Top Stories

- Crews worked to reopen all southbound lanes of Interstate 75 near North Port in Florida February 22 nearly 24 hours after a semi-truck crashed, overturned, and spilled several thousand gallons of fuel February 21. – *WTSP 10 St. Petersburg* (See item [5](#))

1. *February 21, WDIV 4 Detroit* – (Michigan) **DTE: 3,000 customers remain without power after high winds.** DTE Energy Co. crews worked to restore power for approximately 3,000 Detroit customers who remained without service February 21 following high winds that caused extensive damage to the city's electrical system and knocked out power to 123,500 customers February 20.

2. *February 20, WTRF 7 Wheeling* – (West Virginia) **Oil spill reaches creek in Pine Gove, potentially contaminating water.** The mayor of Pine Grove urged residents to avoid the water until it is tested after MarkWest Energy Partners, L.P. confirmed February 20 that heat transfer oil from its Mobley gas processing facility in Wetzel County was released and reached the North Fork of Fishing Creek. The Pine Grove Water Works water intake was closed indefinitely while authorities monitor the spill.

3. *February 22, Japan Times* – (International) **Reactor coolant leak caused by weak bolt tension, Kansai Electric says.** Kansai Electric Power Co., reported February 22 that an estimated 34 liters of radioactive coolant water leaked into the No. 4 nuclear reactor building at its Takahama nuclear power plant in Fukui Prefecture due to an insufficient tension of a bolt in a valve installed in a pipe. The reactor was scheduled for a restart, but was put on hold after the leak was discovered.

4. *February 22, Oak Ridge Today* – (Tennessee) **Clinton woman dies after two vehicles hit her on Clinton Highway.** A portion of Clinton Highway in Tennessee was closed for approximately 6 hours February 21 – February 22 while officials investigated the scene after a pedestrian walking on a southbound lane of the highway was struck and killed by 2 vehicles.

5. *February 22, WTSP 10 St. Petersburg* – (Florida) **SB I-75 to reopen some lanes overnight after tanker crash.** Crews worked to reopen all southbound lanes of Interstate 75 near North Port in Florida February 22 nearly 24 hours after an accident involving a semi-truck crashed, overturned, and spilled several thousand gallons of fuel onto the roadway from its load February 21.

6. *February 19, KOMO 4 Seattle* – (Washington) **Life-threatening injuries in head-on crash near Orting.** Officials closed Highway 162 near Orting for more than 2 hours February 19 following a head-on collision involving 2 vehicles that sent both drivers to the hospital with injuries.

7. *February 19, Grass Valley Union* – (California) **Driver killed in Highway 49 wreck identified.** A fatal 2-vehicle collision killed 1 driver and closed Highway 49 at Nishinam Gulch Road in Nevada City, California, for approximately 5 hour February 18 while officials investigated the scene and crews worked to clear the wreckage from an overturned semi-truck.

8. *February 19, KTUU 2 Anchorage* – (Alaska) **Old Glenn Highway fully reopened following mixer truck accident.** Old Glenn Highway from North Eagle River to South Birchwood was closed for several hours February 19 while officials investigated the scene of a crash involving an overturned concrete truck that struck a vehicle.

9. *February 22, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (Texas; Oklahoma) **Flying Food Group, LLC recalls ready-to-eat wraps due to adulteration, misbranding, and undeclared allergens.** The Food Safety and Inspection Service announced February 19 that the Flying Food Group, LLC, issued a recall for approximately 1,006 pounds of its Starbucks brand Edamame Hummus Wrap products sold in 6.8-ounce packages due to

misbranding, adulteration, and undeclared nut allergens after the company received a complaint that the products were mislabeled and contained Thai Style Chicken Peanut Wraps products which are formulated with nuts and may contain chicken. The items were distributed to retail locations in Texas and Oklahoma.

10. *February 22, KSNW 3 Wichita* – (Kansas; Oklahoma) **Kansas Salmonella outbreak linked to tainted sprouts.** The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention are investigating a Salmonella outbreak February 20 which sickened 5 in Kansas after consuming tainted sprouts from Sweetwater Farms in Inman, Kansas. KDHE also reported that three Oklahoma residents contracted Salmonella infections that matches the Kansas outbreak strain.

11. *February 21, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (Texas) **Fresh Creative Foods issues allergy alert on undeclared fish (anchovy) in H-E-B Tartar Sauce.** Fresh Creative Foods issued a recall February 21 for its H-E-B Tartar Sauce products sold in 8-ounce packages due to an undeclared fish (anchovy) allergen after routine restocking revealed that certain packages have lids correctly labeled as Cocktail Sauce and a container incorrectly labeled as Tartar Sauce, while the actual contents are Cocktail Sauce. The products were distributed to H-E-B stores in Texas and officials reported there have been no reports of allergic reactions.

