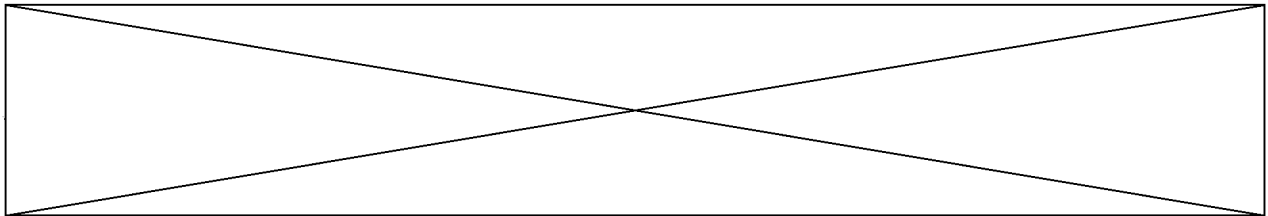

Final summary on Portland activities last night.

(b)(7)(E)

posted at the Hatfield US Courthouse at 2030 hours last night.

At approximately 2137 hours - protesters began throwing fireworks at a vehicle (dump truck) that belonged to the contractor working in front of the courthouse completing the boarding of windows broken by last night's violent protests.

At 2145 hours - DHS personnel dispersed the protesters away from the courthouse and into the federal park property with officer presence holding a line in the front of the park.

At 2210 hours - DHS observation posts have visual of a male subject with a harmful green laser in hand. Subject did not use the laser on any personnel.

At 2244 hours - the contractor completed the work at the front of the building and was escorted out of the area by DHS Officers and Agents. DHS Officers and Agents moved back into the courthouse with no further incident.

At 2340 hours - One subject was deploying a harmful purple laser directly at the eyes and face of DHS Officers and Agents assigned to an observation post. Protester has been identified as a female subject wearing a black top and white helmet with reddish hair.

At 0010 hours - DHS personnel arrested two subjects that were deploying harmful lasers directly into the eyes and faces of the DHS personnel. The first subject is male and was encountered on the steps of the courthouse. He was arrested and taken into custody. The second subject was a

female that had previously been identified as pointing a dangerous laser at agents. During the apprehension of the female, she requested to speak with a medic. DHS personnel engaged in a conversation with the subject, (b)(7)(E) While ascertaining the subject's health, she reached for a knife (see attached image) and placed it to her throat. The US Marshal deployed his Taser to prevent her from injuring herself. A DHS Agent jumped on the subject and physically removed the knife from her throat. Due to the heroic and quick reactions of the DHS and DOJ personnel, the subject was not able to harm herself. Portland EMS arrived and the subject was transported to the hospital. While walking back to the courthouse DHS Officers and Agents were assaulted by criminal protesters throwing bottles and fireworks. Another protester pointed a harmful laser at the eyes and faces of DHS personnel. The subject was apprehended shortly after by DHS personnel.

At 0215 hours - protesters have dispersed and all DHS personnel have cleared the scene. (b)(7)(E) (b)(7)(E) indicates that will not return tonight and indicates that protesters will possibly move to other targets rather than the Hatfield US Courthouse due to heavy presence of Federal Officers and strong federal enforcement actions. No injuries sustained by DHS or DOJ personnel.

Listed below is the identification of the three subjects arrested for pointing harmful laser at DHS and DOJ personnel. All three have been charged with 18 USC 111, Assault on a Federal Law Enforcement Officer and were booked into the Multnomah County Detention Center.

