## ATTACHMENT F: Participant Biographies

### PARTICIPANT BIOGRAPHY



#### **Chairwoman Lucille Roybal-Allard**

In 1992, Congresswoman Lucille Roybal-Allard became the first Mexican-American woman elected to Congress. She has distinguished herself throughout her congressional career as a dedicated advocate for the dignity and well-being of all Americans. The congresswoman is the first Latina to serve as one of the 12 “cardinals,” or chairs, of a House Appropriations Subcommittee, as well as the first Latina to serve on the House Appropriations Committee. She is also the first woman to chair the Congressional Hispanic Caucus; the first woman to chair the California Democratic congressional delegation; and the founder of the Women’s Working Group on Immigration Reform.

Congresswoman Roybal-Allard is an original co-author of The Dream Act, which would allow certain U.S.-raised immigrant youth to earn lawful permanent residence and eventual American citizenship. In 2019, she introduced the newest version of this bill: HR 6, The Dream and Promise Act which passed the House of Representatives on June 4, 2019.

As chairwoman of the House Homeland Security Appropriations Subcommittee, the congresswoman continues to fight to ensure our homeland security personnel have the resources and guidance they need to keep our country safe against all threats, manmade and natural, and to treat immigrants humanely and with dignity and respect. She is also fighting for investments in the Coast Guard’s air and marine fleets, including much-needed funding for its first heavy icebreaker in 40 years.

I urge everyone, including police and protesters, to practice restraint and good judgment. Let's also remember peaceful action is crucial to the urgent work of building a more fair and equal America — an America whose policies will



finally reflect the fact that #BlackLivesMatter. That is the America I keep fighting for as your congresswoman.”

May 29: “The president's rhetoric about the unrest in Minneapolis is disgusting, disgraceful, and wrong. No president should ever justify or glorify violence. A president must promote peace and justice, and condemn violence and hate.”

May 28: “I’ve written to DHS/HHS demanding action to protect the rights and well-being of unaccompanied children. Let’s guarantee these children due process and honor their rights under the Flores Settlement.”

May 27: “I’m outraged & heartbroken over George Floyd's murder by Minneapolis police, and these officers must be held accountable. Let's be crystal clear: #BlackLivesMatter, and we must fight to end the systemic harassment, brutalization, and murder of African Americans once and for all.”

May 8: “I’m urging DHS & HHS to unite children in their care with sponsors as quickly as possible, & end the Memorandum of Agreement the Trump Admin has used to deport a child’s loved ones. COVID's rapid spread makes it even more vital that kids be removed from congregate facilities NOW.”

#### Open Correspondence

May 27, co-signed Congressional Hispanic Caucus letter to AS1 and ICE to urgently express alarm regarding reports that ICE is removing unaccompanied minors who have not yet exhausted all legal remedies.

May 21, co-signed letter to AS1 and ICE to express concern over reports creating the appearance that the administration is again pursuing a policy of family separation during the COVID-19 global pandemic.

May 11, co-signed Congressional Hispanic Caucus letter regarding concerns with inmate health throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

May 8, co-signed letter with other Chairs regarding concerns over reporting that Administration officials are considering implementing policies that could delay the reunification of unaccompanied minors in the care of the Department of HHS with their sponsors. *DHS deferred to HHS to respond to this letter because all the questions related to HHS policies/actions.*

May 6, co-signed letter urging DHS and the Department of Justice EOIR to allow asylum seekers in the MPP program to obtain their new hearing date without traveling to ports of entry to receive a physical tear sheet and hearing notice. *On May 10 DHS and EOIR released a statement that aliens do not need to travel to a U.S. port of entry to receive a new tear sheet.*

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April 17, co-signed Congressional Hispanic Caucus letter expressing concerns and requesting information on the expelling of unaccompanied migrant children as part of the DHS's efforts to implement the CDC's March 20th order restricting the entry of certain individuals into the United States undertaken to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

**Whip Steve Scalise**

After a congressional leadership career spent entirely in the majority, Steve Scalise faced a move down and a move up for the 116th Congress. The demotion: to minority whip from majority whip. At the same time, however, the retirement of former Speaker Paul Ryan meant the Louisiana Republican went from No. 3 to No. 2, behind only Minority Leader Kevin McCarthy (R-Calif.).

Scalise has played the role of pragmatist in the GOP leadership, bridging the divide between those who want to move legislation and those who would rather stand fast on the conservative principles on which they were elected.

Scalise was seriously wounded in June 2017 when a gunman opened fire as the GOP baseball team was practicing for the annual charity congressional baseball game. He was hit in the hip and leg, and almost bled to death on the field. He credits many bystanders, including his Capitol Police security detail and Rep. Brad Wenstrup (R-Ill.), a former combat surgeon with the Army in Iraq, for saving his life.

After multiple surgeries, he returned to the House in September of 2017, using canes to help him walk. Since then, he's continued to improve, and in the 2018 congressional baseball game, he was able to gingerly bend down to field a ground ball and throw out the batter at first base.

President Donald Trump has called him the "legend from Louisiana."

**Executive Summary:** After 14 days of civil disturbances, DHS Components continue to support national law enforcement efforts and protect federal property across the country. While many demonstrations have remained peaceful, numerous U.S. cities have experienced incidents of violence, looting and other criminal activity. To date, no Component has reported a degradation in ability to execute its mission essential functions.

**Customs and Border Protection (CBP)**

- **Office of Field Operations (OFO)**
  - Baltimore Field Office
    - The Baltimore Field Office deployed (b) (7)(F) CBP Officers from the area north of Washington DC/Dulles, (b) (7)(F) CBP officers from the Area Port of Baltimore and (b) (7)(F) SRT operators to provided support to USSS in VA and Washington, DC.

- The Baltimore Field Office deployed (b) (7)(E) officers from the Area Port of Philadelphia to the Philadelphia Police Department EOC in response to ongoing civil disobedience occurring in Philadelphia, PA.
  - Detroit Field Office
    - The Detroit Field Office is supporting the Detroit Police Department with (b) (7)(E) officers and (b) (7)(E) marked vehicles to assist local law enforcement with perimeter control of their staging area surrounding their EOC.
  - New York Field Office
    - Starting on 6 Jun, (b) (7)(E) New York Field Office officers will begin assisting with securing NYPD's Times Square Station. End date is TBD
  - New Orleans Field Office (NFO):
    - On 4 Jun, the NFO provided the New Orleans Police Department (NOPD) (b) (7)(E) all-terrain vehicles (UTVs) to assist with perimeter security for buildings and monuments and provide a rapid response capability. The end of the support is TDB.
  - San Diego Field Office:
    - San Diego Field Office sent (b) (7)(E) personnel to the San Diego Command Post and (b) (7)(E) to the FBI Command Post.
  - Miami/Tampa Field Office:
    - CBP Miami Seaport deployed a liaison officer with the Miami-Dade Police Department from 4 June to TDB.
  - San Francisco Field Office:
    - The San Francisco/Portland Field Office, Area Port of Portland, OR is supporting FPS with (b) (7)(E) CBP officers from 4 June to TDB
- **U.S. Border Patrol**
  - Big Bend Sector
    - On 6 Jun, the Midland Station, at the request of Ector County Sheriff's Office and Texas Department of Public Safety, established a Quick Reactionary Response Team to support local law enforcement.
  - Blaine Sector
    - On 8 Jun, Blaine Sector reassigned (b) (7)(E) agents, currently deployed to the Seattle/Tacoma area, to the Portland area to support FPS.
  - Detroit Sector
    - On 8 Jun, (b) (7)(E) uniformed Border Patrol agents and (b) (7)(E) plain clothes agents assisted the Port of Clinton Police Department with support functions related to a planned protest in Port Clinton, OH.



