- Continental Automotive Systems issued a recall February 4 for 1.5 – 2 million vehicles sold in the U.S. that are supplied with potentially defective air bag control units. – *Reuters* (See item [4](#))

1. *February 9, Associated Press* – (North Carolina) **NC regulator fines Duke Energy nearly \$7 million for coal ash spill.** The North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality announced February 9 that it issued Duke Energy a \$6.6 million fine for violations stemming from the February 2014 coal ash spill at the company's Dan River power plant in Eden that led to pollution in the area.

2. *February 8, KWQC 6 Davenport* – (Illinois) **Abandoned gas station fined \$1.18 million by Knox County court.** The Knox County Circuit Court issued a \$1.18 million fine and penalty against the dissolved T-Mart Inc., February 8 for failure to remove abandoned underground petroleum storage tanks at a closed gasoline station in Wataga, Illinois, in addition to other Gasoline Storage Act violations. Officials asserted that two underground storage tanks containing fuel had the potential to cause soil and water contamination and posed a threat to the environment and human health.

3. *February 9, Associated Press* – (Louisiana) **River Bend nuclear station to undergo special inspection.** The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission reported February 8 that it will be conducting a special inspection at Entergy-owned River Bend nuclear power plant after its St. Francisville facility's reactor had an unplanned shutdown when lightning struck the plant January 9.

4. *February 5, Reuters* – (International) **Continental says 5 mln vehicles worldwide may have faulty air bags.** Continental Automotive Systems issued a recall February 4 for 1.5 – 2 million vehicles sold in the U.S. after it supplied potentially defective air bag control units built between 2006 and 2010 to Honda, Fiat Chrysler, Mercedes-Benz, and three other manufacturers, which can cause air bags to inadvertently deploy without warning or fail to deploy in a crash. Honda Motor Co has reported two injuries related to the defect involving 5 million vehicles worldwide.

5. *February 6, Associated Press* – (Illinois) **Chicago FBI: ‘Pinball Bandit’ suspected in 5 bank robberies.** The FBI is searching for a man dubbed the “Pinball Bandit” suspected of carrying out 5 robberies at 4 Chicago banks from January 13 – January 25. The suspect is considered armed and dangerous.

6. *February 9, WTIC 61 Hartford* – (Connecticut) **Four remain in critical condition after charter bus headed to Mohegan Sun casino crashes.** A bus carrying 55 passengers crashed and shut down Interstate 95 in Madison, Connecticut, February 9 sending approximately 25 people to area hospitals for critical injuries. Officials reported that the crash was due to snow-covered roads.

7. *February 9, WHO 13 Des Moines* – (Iowa) **I-35 north of Ames remains closed due to hazardous conditions.** Interstate 35 north of Ames remained closed February 9 after blizzard-like conditions caused multiple crashes on the highway and caused poor visibility to drivers February 8.

9. *February 9, Rome News-Tribune* – (Georgia) **\$3 million in damage reported at JCG Farms after explosion that killed 1, injured 5.** Officials from the Federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, the Georgia State fire marshal, and the Rockmart Fire Department are investigating a February 7 explosion at the JCG Farms feed plant in Rockmart, Georgia, which left one worker dead, injured five others, and caused \$3 million in heavy structural damages to the warehouse, plant, and offices.

10. *February 9, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (National) **Vosges, LTD recalls Uncured Bacon Ganache chocolate products due to misbranding and undeclared allergens.** The Food Safety and Inspection Service announced February 8 that Vosges, LTD., issued a recall for approximately 135 pounds of its Trade Joe’s-branded Uncured Bacon Ganache chocolate products sold in 3-ounce wrapped bars due to misbranding and undeclared coconut. The products were distributed to retail locations in Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, and South Carolina.

11. *February 8, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (Pennsylvania; Ohio) **Giant Eagle voluntarily recalls Japanese Hand Breaded Cod Fillets due to an undeclared soy allergen.** Giant Eagle issued a voluntary recall February 8 for approximately 420 packages of its Japanese Breaded Cod Fillets due to misbranding and undeclared soy. The products were sold at Giant Eagle and Market District supermarkets in Pennsylvania and Ohio.