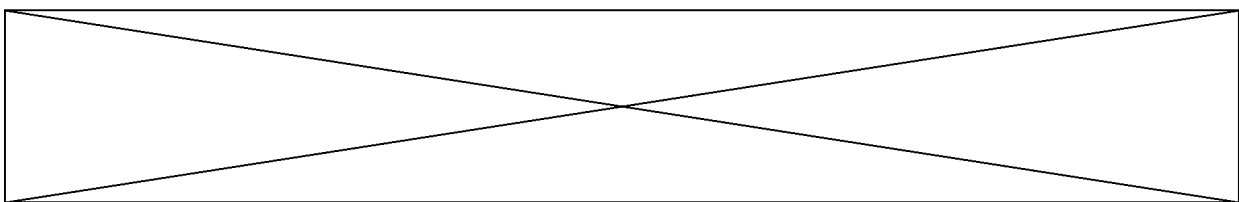

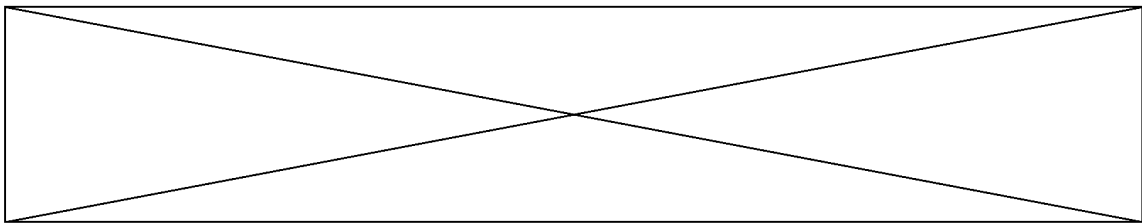

**Purpose:** The purpose of this memorandum is to provide guidance for direct support to the Federal Protective Service and our interagency partners to protect all federal facilities and property.

**Introduction:** The Department plays a key role in protecting Federal facilities and property primarily through the Federal Protective Service (FPS) and in partnership with other DHS law enforcement Components, interagency partners, and state and local partners. Recently, we have seen numerous instigators, criminals and other bad actors use peaceful protests to harm people and property, both Federal and private. For the past month, these bad actors have continued their unlawful activity which has resulted in numerous threats, disruption, and damage to Federal facilities and property.

**Background:** On June 26, the President issued the following Executive Order: Protecting American Monuments, Memorials, and Statues and Combating Recent Criminal Activity. In this order, the President directed that DHS "shall provide, as appropriate and consistent with applicable law, personnel to assist with the protection of Federal monuments, memorials, statues, or property."

In furtherance of this directive, I have formalized the DHS Protecting American Communities Task Force (PACT) to provide an ongoing assessment of potential civil unrest and property destruction and to address internal resource allocation and potential surge activity to ensure the continuing protection of people and property.

Additionally, with the consent of other Departments and Agencies, I have determined that it is in the public interest and fiscally sound for FPS to partner with other federal law enforcement to execute the direction of the President. To that end, DHS began coordination with the Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Department of the Interior (DOI) to establish information/intelligence sharing and resource coordination as outlined in the order.

**Action:** The upcoming July 4<sup>th</sup> holiday weekend has the potential for increased disruptive activity at specific locations across the country that could threaten our personnel and the Federal facilities and property they protect. DHS will be forward leaning in preparing to protect Federal facilities and property.

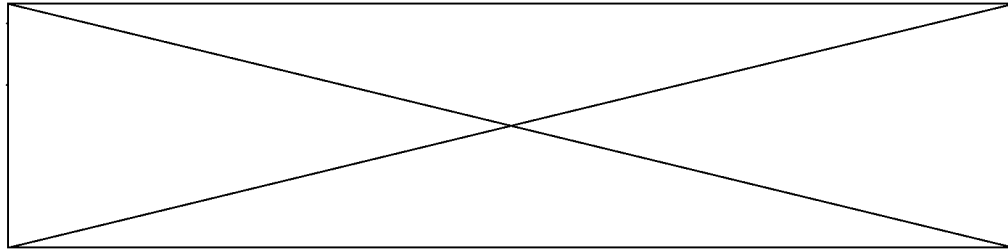

Continuation of protest activity is expected throughout the R10 Area of Operations (AOR) in response to the in-custody death of George Floyd. These protests have transitioned to include directed acts of vandalism/destruction to government monuments, statues, and facilities. These acts are in addition to protest/riot activity that has been seen over the past few weeks and is expected to continue beyond the 4th of July, holiday weekend. The mission of the Federal Protective Service (FPS), as well as federal law enforcement partner agencies, will be the continued protection of federal facilities and deny unauthorized entry. Emphasis will be placed on the protection of designated monuments, public art, and statues located at multiple R10 federal facilities.