- From 7-13 Jun, (b) (7)(E) agents will support various task forces enhancing the security of federal buildings in the Detroit, Cleveland, Toledo, and Grand Rapids metropolitan areas.
  - El Paso Sector
    - El Paso Sector provided (b) (7)(E) USBP to the Las Cruces Police Department.
  - Spokane Sector
    - Spokane Sector is assisting FPS with protecting federal building and courthouses in the Portland, OR area.
- **Air and Marine Operations (AMO)**
  - On 8 Jun, Great Lakes Air and Marine Branch - Chicago Air Unit provided a (b) (7)(E) helicopter to provide (b) (7)(E) during the civil unrest in the cities of Chicago and Aurora, and the surrounding areas.
  - On 8-9 Jun, Great Lakes Air and Marine Branch provided a helicopter to support the Detroit Police Department with situational awareness during planned protests and civil unrest in the City of Detroit
  - From 6-14 Jun, Bellingham Air and Marine Branch - Spokane Air Unit is providing the Spokane Police Department and Spokane County with a helicopter with (b) (7)(E) to capture disturbances during or after main protests end.

#### **Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA)**

- Region I is paying attention to an upcoming march being held on Wednesday, 10 Jun in Boston. The identified route of the march will bring the crowd near significant critical infrastructure.
- Region III PSAs are in touch with State/Local EMA and LE partners across the region and are remotely monitoring their respective partners' EOCs via direct contact and shared chat rooms/dashboards.

#### **Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE)**

- **Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO)**
  - On 7 Jun, ERO Seattle activated (b) (7)(E) officers at the Portland Office after significant protest activity in downtown Portland, OR.
- **Homeland Security Investigations (HSI)**
  - HSI Atlanta has (b) (7)(E) Criminal Analyst reporting to the FBI Atlanta JOC; (b) (7)(E) JTTF Criminal Investigator supporting Identification and Interview Teams within the HSI Atlanta area of responsibility; and (b) (7)(E) Criminal Analyst from HSI Savannah is remotely supporting social media exploitation in the Southern District of Georgia.



- HSI Houston is physically manning the City of Houston EOC (COVID and Protest Monitoring) with (b) (7)(E) agent and assigned a criminal analyst to the FBI Intel Group in advance of protests and Floyd funeral services.
- HSI Buffalo has been assisting the Buffalo Police Department by committing (b) (7)(E) agents and the HSI Buffalo Special Response Team (SRT).
- HSI Charlotte is supporting Wax Hall Police Department with (b) (7)(E) special agent and (b) (7)(E) technical enforcement officer. Additionally, HSI Charlotte is also assisting the Alexander Sheriff's Office by providing (b) (7)(E) special agents.
- HSI San Antonio is providing the Austin Police Department and FBI San Antonio with (b) (7)(E) Special Agents, (b) (7)(E) Technical Enforcement Officer, (b) (7)(E) Criminal Analysts, and (b) (7)(E) Group Supervisors. HSI San Antonio deployed (b) (7)(E) SRT members to Washington, DC.
- HSI Portland sent (b) (7)(E) Special Agents to support FPS with onsite security at the ICE facility in Portland, OR.

### **Transportation Security Administration (TSA)**

- TSA deployed 11 Viper teams to support FPS.

### **U.S. Coast Guard (USCG)**

- Maritime Security Response Team-West is supporting Sector San Diego with approximately (b) (7)(E) members for increased FPCON measures in response to civil disturbances in and around the San Diego area.
- (b) (7)(E) Investigative Service Special Agents are on standby to support the DOJ in Washington DC and (b) (7)(E) Special Agent is supporting the Port Arthur (TX) Police Department.

### **U.S. Secret Service (USSS)**

- USSS has personnel supporting LE partners' operation/command centers in:
  - Detroit
  - Dallas
  - San Diego
- Perimeter security assets installed around the White House will be removed over the coming days.

### **DHS Head Quarters (DHS HQ)**

- National Operations Center provides twice daily incident reports to the Homeland Security Enterprise with interim updates to DHS leadership.

### **Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC)**



- FLETC security continues increased perimeter patrols at all sites.

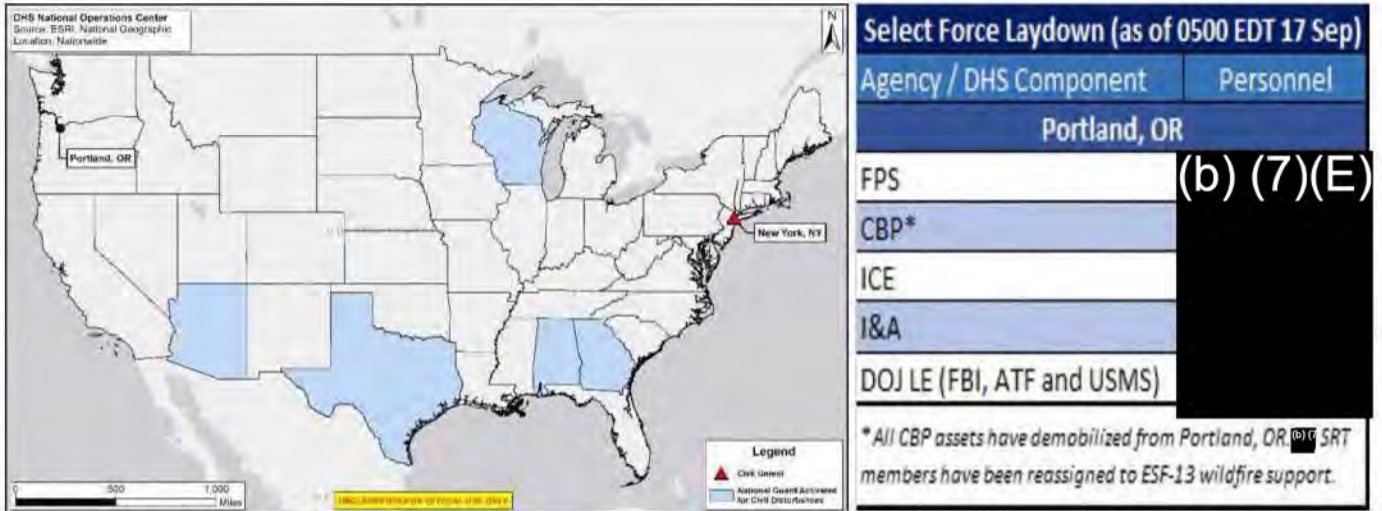

## National Roll-up of Civil Unrest



### Situational Overview

- There was one report of civil unrest during protest activity overnight in New York City, NY. The Jacob K. Javits Federal Building in Manhattan was damaged, but no arrests were made.
- For the seventh consecutive night there was no protest activity resulting in civil unrest in Portland, OR where poor air quality kept most residents indoors.
- The National Guard remains activated and on standby in AZ, AL, GA, TX and WI to provide civil disturbance support as needed within their states.

