System Assessment and Validation for Emergency Responders

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) established the System Assessment and Validation for Emergency Responders (SAVER) Program to assist emergency responders making procurement decisions.

Located within the Science and Technology Directorate (S&T) of DHS, the SAVER Program conducts objective assessments and validations on commercial equipment and systems, and provides those results along with other relevant equipment information to the emergency responder community in an operationally useful form. SAVER provides information on equipment that falls within the categories listed in the DHS Authorized Equipment List (AEL). The SAVER Program mission includes:

- Conducting impartial, practitioner-relevant, operationally oriented assessments and validations of emergency response equipment; and
- Providing information, in the form of knowledge products, that enables decision makers and responders to better select, procure, use, and maintain emergency response equipment.

Information provided by the SAVER Program will be shared nationally with the emergency responder community, providing a life- and cost-saving asset to DHS, as well as to Federal, state, and local responders.

The SAVER Program is supported by a network of technical agents who perform assessment and validation activities. Further, SAVER focuses primarily on two main questions for the emergency responder community: "What equipment is available?" and "How does it perform?"

## Non-Magnifying Patrol Rifle Sights

Non-magnifying sights for patrol rifles aid in aiming the weapon and allow law enforcement officers to keep both eyes open, which provides a full field of view, enhances situational awareness, and helps the user maintain depth perception. These sights are categorized as either reflex or holographic sights, neither of which require the eye to be lined up with the sight for targeting.

As a System Assessment and Validation for Emergency Responders (SAVER) Program Technical Agent, the Space and Naval Warfare Systems Center (SPAWARSYSCEN) Atlantic conducted a comparative assessment of non-magnifying patrol rifle sights. Prior to the assessment, SPAWARSYSCEN Atlantic conducted a market survey in order to provide information on commercially available equipment and produced the *Non-Magnifying Patrol Rifle Sights Market Survey Report*. A focus group was also conducted to identify equipment selection criteria for the assessment, determine evaluation criteria, and recommend assessment scenarios. Results can be found in the *Non-Magnifying Patrol Rifle Sights Focus Group Report*.
