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CONNECT WITH YOUR FUSION CENTER

Fusion Centers are state and local-owned and operated centers that serve as focal points in states and major urban areas for the receipt, analysis, gathering, and sharing of threat-related information between state, local, tribal, territorial, and campus (SLTTC), federal, and private sector partners.

The National Network of Fusion Centers brings critical context and value to Homeland Security and law enforcement that no other federal or local organization can replicate. Fusion Centers accomplish this through sharing information, providing partners with a unique perspective on threats, and being the primary contact between frontline personnel, state and local leadership and the rest of the Homeland Security Enterprise. 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ATTEND I&A BRIEFINGS

JOIN HSIN

The Homeland Security Information Network (HSIN) is DHS' official system for trusted sharing of information between partners. HSIN provides law enforcement agencies with a central, online location for information sharing and collaboration. To request an account, visit <https://www.dhs.gov/how-join-hsin>.

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HSIN Intelligence (HSIN-Intel): Sworn law enforcement partners, fusion centers, and other domestic intelligence partners use HSIN-Intel to access up-to-date intelligence products from the National Network of Fusion Centers and federal partners. Through HSIN-Intel, sworn law enforcement officers can:

- Access the national network of fusion centers analysts and intelligence professionals;
- Access sensitive "For Official Use Only" (FOUO) and Law Enforcement Sensitive (LES) shared by Fusion Centers, DHS, and other Federal Partners; and
- Gain 24/7 situational awareness tools to ensure awareness and coordination during regional and national level incidents.

HSIN Critical Infrastructure (HSIN-CI): For both sworn and non-sworn partners, HSIN CI provides a single source where critical and timely infrastructure protection information from DHS is shared. Through HSIN-CI members can:

- Make use of real-time collaboration tools including a virtual meeting space, document sharing, alerts, and instant messaging;
- Access situational updates, suspicious activity reporting, and sector incident reporting; and
- Learn about CI trainings and webinars, access real-time collaboration tools.