### Locations of Interest

#### New York, NY:

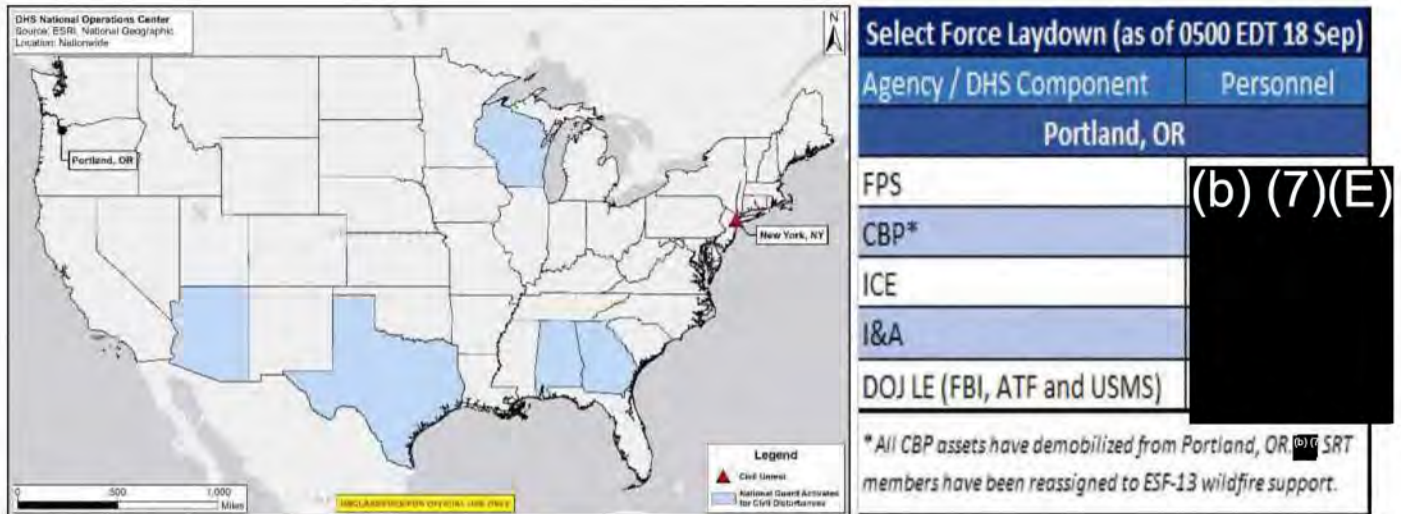
- An "Abolish ICE" group that had previously protested without violence attempted to enter the Jacob K. Javits Federal building in Manhattan, NY last night resulting in a broken glass entrance door and graffiti at three locations on the property.
- PSO's onsite, accompanied by other federal agency law enforcement officers at the building, prevented the VO's from entering the main building.
- No arrests were made. FPS investigators are attempting to identify the responsible individuals for the damage and graffiti.
- GSA removed the graffiti and is scheduled to repair the damaged glass door.

### Situational Overview

- There was one report of arrests made during protest activity overnight in New York City, NY near the Jacob K. Javits Federal Building in Manhattan, NY.
- For the eighth consecutive night there was no protest activity resulting in civil unrest in Portland, OR where poor air quality kept most residents indoors.
- The National Guard remains activated and on standby in AZ, AL, GA, TX and WI to provide civil disturbance support as needed within their states.

### Locations of Interest

#### New York, NY:

- An "Abolish ICE" group assembled and marched blocks away from the Jacob K. Javits Federal Building; no federal response was needed.
- At least a dozen demonstrators were arrested by NYPD Officers near the World Trade Center area. The specific charges have not been reported.

## National Roll-up of Civil Unrest



### Situational Overview

- There was one report of numerous arrests made by NYPD during non-violent protest activity at Times Square in Manhattan, NY, most for blocking traffic. No federal buildings were impacted.
- In Portland, OR, VO's targeted two federal buildings and vandalized businesses in downtown Portland. No injuries or arrests were reported. (covered in the Portland one-pager).
- The National Guard remains activated and on standby in AZ, AL, IN, GA, TX and WI to provide civil disturbance support as needed within their states.

### Locations of Interest

#### New York, NY:

- For a fourth consecutive day, an Abolish ICE demonstration assembled for a planned march to an ICE facility in Manhattan.
- The group assembled in Times Square where NYPD officers responded and began ordering the group to move out of the area and off the streets.
- When confronted by NYPD, and with access to the streets blocked, the group then staged a sit-in within Times Square and adjacent streets; the group did not impact any federal buildings.
- NYPD issued warnings and subsequently arrested as many as 85 protesters.

## Situational Overview

- There were a significant number of planned demonstrations overnight of which five reported civil unrest/criminal activity. New York City, Rochester, NY, Portland, OR, Seattle, WA and Olympia, WA all reported criminal activity.
- In Portland, OR a group gathered near the Portland Police Association building. Protesters blocked streets and agitators threw objects at officers. PPB declared an unlawful assembly and made numerous arrests. (See separate Portland report.)
- The National Guard Bureau reported there are (b) (7)(E) members in four states (GA, TX, KY and WI) providing civil disturbance support with (b) (7)(E) NG members in Kenosha, WI.

## Locations of Interest

### Rochester, NY:

- A large crowd of protesters threw fireworks, disrupted diners in restaurants and set small fires around downtown Rochester.
- Police declared an unlawful assembly and used tear gas and pepper balls to disperse protesters who failed to heed repeated warnings. Police made several arrests.
- FPS officers at the Kenneth B. Keating Federal Building in the vicinity of the protests, did not respond and there was no impact to federal facilities or personnel.

### New York City, NY:

- NYPD declared an unlawful assembly for about 150 people causing damage to eight businesses in the Flatiron District of Manhattan. The group also lit fires and sprayed graffiti as they moved through the area.
- Eight people were arrested.





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**Seattle, WA:**

- Washington State Patrol (WSP) arrested nine protesters/drivers for blocking Interstate 5 and impounded nine cars.
- A three car accident occurred due to the group blocking traffic prompting law enforcement to clear the area.

**Olympia, WA:**

- WSP reported a group of 50 individuals shooting paintballs, setting fires, and using crowbars to damage downtown businesses. VO's were dressed in all black.
- One WSP officer was assaulted, and four arrests were made.

**Eugene, OR:**

- A combined FPS/CBP team of <sup>(b) (7)(E)</sup> personnel travelled to the Wayne L Morse Courthouse in Eugene, OR (120 miles south of Portland) in response to a scheduled demonstration by a group known for violence.
- A crowd of ~50 opposing protest groups gathered, focused on each other and dispersed after a few hours without incident on federal property or local law enforcement actions.
- All DHS members returned to Portland by 0400 EDT safely.

**Kenosha, WI:**

- National Guard troops from AL and AZ returned to their home states on 4 Sep to demobilize. Troops from the MI national guard returned on 3 Sep.
- There were no known demonstrations in Kenosha overnight.

**Louisville, KY:**

- The governor of Kentucky announced there will be approximately 130 guardsmen at Kentucky Derby this weekend, assisting with traffic control and access control points.

**Other Locations:**

- Protests of various sizes remained peaceful in more than ten other cities around the country.

**Executive Summary:** After eight days of civil disturbances, DHS Components continue to support national law enforcement efforts and provide federal property protection, across the country. While many demonstrations have remained peaceful, numerous U.S. cities have experienced incidents of violence, looting and other criminal activity. To date, no Component has reported a degradation in ability to execute its mission essential functions.

- USSS continues to provide additional support at the White House Complex.
- CBP Commissioner's Situation Room extended its COOP protocol until 4 Jun.

**Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)**

- There are (b) (7)(E) State EOCs activated: AZ, CA, IA, KS, MN, MO, OK, PA, UT, WA & WI.
- No degradation to FEMA's mission capability and no reported impacts to employee safety.
- Several FEMA facilities throughout the country are operating (b) (7)(E).
  - The Regional Watch Center (RWC) in Region V remains at alternate location due to protests in Chicago, IL.
  - RWCs in Region II and III are working from alternate locations UFN.
  - The JFO in Sioux Falls, SD (Region VIII) activated their COOP plan due to a breach of the Empire Mall; they are working from lodging UFN.
  - The Regional Response Coordination Center (RRCC) reports that Regions III, V, and VII are working remotely.

**U.S. Coast Guard (USCG)**

- USCG Station Washington has aligned with DOD and is at (b) (7)(E)
- Due to potential protests, Sector Northern New England temporarily increased the FPCON in (b) (7)(E) from 2 - 3 Jun as a precaution; no mission degradation reported.

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- Marine Safety and Security Team (MSST) Seattle dedicated (b) (7)(E) members to provide FPCON support to Base Seattle due to civil disturbances in Seattle.
- District 13 Command Center enacted its COOP, (b) (7)(E) [REDACTED].
- (b) (7)(E) assigned to FBI (b) (7)(E) was deployed to the US Attorney's Office Security Team in Philadelphia, PA and another CGIS special agent was deployed to the (b) (7)(E) to facilitate information sharing.
- Protest activity in NYC is forecasted to continue for the foreseeable future, with curfews in place at least through 7Jun; there is a potential protest in the vicinity of Station NY and Sector NY on 5 Jun.

### Customs and Border Protection (CBP)

- In support of DOJ, provided (b) (7)(E) personnel to support operations in the NCR.
  - As of 2200 ET 2 Jun, CBP had (b) (7)(E) personnel deployed to 15<sup>th</sup> St and E St NW (just south of the WH).
  - Provided security support to USSS and US Park Police by establishing perimeter around WH Ellipse, which prevented demonstrators from entering.
  - Detained two subjects for non-violent offenses which were later turned over to local partners.
  - Provided helicopter (b) (7)(E) support over NCR; (b) (7)(E) captured a demonstrator climbing the roof of St. Johns Church and attempted to climb onto the roof.
  - No CBP personnel have been injured in deployments.
- **Office of Field Operations (OFO)**
  - The OFO Emergency Medical Services program has upwards of (b) (7)(E) experienced licensed and credentialed Medical Providers and Law Enforcement officers strategically assigned throughout nation that are available to support local first responders.
  - Pre-Clearance Field Office, consisting of CBP Officers (CBPO) and Special Response Team (SRT), joined other members of OFO, U.S. Border Patrol and Air and Marine at CBP HQ provided assistance and support to Federal and Local law enforcement partners to respond and prevent further rioting, vandalism and destruction due to the ongoing civil unrest in the National Capital Region (NCR) area.
  - **Baltimore Field Office (BFO):**
    - The Philadelphia Port Of Entry (POE) has deployed (b) (7)(E) officers to assist Philadelphia Police Department (PPD) and will be responding to the PPD Emergency Operation Center (EOC).
      - The current request is for CBPOs to assist in securing the interior of the federal building in the event of a breach. The local El Paso Police Department (EPPD) will be providing approximately (b) (7)(E)

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EPPD Officers, with FPS only able to provide (b) (7)(E). The BSC within the El Paso Field Office will gather the number of Officers (b) (7)(E) Mobile Field Force trained and (b) (7)(E) Special Response Teams that are available) and provide assistance, without compromising our enforcement mission.

- **Detroit Field Office:**

- The Detroit Field Office received a request to support the Detroit Police Department (DPD) with (b) (7)(E) CBPOs and (b) (7)(E) Supervisor CBPOs with ongoing protests and civil unrests in the metropolitan Detroit area. DPD requested (b) (7)(E) Government Operative Vehicles (GOV) and personnel to assist local law enforcement with perimeter control of their staging area surrounding their EOC.

- **New York Field Office:**

- NYFO has deployed (b) (7)(E) officers from the JFK Airport to assist PAPD in response to a possible civil disturbance on airport property. The responding officers will participate as a security detail.
- NYFO has deployed (b) (7)(E) Task Force officers assigned to the (b) (7)(E) to assist the NYPD in protecting the Times Square Station while NYPD officers perform crowd control and policing duties. The TFOs are joined by the (b) (7)(E)

- **Houston Field Office:**

- The Houston Field Office (HFO) received a request for support from the Houston DEA, for personnel to help secure and protect Federal property and law enforcement partners in connection with ongoing protests and civil unrest in the Houston area. HFO deployed (b) (7)(E) OFO SRT operators to assist with physical security (b) (7)(E)

(b) (7)(E) SRT will also provide support with public safety, as well as assist local, state and federal law enforcement partners. In executing the request for support, SRT operators will provide vehicles and equipment.

- **U.S. Border Patrol**

- Sectors have placed personnel, to include Mobile Field Forces, Special Operations Groups, BORTAC, BORSTAR, and EMTs on standby to respond to civil disturbances throughout the nation.
- All sectors, stations and checkpoints remain on high alert; personnel continue to be notified to prepare for immediate deployment as necessary to include SOD and Mobile Field Force (MFF).
  - **Buffalo Sector (BUN):**

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- (b) (7)(E) will deploy to NCSO Command Post and (b) (7)(E) NIB BPAs will augment local law enforcement partner units and assist with crowd control.
- **El Paso Sector (EPT):**
    - In response to a request from Las Cruces PD; (b) (7)(E) USBP agents and (b) (7)(E) SOG agents are responding to assist with tactical capabilities, mitigate risk, life safety issues.
    - In response to a request from New Mexico State Police (NMSP), Alamogordo PD, and Otero County SO, will deploy MFF and Less Lethal certified agents for crowd control and life safety measures. (b) (7)(E) HSI agents are responding to assist NMSP. (b) (7)(E) Mobile Response Teams, (b) (7)(E) Border Patrol Agents and (b) (7)(E) Reactionary Force agents on standby.
  - **Spokane Sector:**
    - SPW SIU TFO's will provide (b) (7)(E) plain clothes USBP agents for (b) (7)(E) to assist with the identification of subjects involved with possible civil unrest and or violence directed at law enforcement or law enforcement facilities.
    - SPW in response to a request from Spokane Police Department deployed (b) (7)(E) Less Lethal certified agents to assist with crowd control and provide life and safety protection measures due to an ongoing and evolving "Black Lives Matter" demonstrations, in downtown Spokane, Washington. SPW agents will also deliver less lethal projectiles to SPD due to critically low supply.

**Air and Marine Operations (AMO):**

- All AMO personnel are accounted for and have not been affected by any incident or event related to a civil disturbance.
- **El Paso Branch:**
  - El Paso Air branch has a request for aviation assistance for a possible scheduled protest at or near the POEs and the downtown area of El Paso, TX.
- **Grand Forks Branch:**
  - National Air Security Operations Center (NASOC)-GF received a request for air support to support State Troopers in Minneapolis/St. Paul due to the civil unrest. They request (b) (7)(E) support beginning 2 Jun for the next three days to augment their air unit who is unable to sustain the flight operations required for the EOC. The request is also coordinated with HSI Minneapolis as they are providing agents on the street and leadership in the EOC.
- **Great Lakes and Buffalo Branch:**
  - Air Support request from Special Agent In Charge (SAC) HSI Buffalo / Other federal / State and local law enforcement for the security of federal property and law enforcement operations.