### Summary of Increased Risk – Summarize the increased risk(s) that require mitigation through implementing the proposed plan

There is an increased risk to federal facilities and the monuments, statues, and works of art located on federal property. Due to the nature of these protests, the large numbers of protesters involved, the multitude of protest activities, and the high profile 4th of July holiday, there is an increased risk of property damage and potential of violence during the conduct of protests. The most extreme risk would be the hostile take over of a federal facility or damage/destruction of a monument, statue, or work of art in the R10 AOR. There are currently no permitted events. Primary emphasis, with increased staffing, will be placed on facilities in Seattle, WA, Tacoma, WA, Spokane, WA and Portland, OR.

This will be a phased operation. The first phase will be facility and monument protection for dates 6/26-7/2 and then 7/5-7/8. The second phase will be the July 4<sup>th</sup> surge; 7/3 and 7/4 2020.

### Phase 1:

The objective of this operation is to protect federal facilities, monuments/statues, and personnel from acts of vandalism, hostile takeover, and/or destruction. The widespread and dynamic nature of these protests necessitate that each individual command maintains operational and tactical control of the protection operations for federal facilities within their commands.

The unique nature of the current targeting of government owned monuments, statues, and works of art necessitates the need to place protective emphasis on certain federal facilities. These facilities are as follows and in order of vulnerability/importance:

4. When possible, arrestees will be released in lieu of custody with a U.S. Violation Notice and directed to leave federal property but may be lodged on a case-by-case basis.

5. Release location of U.S. Violation Notice arrestees will be determined by the IC based upon mission needs.

6. All operations will be in accordance and consistent with COVID-19 PPE standards and protocols identified by FPS, R10.

7. FPS will coordinate with Portland Police Bureau, Multnomah Co Sheriff Department, Seattle PD, King County Sheriff Department, Pierce County Sheriff Department, and Tacoma PD as well as each agency's RIG in obtaining information critical to our operations.

8. FPS will coordinate to process all arrests alongside local law enforcement agencies if a felonious incident occurs in the presence of an FPS Inspector.

9. All FPS vehicles should be parked inside federal facilities or in a controlled parking area to prevent vandalism and arson.

10. A two-person rule will always be in effect during the operation.

### Phase 2 (July 4<sup>th</sup> Surge):

Protest activity is expected to increase during the celebration of the 4<sup>th</sup> of July. Current intelligence is limited as to protest activity. However, historic events as well as current trends indicate the likelihood of increased activity to be high.

All security functions for Phase 1 will be continued during Phase 2.

## ANNEX A – USE OF FORCE ANNEX (No equivalent ICS form)

The law and FPS policy require that only that force which is both *necessary* and *reasonable* may be used in any situation. You must be able to articulate that 1) the force you used was required to accomplish your lawful duty; and 2) the amount/degree of force you used was reasonable<sup>1</sup> based on the facts and circumstances at the time the force was used.

Whether the amount/degree of force used was necessary and reasonable will be judged on certain factors, to include the Graham Factors: 1) severity of the crime, 2) imminent threat to safety of officers or others; 3) actively resisting arrest; and 4) attempting to evade arrest by flight. Among equals, the first 2 factors are closely scrutinized by courts. Courts will additionally consider additional Graham factors such as number of officers' present, physical size of officer(s) and subject, and mental condition of the subject if present.