12. *February 8, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Fresh Express announces precautionary recall of a limited quantity of Chopped Romaine Salad due to undeclared allergens.** Fresh Express Incorporated issued a precautionary recall February 6 for a limited quantity of its Fresh Express Chopped Romaine products sold in 32-ounce packages due to possible exposure to undeclared allergens after it was discovered that sealed condiment packets containing individual packets of dressing, croutons, and parmesan cheese used in the brand’s Caesar salads were accidentally placed in the chopped romaine product. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed in eastern and southeastern States.

13. *February 8, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Living Tree Community Foods recalls macadamia nuts and macadamia butter because of possible health risk.** Living Tree Community Foods issued a recall February 5 for its Organic Macadamia Nuts sold in 4-ounce packages and Organic Macadamia Butter sold in 8-ounce jars after testing at the company’s Hawaii-based supplier, Mahina Mele, revealed the presence of Salmonella. Production of the products, which were distributed to retail locations in California and Connecticut and to mail order customers nationwide, was suspended indefinitely.

14. *February 8, Gwinnett County Daily Post* – (Georgia) **Grease causes sewage spill near Bromolow Creek in Duluth.** Gwinnett County’s Department of Water Resources

reported that a grease clog in a Duluth sewer line caused 4,104 gallons of wastewater sewage to overflow from a manhole February 8 and spill into Bromolow Creek. Officials put up signs warning residents of the spill.

19. *February 8, CNN* – (National) **Hackers publish contact info of 20,000 FBI employees.** The U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) stated February 8 that it is investigating unauthorized access of a system operated by one of its components containing employee contact information after hackers allegedly published contact information for 20,000 FBI employees and nearly 10,000 DHS employees. The DOJ

asserted that there was no indication of a breach of sensitive personally identifiable information.

22. *February 9, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Cross-platform backdoor adwind hits 443,000 users: Kaspersky.** Security researchers from Kaspersky Lab reported that a remote access trojan (RAT) dubbed Adwind RAT had infected approximately 443,000 victims by 2015 and targets Windows, Linux, Mac OS X, and other platforms that run Java, to log keystrokes and steal virtual private network (VPN) certificates, cryptocurrency wallet keys, passwords and other data from web forms, among other malicious actions via spear-phishing campaigns. The trojan also uses command and control (C&C) servers to execute commands and relies on free Dynamic Domain Name System (DNS) providers.

23. *February 9, Softpedia* – (International) **Download firmware 1.1.00.20 for NETGEAR's D6200 modem router.** NETGEAR released new firmware version 1.100.20 for its D6200 modem router that removes a flaw that disabled wireless connections when the region was assigned as WW in flash, fixes the unit's currentsetting.htm page to show the correct information in the region field, and removes a debug file (/tmp/yuziven1) and fixes unterminated tries when checkfw fails.

24. *February 8, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Advantech failed to patch serious flaws in SCADA.** The Zero Day Initiative (ZDI) published advisories that stated several unpatched vulnerabilities were affecting Advantech's WebAccess 8.0 industrial automation SCADA/HMI products after researchers found unrestricted file upload, path traversal, improper access control, cross-site scripting (XSS), and SQL injections,

among other vulnerabilities, that were reported to be patched, but were improperly patched. The unpatched flaws can be exploited by a remote, authenticated attacker to execute arbitrary code on a victim's system.

25. *February 8, KENS 5 San Antonio* – (Texas) **Welding tool sparks massive fire in shops at Rivercenter garage.** The San Antonio Fire Department reported that a February 8 fire on top of a parking garage at the Shops at Rivercenter prompted surrounding retail stores and restaurants to evacuate for over 2 hours and required 30 fire units to extinguish the blaze after the fire began when a worker using a welding torch accidentally ignited some dry timber nearby. One man suffered smoke inhalation and officials stated that the incident was contained.