- HSI Special Agent in Charge Buffalo in collaboration with Buffalo Federal / State and local partners is requesting assistance in providing situational awareness through (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E) to the tactical command center. Specific mission objectives are the security of HSI Offices and the Western District of New York Federal Court House.
- Air and Marine Operations Buffalo is requesting to provide (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E) airplane, crew and (b) (7)(E) Air and Marine Tactical Communications Agent for assignment in the Tactical Operations Center to coordinate communication (b) (7)(E).
- Requested approval to assist Detroit PD with (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E) (b) (7)(E) to provide (b) (7)(E)
- HSI Chicago, the Chicago Police Department (CPD), and the Aurora Police Department (APD) are requesting assistance during the civil unrest in the Chicago area. They request an (b) (7)(E) support from the Chicago Air Unit. (b) (7)(E)
- San Angelo Branch:
  - NASOC-SA received a request for UAS air support and ISR support from USBP Assistant Chief (b) (6), (b) (7)(C). The request is a result of a scheduled peaceful protest taking place at the Del Rio Civic Center in Del Rio, Texas. Officer safety and situational awareness are expected during the event.

#### **U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS)**

- USCIS office in Cleveland, OH has reopened to staff. City curfew remains in place overnight from 2000 – 0600 but does not affect daily business operations.
- There are no reports of USCIS personnel affected by the civil disturbances.
- USCIS is not providing any law enforcement support, however USCIS is prepared to partner with FPS and local law enforcement to respond to any incident at or near its facilities.

#### **Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE)**

##### **Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO)**

- Field offices placed Special Response Teams (SRTs) on standby in multiple locations.
- Buffalo ERO (b) (7)(E) continues to receive information that there are planned protests at or near several government buildings in Buffalo, NY. Buffalo ERO/SRT, CBP/OFO SRT, HSI SRT, Border Patrol BORTAC are all coordinating



consolidated DHS response efforts, as needed. The U.S. Marshals Service, other federal and local law enforcement SWAT have been activated and are on stand-by. There has been no direct request for Buffalo ERO assistance but Buffalo SRT has been placed on standby in case protests impact the Buffalo ERO Office and are ready to assist as needed.

- ERO Philadelphia is monitoring protests across Philadelphia with widespread violence, looting and confrontations with police. The Mayor instituted an 1800 curfew. Protests also occurred at other locations across the AOR, with some violence. All office locations are open, and ERO Philadelphia continues to communicate with FPS and local PD to monitor threats to ICE facilities.
- **Homeland Security Investigations (HSI)**
  - Deployed (b) (7)(E) LEOs providing security support to the FBI in NW DC.
    - A total of (b) (7)(E) SRT agents/officers were augmented by FBI special agents and provided deterrence against potential looters or other individuals engaged in criminal activity during curfew.
    - HSI reported no arrests, no reports of rioting, and no looting or property damage were reported in their sector.
    - Remaining personnel were placed on standby at Potomac Center North.
  - (b) (7)(E)
  - (b) (7)(E) SRT members assigned to HSI San Antonio will (b) (7)(E) support ongoing community safety issues.
  - (b) (7)(E) agent assigned to HSI Phoenix is supporting the Mesa Gang Unit, providing security for businesses that are being targeted by looters and attempting to identify potential gang members who are using the protest as a cover to commit violent crimes.
  - HSI Boston has activated their SRT and deployed them to assist law enforcement in Washington DC; they are enroute to the Washington DC area.
  - HSI St. Paul committed (b) (7)(E) Special Agents to assist the St. Paul Police Department (SPPD) with vehicle patrols and serving as mobile intel units, looking for unrest, looting and other civil disobedience. There are also (b) (7)(E) Supervisors managing the command center.
  - HSI Portland is sending (b) (7)(E) Special Agents to support FPS with onsite security at the ICE facility in Portland, OR.
  - HSI NY is deploying their SRT and RRT to assist with civil unrest in the NCR.

**U.S. Secret Service (USSS)**

- There were no injuries to USSS law enforcement personnel and no damage to USSS property during WH demonstrations on 2 & 3 Jun. To date, 101 USSS law



enforcement personnel have sustained minor injuries during demonstrations at the WH Complex (20 May – 3 Jun), with 11 of those individuals being hospitalized.

- Arrested two individuals for possessing BB guns in the vicinity of the White House.
- Enhanced protective shifts of Uniform Division officers are at the White House to manage civil disobedience and Ready Reserve shifts have been established to respond in the event additional manpower is required.
- Civil disturbance equipment has been obtained with additional supplies planned for delivery over the next week to enhance protective measures.
- Temporary anti-scale fencing has been installed to expand the White House complex perimeter and provide additional stand-off distance from large crowds conducting civil-disobedience.
- USSS Field Offices continue to support joint-operations with federal, state and local partners in US cities, to include Detroit, Orlando, Dallas and New York.
- There has been no degradation to the USSS's ability to sustain its homeland-security mission, perform mission essential functions, or support its partners and all USSS personnel are accounted for.

#### **Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction Office (CWMD)**

- CWMD currently has (b) (7)(E) employees deployed across the country where protests are taking place.
  - Personnel are deployed to the following cities: Boston (b) (7)(E), Dallas (b) (7)(E), Houston (b) (7)(E), Phoenix (b) (7)(E) and Cincinnati (b) (7)(E)

#### **Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA)**

- CISA continues to monitor the situation and are standing by to provide assistance to stakeholders as required.
- Initial and on-going consultations with Regional and field staff personnel on the reporting of physical and/or cyber impacts related to the on-going civil disturbances throughout the Region. R-IV will continue to monitor the situation and remains postured to respond as applicable.
- Region III has (b) (7)(E) Protective Security Advisors virtually supporting their State/Local EMA and LE partners as needed to advise on any critical infrastructure impacts due to civil disturbances.
- Several state office facilities and local police vehicles were damaged subsequent to civil disturbance actions in Providence, RI in the late evening period of 1 Jun.

#### **Management Directorate (MGMT)**

- **Federal Protective Service (FPS)**
  - In support of DOJ, provided (b) (7)(E) personnel to protect NCR federal facilities.

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- Continues to protect federal property as is its core mission; there have been no reports of injuries to personnel or damages to any DHS/FPS facilities.
- Received assistance from CBP, ICE and TSA FAMS to protect multiple facilities in the downtown Washington, DC area of operations.
- Currently coordinating possible additional support from DHS Components in Atlanta, Louisville, Miami, Tampa, Jacksonville, Cincinnati, Columbus, Grand Rapids, Milwaukee, San Diego, San Francisco, Oakland, Los Angeles, Phoenix, Seattle, Tacoma, Spokane, and Portland.

#### **Citizenship and Immigration Services Ombudsman**

- No personnel injured, deceased or displaced.

#### **Transportation Security Administration (TSA)**

- In support of the DOJ, TSA deployed 77 Federal Air Marshals (FAMs) to the NCR. These FAMs are deploying throughout Washington DC in coordination with FPS Officers.
  - Security of the Post Office Museum and surrounding federal buildings.
  - Security of the Export-Import Bank of the U.S. and surrounding federal buildings.

#### **Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC)**

- FLETC security continues increased perimeter patrols at all sites.

#### **Department of Homeland Security HQ (DHS HQ)**

- National Operations Center provides twice daily incident reports to the Homeland Security Enterprise with interim updates to DHS leadership.
- Providing parking space or (b) (7)(E) for (b) (7)(E) CBP (b) (7)(E) cargo trailers containing riot equipment.

