Overview

This 2-day event will bring together hundreds of higher education leaders, emergency managers, subject matter experts and federal officials to discuss and plan through a hypothetical campus infrastructure attack caused by cyber attack.

Following the successful 2016 NTTX event which focused on a campus violence incident, this event will include themed workshops, guest speakers, and a day-long exercise to challenge and educate participants. This year, the NTTX is set to grow again with a goal of 400 participants representing 120 institutions nationwide.

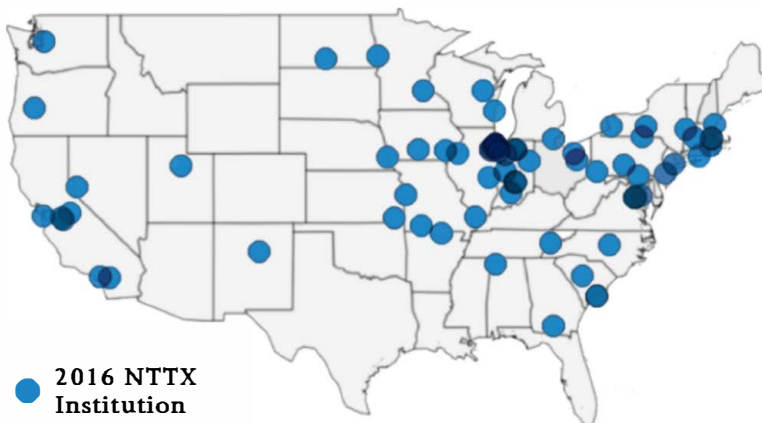

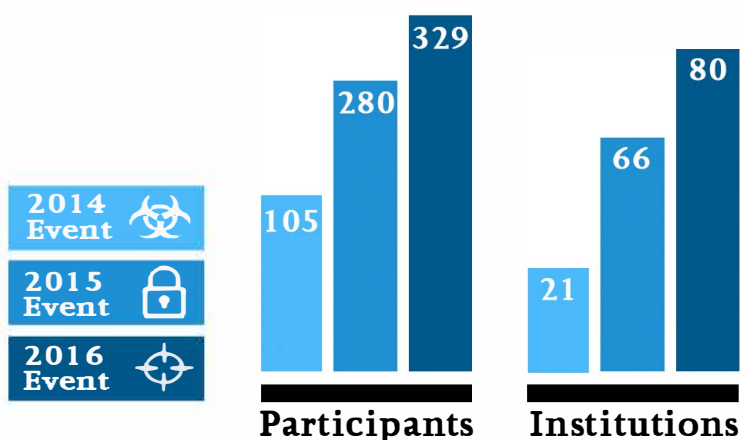
Spotlight 2016
