d) **Maritime Resilience Education Supplemental -- \$120,000** is awarded and fully released as of **9/9/2022** to enable CRC to extend its education and outreach to the maritime resilience community through a partnership with the Maritime Security Center (MSC), a DHS COE led by the Steven's Institute of Technology. CRC will partner with MSC to support the continued development of the Cybersecurity for Maritime Security Professional Development Course into a self-sustained program at the Steven's Institute of Technology.

- c) **Flood APEX Supplemental** – The approved carryover includes **\$48,092** of funds remaining from the **Flood APEX project**. This is the remaining funding from the **\$190,000** that DHS approved and fully released as of 10/14/2021 to implement the detailed workplan and budget justification for the project "A Landscape Study of Social Equity Data Needs and its Access and Availability to Support the Disaster Resilience of Marginalized Communities" with PI Dr. Cassandra Davis. As of **8/17/2022**, DHS approves use of the remaining **\$48,092** funding for the next phase of this study of the same title, which will be known as "**Landscape Study-Part II**."
- d) **Joint COE Port Project Supplemental**: The approved carryover includes **\$31,969** for this work. This is the remaining funding from the **\$335,000** that DHS awarded and fully released as of 4/27/20 to implement the detailed work plan and budget justification that CRC developed in partnership with the DHS Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) and U.S. Army Engineer Research and Development Center (ERDC). There is potential that work conducted under this supplemental award may generate sensitive information; therefore, personnel (e.g., faculty and students) conducting work under this supplemental must be U.S. citizens. All work is to be conducted in accordance with a project- specific information protection plan and data management plan approved by DHS.
- e) **Joint COE Community Infrastructure Planning Supplemental**: The approved carryover includes **\$423,000**, which as of 9/9/2021 DHS awarded and restricted 100 percent pending development of a detailed workplan and budget justification to develop a research and education approach to enhance the quality and transferability of the Infrastructure Resilience Planning Framework and related assessment tools developed by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA). This work will leverage academic capabilities from across the DHS Centers of Excellence Network in order to apply proven approaches that support the infrastructure resilience planning and implementation capacity of state, local, tribal, and territorial governments to plan, invest and maintain infrastructure systems for critical services through partnerships with universities and associations.