#### **Military Advisor (MIL ADV)**

- U.S. Northern Command NORHTCOM has directed military facilities in the NCR to elevate Force Protection Condition to FPCON C.
- The National Guard Bureau NGB reports that over (b) (7)(E) NG members have been mobilized in (b) (7)(E) states and DC in support of state and local law enforcement agencies.
- DHS has not requested any formal request for assistance (RFA) from DOD.

**Overview:** Last night has been quieter than the preceding nights. FBI reports no arrests were made for social unrest and no damage was reported due to social unrest. As of 0400 ET, staffing at the FBI WFO has been reduced to 20 percent manning. There have been no reports of any injuries to any DHS member. The following is a summary of the briefings on 3-4 Jun to interagency partners on civil disturbances in Washington, DC given at the FBI Washington Field Office (WFO) and FBI Strategic Information and Operations Center (SIOC) for your situational awareness.

**Two Command Posts:** FBI SIOC maintained for national SA (one DHS-OPS rep) and FBI WFO for DC operations (LNOs from USSS, CBP, FPS, ICE-HSI, TSA, DHS-OPS).

**Dynamics:** DHS missions:

  - a. CBP assigned to support USPP around White House (WH) complex.

    - Personnel deployed on 3-4 Jun were comprised of Special Response Team (SRT) elements and were supported by analysts and agents and supervisory staff/senior leadership.
    - On 3-4 Jun, a total of (b) (7)(E) SRT agents/officers deployed into NW DC to provide law enforcement presence and serve as a Quick Reaction Force (QRF) to law enforcement personnel stationed inside and around the vicinity of Lafayette Park and the WH complex. SRT agents/officers also deployed to strategic locations in NW DC to provide deterrence against potential looters or other individuals engaged in criminal activity during curfew.

DOD/National Guard (NG)

- There are (b) (7)(E) NG personnel activated in (b) (7)(E) states (including DC) for civil disturbance support.
  - NG has (b) (7)(E) personnel supporting operations in the NCR on Title 32 orders.
  - DCNG can be used throughout the DC, but out of state NG can only be used on federal property.
  - DCNG will continue to provide security to WH and monuments around DC.
  - There are (b) (7)(E) active duty troops standing by on military bases (Andrews, Belvoir, and Myers) in the National Capitol Region to assist civil authorities if POTUS invokes the insurrection act.
  - Moved the North WH perimeter line to "H" Street.
  - Deployed (b) (7)(E) personnel to "H" street and (b) (7)(E) to Lafayette Park.

Outcomes:

- FBI reports no arrests were made for social unrest and no damage was reported due to social unrest.
- FPS reports no injuries or damages to any DHS/FPS personnel or facilities.
- CBP reports no incidents or injuries.
- TSA reports no incidents.
- ICE/HSI reports no arrests or injuries.

Issues:

- USPP reported that demonstrators pointed a laser at their helicopter (b) (7)(E) near 7th and Q in NW DC.

FBI Intelligence Reports:

- Demonstrators are refining their use of social media (Twitter):
  - Posting locations of LE and road blocks.

