Ms. Maggie Wilderotter has served as the chairman of the board of directors and chief executive officer (CEO) of Frontier Communications since 2006. She joined the company in 2004 as president, CEO, and as a member of the board of directors.

Previously, Ms. Wilderotter was senior vice president of Microsoft Corp.'s worldwide public sector, responsible for strengthening customer and partner outreach in the Government and education markets. Prior to Microsoft, Ms. Wilderotter was president and CEO of Wink Communications, Inc. Before that, she was executive vice president of national operations for AT&T Wireless Services and CEO of AT&T's aviation communications division. She also served as senior vice president of McCaw Cellular Communications, Inc., and was a regional president managing the company's California, Nevada, and Hawaii region.

Ms. Wilderotter serves on the boards of Xerox Corp. and Proctor & Gamble Co., as well as a number of non-profit organizations. She is a member of the Directorship 100, a list compiled by the National Association of Corporate Directors of those having a profound impact on corporate governance, as well as a member of the Board of Advisors of BoardroomIQ and the WomenCorporateDirectors Global CEO Task Force. *Fortune* magazine included Ms. Wilderotter in its ranking of the "50 Most Powerful Women in Business" in 2009, 2010, and 2011. Also in 2011, *The Financial Times* named her among "The Top 50 Women in World Business" and she also received "The Business Media Award" from the Women's Media Center. In 2012, Mrs. Wilderotter was honored by B'nai B'rith International with its prestigious Distinguished Achievement Award for her commitment to industry innovation, philanthropy, humanitarian assistance, and leadership in promoting diversity.
