



Winter 2019 Regional Tabletop Exercise Anticipated Host Institutions Specifications and Logistics

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is now seeking a partner college or university to serve as the host institution for the winter 2019 RTTX, anticipated to be held in February 2019. Final event date will be dependent on host institutions schedule and availability.

The winter 2019 RTTX will be a one-day event, with 120 attendees, that will include a tabletop exercise, a learning session, and an after-action session.

Working in coordination with the DHS Office of Academic Engagement, a host institution serves as the venue for the event, supporting the event in terms of space, technology, and other logistical requirements. Host institution specifications are below.

Host institution application will request information such as name of institution, location of institution, primary point of contact, confirmation of ability to provide required venue needs, and potential event and scenario topics of interest.

Event and scenario topics should align with DHS core missions of: (1) Prevent terrorism and enhancing security; (2) Secure and manage our borders; (3) Enforce and administer our immigration laws; (4) Safeguard and secure cyberspace; and (5) Ensure resilience to disasters.

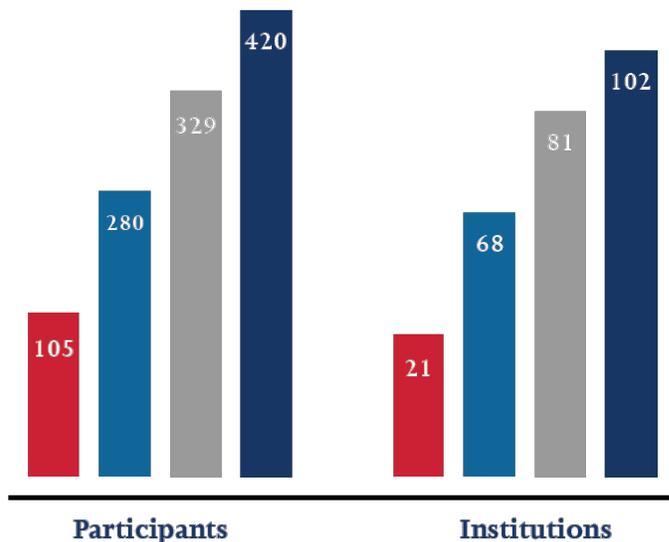

Background Information on the DHS Campus Resilience Program

The Campus Resilience (CR) Program aims to support institutions of higher education to become more resilient by building upon best practices, lessons learned, and resources already developed.

In 2014, DHS launched the inaugural National Seminar and Tabletop Exercise (NTTX) at Northeastern University. DHS will conduct the fifth NTTX in September 2018 at the University of Texas at San Antonio, focusing on threats of campus disorder.

Derived from the success of the NTTX, the RTTX events are held multiple times per year focusing on a risk or threat(s) specific to institutions within a geographic region. The inaugural RTTX was conducted on February 2, 2018 at Drexel University, with more than 100 participants from 24 institutions of higher education in the greater Philadelphia region in attendance. The third RTTX will be hosted at the University of Central Oklahoma on October 11, 2018, and will focus on a tornado during a large campus event.