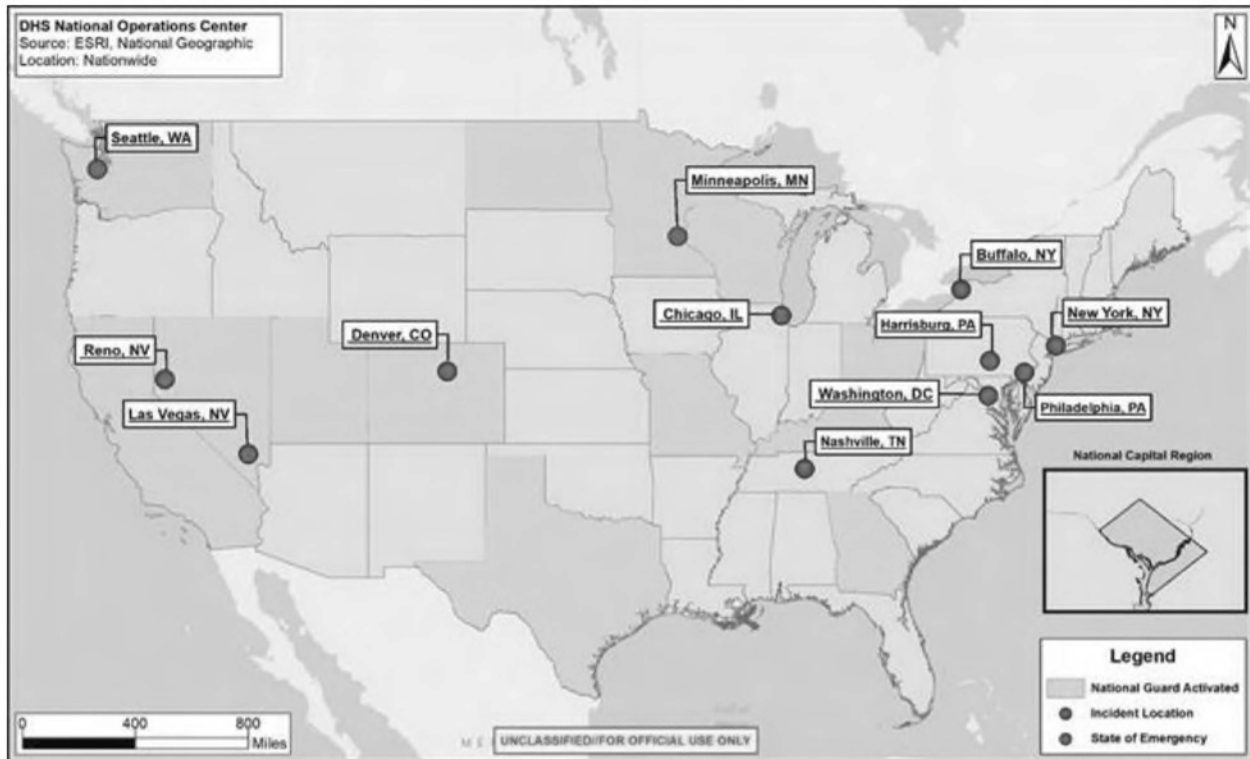

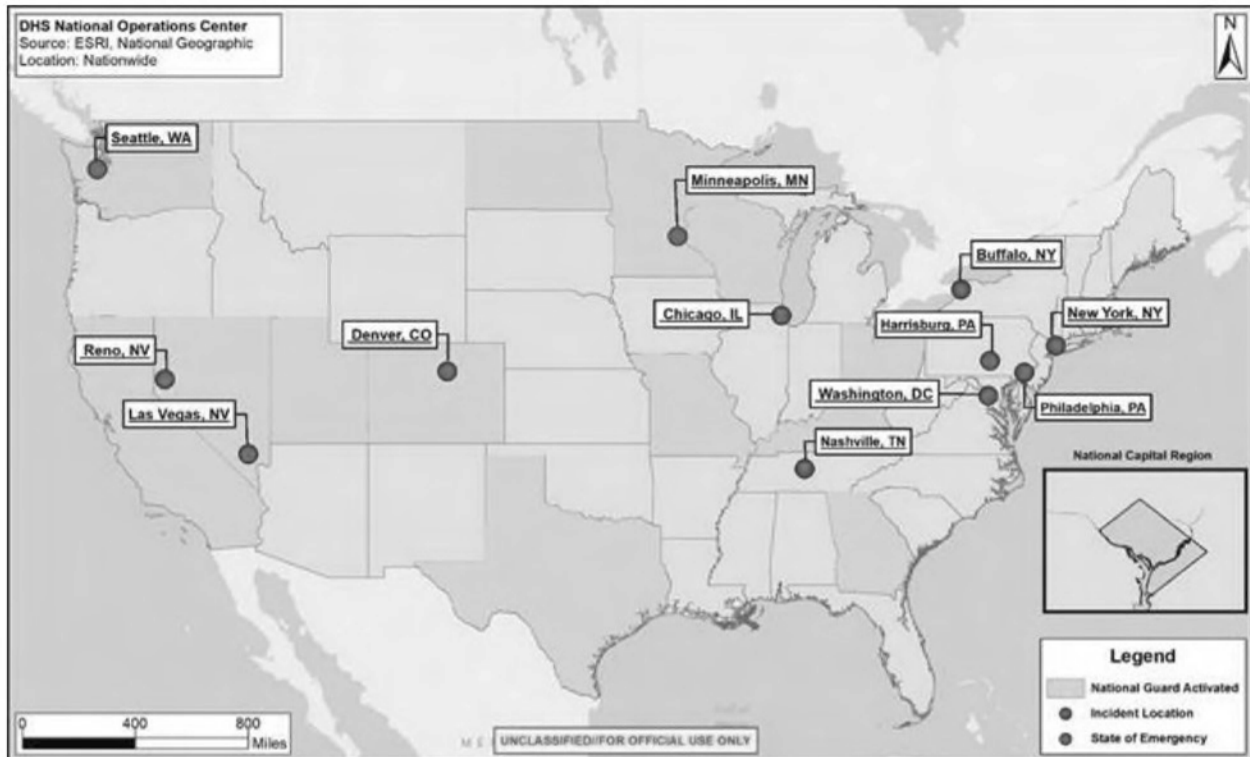

Dear Attorney General Barr and Acting Secretary Wolf:

In light of the deeply troubling actions by federal law enforcement agents in Portland, Oregon, and recent threats by the President to send federal law enforcement officers to New York City, let me be clear about New York City's position. We do not consent. We object. Do not send the proposed agents and officers from the Department of Homeland Security or other federal agencies to New York City. They have not been requested. They are not needed. And they have proved to bring way more harm than good.

To the degree that the President is concerned about fighting crime, New York City remains the safest big city in America, due in large part to the work of the New York City Police Department and our partners in our communities. Not only is the NYPD widely recognized for its training and policing expertise, our officers work hard every day to build trust with our residents. Community trust, as you know, is the bedrock of public safety. Sending in an army of rogue federal agents, unfamiliar with our streets and community leaders, to engage in tactics like those in Portland, will not help fight crime -- it will undermine public trust in law enforcement. The nation is stunned by the actions of your agents in Portland, and such conduct will be unacceptable in New York City.


We are fully capable of protecting our City, which includes protecting federal properties in New York City. Our experience with handling everything from hostage situations to terrorist attacks have helped us create the necessary infrastructure to safeguard our people and property, and part of that is having strong partnerships with the US Marshals and other federal agents who, for years, have been protecting federal properties in New York City. Sending in a wave of unwelcome federal agents in military uniform and using military tactics will only undermine the important relationships that we have with the Marshals and others.

We are also concerned that the President's statements on fighting crime and protecting federal properties are not the true motivation behind the surge of federal agents in our cities. Rather, it is

clear that these are political steps to quell dissent. As one of our nation's great cities, New York City has a strong tradition of upholding the values of the U.S. Constitution, including the right to assembly and the right of free speech. Our nation is currently going through a deeply-needed conversation about the relationship between communities and law enforcement, and I stand by the rights of individuals to express their views peacefully and responsibly. What the federal agents are doing in Portland -- arresting individuals without notice, the use of excessive force, and other apparent acts -- is in violation of those rights and it is not welcome in New York City.

I am sending this letter because it is my duty to keep New York City safe, my duty to protect the rights of our residents, and my duty to do what is right. I am prepared to take all necessary actions to fulfill these responsibilities, as it is clear that the President's proposed actions threaten the safety New Yorkers, the rights of New Yorkers, and the fundamental principles of our nation's constitution.

During a protest in Portland, OR protestors broke through the Police Line and attempted the breach the front entrance of the US Courthouse. FPS Officers and Deputy US Marshals prevented the breach and the protestors departed.

7 Federal facilities were vandalized/damaged (spray painted graffiti and windows broken. 100 Federal facilities have sustained vandalism/damage since May 29, 2020.

Good evening, all.

Below is a readout from today's call with minority staffers of the House Committee on Homeland Security's Subcommittee on Oversight, Management, and Accountability as a follow-up to Ranking Member Mike Rogers' (R-AL) August 6 letter addressed to AS1 Wolf and AG Barr regarding DHS's operational efforts in Portland, OR.

**BLUF:** Today's call with committee staffers of the House Committee on Homeland Security – which included representation from FPS, ICE, and Operations Coordination – regarding DHS's operational efforts in Portland, Oregon went very well as expected with minor get-backs. FPS's Principal Deputy Director, Kris Cline, kicked off the briefing with an overarching timeline of events of DHS operational activities in Portland, OR during the height (May-July) of the civil unrest to present day. Mr. Cline touched on a myriad issues surrounding the Portland protests including the number of injuries sustained by DHS officers, facilities damaged, demonstrations held, and the number of federal arrests made, among other topics.

ICE provided a general summary of its Special Response Teams (SRTs) role in Portland, OR with minor discussion points on cross-designation, SRT uniforms and their rotational status in Portland, OR. And, finally, the Office of Operations Coordination provided a robust summary of DHS's posture nationally including two areas of keen focus in recent weeks: Milwaukee, WI, and New York City. In addition, OPS Coordination spoke briefly about its role in providing

situational awareness and regular updates to senior leadership on DHS activities; and, critically, underscoring the need for continued unity of effort among DHS components particularly during high-level events such as Portland (citing examples of FEMA's Surge Capacity Force and ICE's efforts supporting Border Security).

In the end, DHS briefers thanked the committee and the Ranking Member for their support of DHS's efforts over the past months addressing the violent protests occurring in cities such as Portland, OR.

- Operational status of the Mark O. Hatfield Courthouse – whether it remained open during the protests;
- The overall cost of DHS's response in Portland, OR and facilities damaged;
- The process detaining/debriefing violent protesters in Portland, OR;
- The nature of the federal arrests (111) made and extent of DHS officer injuries;
- Increasing the size of SRTs (specifically on the West Coast);
- Additional training by ICE to address violent attacks on ICE facilities;
- DHS officer training and cross-designation for violent protests;
- Current ICE facilities without SRTs;
- Extremist groups involved in protests; and,
- The Confiscation of mobile devices and the interception of two-way comms during the protests;

Below is my readout from today's Federal Protective Service (FPS) office call/meet-and-greet with Congressman Dan Crenshaw.

**BLUF:** On Monday, July 27, 2020, Principal Deputy Director (PDD) Kris Cline had a telephonic office call/ "meet-and-greet" with Dan Crenshaw (R-TX-2), ranking member of the House Committee on Homeland Security's Subcommittee on Oversight, Management, and Accountability. The call was extremely well-received by the congressman, who thanked the women and men at FPS for their efforts in protecting federal facilities (including the Hatfield

Courthouse in Portland, OR). PDD Cline thanked the congressman for his support of FPS and the law enforcement community writ large over the years, and cited that FPS's workforce was largely comprised of military veterans (over 70 percent).

