

**Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Annual Report  
on the Use of No-Knock Entries by DHS Law Enforcement Agencies**

In accordance with Section 10(c) of Executive Order 14074 on Advancing Effective, Accountable Policing and Criminal Justice Practices to Enhance Public Trust and Public Safety (EO 14074), this report details the number of no-knock entries conducted by DHS law enforcement agencies.<sup>1</sup> As required by EO 14074, the data is broken out by the number of no-knock entries that occurred pursuant to judicial authorization and the number of no-knock entries that occurred pursuant to exigent circumstances. This report also notes the number of no-knock entries in which a law enforcement officer or other person (subjects or bystanders) was injured in the course of a no-knock entry.

The table below sets forth the number of instances where DHS law enforcement personnel executed a court-authorized no-knock entry and the number of instances where DHS law enforcement personnel executed a no-knock entry pursuant to exigent circumstances. This data covers the period of Fiscal Year 2023 (October 2022 – September 2023). Over the covered time period, there have been no circumstances in which a DHS law enforcement officer or other person was injured in the course of a no-knock entry.