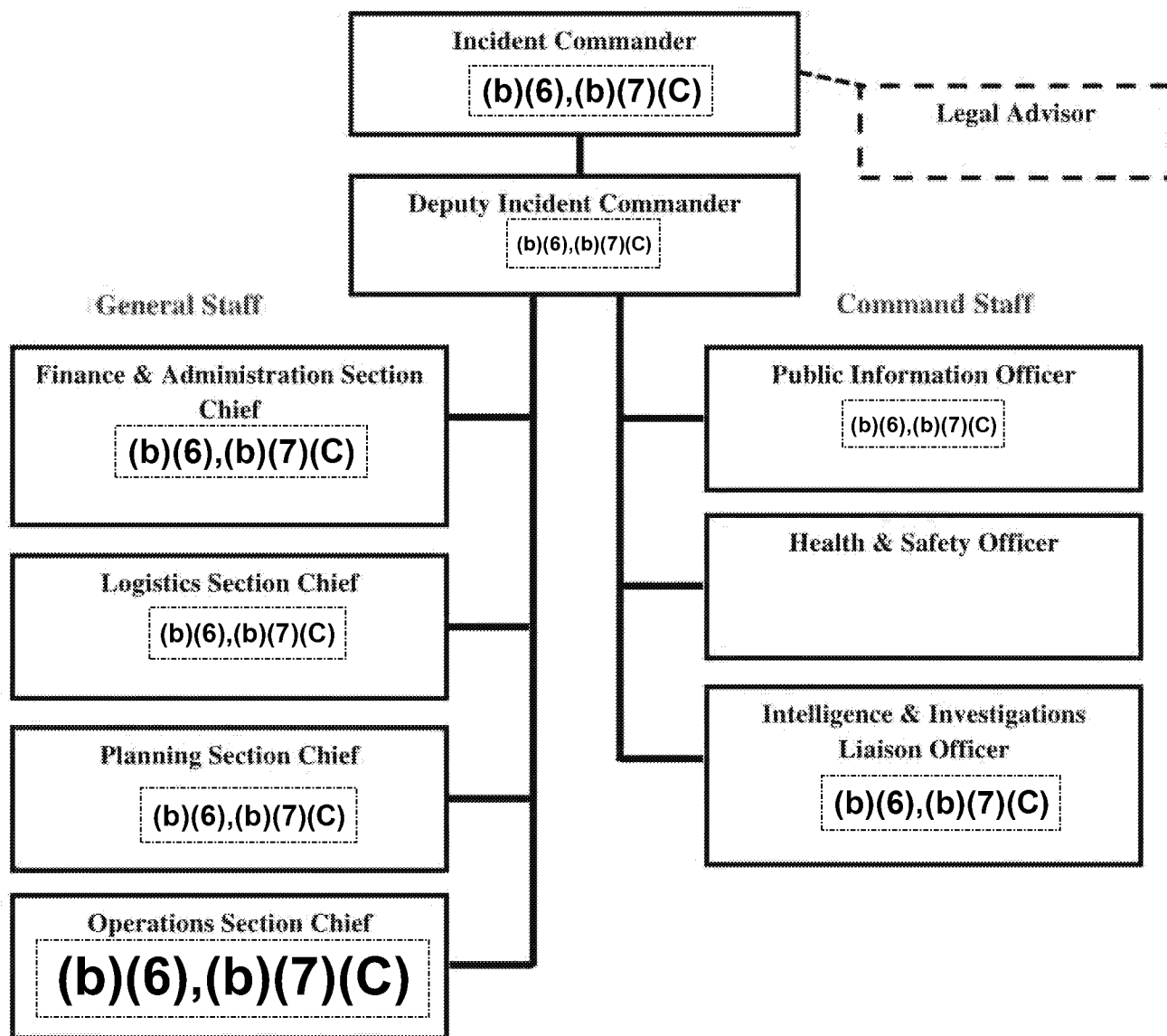

The general threat impacting federal facilities is the damage/destruction to federal facilities as well as damage/destruction to monuments, statues, and works of art that are on federal property. Protesters have attempted to gain unauthorized entry to federal property and have vandalized facilities through use of graffiti, the breaking of windows, and use of improvised explosive devices consisting of commercial fireworks. The identified threat exists for the removal, damage, or destruction of monuments, statues, and works of art located at or on federal property/facilities.