As a follow-up to the 10 July 2020 DHS briefing to the House Committee on Homeland Security regarding the nationwide civil unrest, PDD Cline briefly updated Ranking Member Crenshaw on the latest activities + operations occurring in Portland, OR (including the # of facilities damaged, officers injured, etc.), and provided a status update on the Protective Security Officer (PSO) who was shot and injured in Oakland, CA at the Ronald V. Dellums Federal Building and U.S. Courthouse on May 29, 2020 (**note**: two PSOs were shot on 29 May, one PSO survived, the other Dave Patrick Underwood is deceased). In closing, the congressman noted that he would like for his staff to be kept apprised on any updates involving the number of officer injuries, facilities damaged, and any other information that reflects the challenges DHS/FPS LEOs are up against in the protection of the Hatfield Courthouse/federal facilities.

**BLUF:** On Wednesday, April 15, 2020, the Federal Protective Service (FPS) conducted a conference call with the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee (HSGAC) regarding the emerging threat of smart phone tracking and data collection and the mitigative steps FPS is taking to ensure federal facilities and employees are prepared for such threats. The interest of the request from HSGAC stemmed from a series of New York Times' articles from 2019 that highlighted the perniciousness of data collection and smart phone tracking relating to personal identity, demonstrations, first and fourth amendment implications, potential misuse of data (now and in the future) and a few other aspects relating to human movement. On balance, staffers were very pleased with the discussion, specifically FPS' recognition of this emerging threat. There were limited get-backs; however, FPS will plan to conduct a follow-up briefing with HSGAC on the efforts of its Cyber Physical Division in the coming weeks.

**BLUF:**

On Tuesday, April 14, 2020, the Federal Protective Service (FPS) held a conference call with the House Committee on Homeland Security's Subcommittee on Oversight, Management, and Accountability (minority staff) regarding the protection and security of FPS-protected facilities throughout the nation – including those occupied by ICE personnel. Committee staffers focused chiefly on FPS' facility security assessments – including technical countermeasures (TCM) – and its applicability to facilities and personnel that have been targeted in recent years; most notably, ICE facilities in the Pacific Northwest and Southwest regions. FPS personnel addressed the staffers' questions and highlighted examples of various FPS operations aimed at protecting and securing vulnerable and/or targeted facilities throughout the CONUS. In short, the call was well-received by committee staff. There are no get-backs.

Below is the synopsis I sent up to DC a short while ago. It's everything I know as of this moment.

---

At approximately 5:45pm this evening, a group of approximately 75-100 protestors attempted to gain entrance to 26 Federal Plaza through the southeast entrance to the facility (located on Duane St.). Based on the signs carried, the chants of the group, and subsequent social media postings, we believe this protest was an anti-ICE protest but there were protestors carrying BLM signs and banners as well. Social media posts claim this was in response to recent reports of "mass hysterectomies" in ICE facilities. (Of note: we had information a group ("Abolish ICE") was going to protest at 4pm and had LEOs on for coverage. This is a group that regularly protests and, over the last two years, had not engaged in this type of activities. At approximately 5:30pm when the protest appeared to be a "no-show", our LEOs were released for the day. We are not certain if this is the same group or not)

This entrance is an employee entrance at the end of a walkway where there is a first set of glass doors (including a revolving door), then a small vestibule, followed by a second set of glass doors before access control (employee turnstiles and an x-ray machine/walk-through metal detector. This entrance is regularly staffed by (b)(7)(E) PSOs.

Two PSOs initially attempted to stop the protestors at the start of the walkway but some members of the group got around them and propped open the first set of glass doors and broke a pane of glass in the revolving doors (photograph attached)

Those PSOs then retreated into the facility and, along with three other PSOs attempted to secure the second set of glass doors.

The protestors entered the vestibule and were able to pry open the second set of glass doors but did not enter the facility as the PSOs formed a cordon and were able to stop their progress. There is information a PSO may have drawn a firearm but this is unconfirmed/uncorroborated

(b)(7)(E) was on scene and documented the incident and damage on video

FLEOs from various agencies who were exiting the building at the time (including the FBI-NY ADIC) gathered behind the PSOs to help them if the protestors breached that line but, since that did not occur, they took no further action

The group also graffitied three locations on the facility (photographs attached)

FPS LEOs were recalled and responded to the location but the protestors were gone upon their arrival

(b)(7)(E) this same group was going to head to another FPS protected facility (201 Varick St.) which houses large ICE offices and a detention facility. As of this email, that has not occurred

FPS LE personnel are present, along with NYPD, at both facilities (26 Fed and 201 Varick). Other than NYPD, we have requested no support from other LE agencies at this time

Media coverage of this event is likely

6 Federal facilities were damaged (Graffiti).

Since May 28, 2020, FPS has responded to over **245 protests** and more than **182 attacks** at federal facilities. FPS and partner agencies are investigating over 182 incidents of damage and vandalism, including spray painting of graffiti, rocks thrown through windows, and bullets being fired at federal facilities. In addition, FPS continues to investigate several instances of explosive devices (i.e. Molotov cocktails and fireworks) being thrown at federal facilities and one instance of individuals breaking a window to gain access to a federal facility and attempting to set it on fire.

In Seattle, approximately 100 protestors demonstrated yesterday at the Seattle Police Department's West Precinct, which is located directly adjacent to the Seattle United States District Courthouse (700 Stewart Street). Protestors removed some of the barricades placed around the precinct and blocked several streets in the vicinity. The protestors departed the area about an hour later.

In Santa Fe, NM, (b) (7)(E) FPS Officers and Agents remain deployed to enhance the protection of the Santiago E. Campos US Courthouse.

The Mayor of Santa Fe, Alan Webber, has ordered the removal of three statues in the city, including the 136-year old Kit Carson Obelisk which is located on the federally owned plaza of the US Courthouse. The obelisk was recently spray-painted with the phrase, "stolen land." According to an emergency proclamation, the city "shall contact the proper officials with jurisdiction over the Obelisk dedicated to Kit Carson, to determine a course of action for removal of that monument." GSA erected a plywood wall around the Obelisk over the weekend.

In Atlanta, GA – FPS Region 4 assigned additional officers to enhance the protection of federal facilities during a NAACP sponsored “March on Georgia” in downtown Atlanta. The peaceful march began at the FPS-protected Richard B. Russell US Courthouse and ended at Atlanta City Hall.

In Portland, OR and Seattle, WA – FPS Region 10 modified their operational posture to adjust staffing requirements based on the average timing of protest activity.

- Region 10 will increase their staffing between the hours of 1500-2300 to maximize Law Enforcement Officer presence at FPS-protected facilities during the hours of increased protest activity.
- The CBP, ICE and TSA Officers and Agents that provided support over the weekend have returned to their normal assigned duties but remain in a “stand-by” status in the event their support is needed.
- The US Marshals Service continues to provide increased staffing to support protection efforts at the US Courthouses in Portland and Seattle.

In San Antonio, TX, FPS, San Antonio Police Department (SAPD), SAPD Arson and Bomb Squad, US Marshals Service (USMS), FBI and ATFE responded to a report of a suspicious device discovered at the US District Courthouse. The device, described as a tennis shoe containing a cylinder with wires exposed (see attached image), was found next to a parked government vehicle belonging to the USMS.

- The SAPD Arson and Bomb Squad conducted a controlled detonation of the device and determined the device did not contain explosive material.
- A review of the courthouse Video Surveillance System revealed an unidentified individual tampering with the USMS vehicle then placing an object, believed to be the tennis shoe containing a hoax explosive device, on the ground next to the vehicle (see attached image). A BOLO for the subject has been distributed to local law enforcement agencies and the investigation continues.