12. *February 20, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Maytag Dairy Farms voluntarily recalls blue cheese products due to possible health risk.** Maytag Dairy Farms issued a voluntary recall February 19 for 5 lots of its Maytag Blue, blue cheese wedges and wheels, and 15 batches of its blue cheese crumbles after testing revealed the presence of *Listeria monocytogenes* in 2 lots of the product. The items were distributed to retail stores, restaurants, and direct mail orders nationwide.

13. *February 20, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (International) **Health Matters America Inc. issues nationwide recall of Sprouted Flax Seed Powder and Sprouted Chia & Flax Seed Powder because of possible health risk.** Health Matters America Inc., issued a recall February 20 for specific lots of its Organic Traditions Sprouted Flax Seed Powder and Organic Traditions Sprouted Chia & Flax Seed Powder products due to a potential Salmonella contamination after Canadian health officials notified the company's supplier that random sample testing revealed the presence of Salmonella in the product sold in Canadian retail stores, which may pose potential contamination to other products packaged from the same lot. The products were distributed nationwide.

14. *February 19, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Wild Blue Yonder Foods issues recall for Chappaqua Crunch Granola with Blueberries and Bananas because of possible health risk.** Wild Blue Yonder Foods issued a recall February 18 for its Chappaqua Crunch Simply Granola with Blueberries & Bananas products sold in 13-ounce packages after the supplier notified the company that the bananas in the granola products may be contaminated with Salmonella. The products were distributed in retail locations and through mail orders to 14 States and Washington, D.C.

15. *February 19, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Country Life Natural Foods recalls raw pistachios because of possible health risk.** Country Life Natural Foods issued a recall February 19 for its shelled raw pistachio products sold in 2-pound bags and 30-pound boxes after testing revealed the presence of Salmonella in 1 of the 19 samples, which may pose potential contamination to items packaged from the affected lot. The products were distributed to retail locations, mail orders, and direct delivery in 14 States.

16. *February 21, CNN* – (Texas) **Water runs black in Texas town already wracked by corruption arrests.** The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality issued a boil-water advisory February 20 and urged residents in Crystal City to avoid drinking discolored water until the commission issues an all-clear notice following sample test results for water pressure, chlorination, and bacteria.

17. *February 20, WKZO 590 AM St. Kalamazoo* – (Michigan) **Lawton issues boil water advisory.** A boil-water advisory was issued in the Village of Lawton in Michigan February 20 after two routine water samples revealed the presence of E.coli contamination. Officials will flush pipes, apply anti-bacterial agents, and conduct more tests before lifting the advisory.

20. *February 22, Cincinnati Enquirer* – (Ohio) **‘Anonymous’ hackers release CPD officers’ data.** The Cincinnati Police Department announced February 22 that it is investigating to determine if its systems were breached and if any information was obtained following reports that the hacktivist group, Anonymous Anon Verdict, allegedly released the personal information of 52 department employees.

21. *February 22, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Comodo support tool allowed attackers to elevate privileges.** Comodo’s security product, GeekBuddy was susceptible to a security vulnerability after a security researcher from Google Project Zero found that its virtual network computing (VNC) server was protected by a weak password generated using the first eight characters of an secure hash algorithm 1 (SHA-1) hash in relation to the device’s disk, which could allow attackers to generate a password, connect to the VNC server, and elevate their privileges. In addition, attackers could escape sandboxes including its Chromodo browser, Google Chrome, and Microsoft Internet Explorer.

22. *February 22, SecurityWeek* – (National) **Oregon man pleads guilty to hacking celebrity email accounts.** The U.S. Department of Justice reported February 18 that an Oregon man was charged with violating the Computer Fraud and Abuse Act after he allegedly stole the usernames and passwords of 363 Apple and Google email accounts through a phishing scheme that tricked victims into clicking a malicious link to “verify” their accounts. Once victims clicked on the malicious link, they were redirected to a fake Web site that impersonated an Apple or Google login page where the culprit collected email credentials.

An investigation is ongoing and the total amount of damage was not disclosed.

The cause of the fire is under investigation.

25. *February 20, Fredericksburg Free Lance-Star* – (Virginia) **Bomb threat closes Spotsylvania Towne Centre for part of Saturday.** Virginia State Police reported February 20 that the Spotsylvania Towne Centre was reopened after being evacuated and closed for nearly 3 hours due to a bomb threat. Authorities reported no explosive devices were discovered.