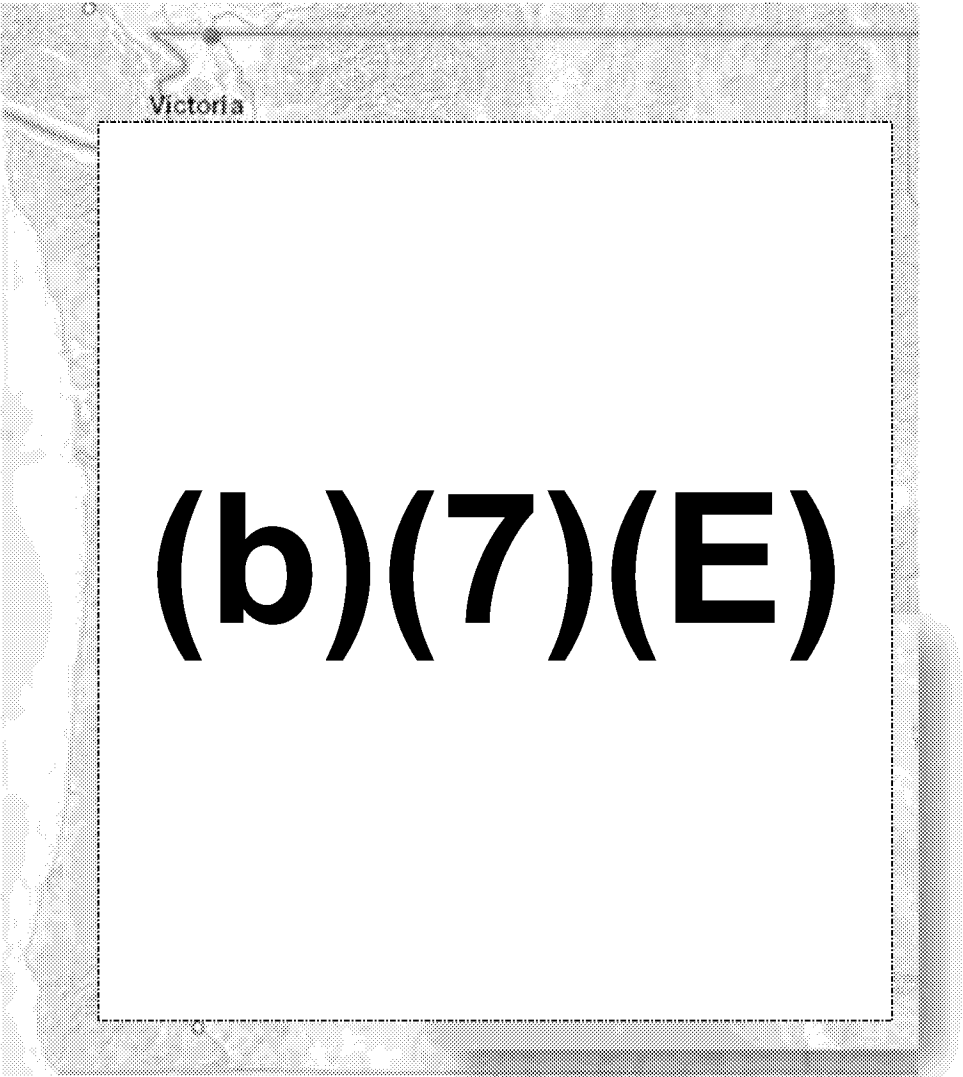
