Energy Sector

1. *April 22, Fairbanks Daily News-Miner* – (Alaska) **Boiler at UAF power plant fails, shutting off heat.** Crews restarted the University of Alaska Fairbanks power plant April 21 after the plant was temporarily taken offline when a boiler tube failed in Boiler 1, causing a steam flash and fire. The tube failure was reportedly caused by aging and thinning of the tube.

2. *April 21, WKMG 6 Orlando* – (Florida) **Truck dumps 300 gallons of sulfuric acid solution in Flagler.** The Dumont Chemical Company in Apopka lost its load April 21 when a vehicle transporting chemicals in Flagler Beach, Florida spilled about 300 gallons of sulfuric acid solution onto State Road A1A after a skid holding the containers slipped off the vehicle. The U.S. Department of Environmental Protection Agency was notified and HAZMAT crews were working to clear the spill.

3. *April 21, York Daily Record* – (National) **Peach Bottom must upgrade safety equipment, NRC says.** The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) reported April 21 that the York County-based Peach Bottom Atomic Power Station and four other nationwide nuclear power plants were identified to have issues in their nuclear waste storage following an April 7 NRC letter which revealed that Peach Bottom's panels were degraded and their fuel pools were spent. Peach Bottom will be required to send the NRC corrective actions to fix the issues.

4. *April 22, New York Times* – (National) **Volkswagen reached deal in U.S. over emissions scandal.** Volkswagen officials agreed April 21 to fix or buy back nearly 480,000 of its Volkswagen, Audi A3, and Porsche model years 2008 – 2015 with 2-liter or 3-liter diesel engines sold in the U.S. that were equipped with illegal emissions software. Federal officials were negotiating the total amount of fines and compensation Volkswagen will have to pay.

5. *April 21, U.S. Department of Labor* – (Ohio) **Findlay auto parts manufacturer again exposes workers to machine hazards.** The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited Sanoh America Inc., with two repeated and two serious safety

violations April 18 after an investigation at the Findlay, Ohio facility revealed that the company exposed workers to fall and amputation hazards by failing to de-energize rollers prior to maintenance, failing to install adequate guard rails and ladders, and failing to implement lockout/tag out procedures to prevent unintentional machine starts, among other violations. Proposed penalties total \$82,500.

6. *April 21, TheCarConnection.com* – (National) **2016 Nissan Murano, Maxima recalled for braking problem.** Nissan Motor Company Ltd., issued a recall April 21 for 12,616 of its model year 2016 Nissan Murano crossovers and Maxima sedan vehicles sold in the U.S. due to faulty Anti-Lock Brake System (ABS) actuators that may have been assembled with a damaged O-ring which can cause the brake fluid pressure to be improperly controlled during ABS and Vehicle Dynamic Control (VDC) activation, thereby increasing the required vehicle stopping time and increasing the risk of an accident.

7. *April 22, WCPO 9 Cincinnati* – (Kentucky) **Multi-vehicle crash stalls NKY traffic, sets loose 146 pigs on highway.** Interstate 71 in Gallatin County, Kentucky was closed for several hours April 21 following a 2-vehicle crash that caused a semi-truck hauling several pigs to overturn and release 146 pigs onto the road. No injuries were reported.

8. *April 22, Battle Creek Enquirer; WZZM 13 Grand Rapids* – (Michigan) **Semi hits stopped car on I-94 at I-69; 1 person dead.** A fatal 2-vehicle crash April 22 left 1 person dead and shut down Interstate 94 in Marshall, Michigan, for more than 3 hours while officials investigated the scene of the crash.

9. *April 22, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Exceptional Health Products issues allergy alert on undeclared soy and milk allergens in Angel Wings – Daily Multi 120 Capsules.** Exceptional Health Products issued a recall April 19 for its Angel Wings Daily Multi 120 Capsules products sold in 7 variations due to undeclared soy and milk allergens following inconsistencies with the supplier’s allergen statement on the Amino Acid ingredient used in the capsules. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed via mail orders nationwide.

10. *April 22, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (New York) **Meating Place recalls beef product due to possible E. coli O157:H7 contamination.** Meating Place issued a recall April 21 for 325 pounds of its Loringo brand frozen beef patty products sold in 5-pound packages due to a potential E. coli O157:H7 contamination discovered during routine in-plant review of testing results. There have been no confirmed reports of adverse reactions and the products were distributed to retail and intuitional locations in New York.

11. *April 21, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Urgent product recall for undeclared soy and milk allergens.** MagZuma Nutrition issued a recall April 21 for affected lots of its Life’s Qik Fix Daily Multi 180 Capsules and Zuma Supreme Daily Multi 120 Capsules products due to undeclared soy and milk allergens following inconsistencies with the supplier’s allergen statement on the Amino Acid ingredients used in the capsules. The products were distributed via mail orders nationwide.

12. *April 21, Casper Star-Tribune* – (Wyoming) **Wyoming Medical Center informs 3,200 patients of email breach.** Wyoming Medical Center in Casper notified 3,184 patients April 20 that their personal and medical information may have been potentially exposed in a phishing scam that targeted 2 employees February 22. Medical center officials do not believe any of the information was misused, and stated that the access was immediately blocked upon discovery of the scheme.

13. *April 21, WBAY 2 Green Bay* – (Wisconsin) **Little Chute gas leak stopped; elementary students evacuated.** Approximately 600 students from Little Chute Elementary School in Wisconsin were evacuated and classes were dismissed April 21 due to a gas leak caused by a construction crew that hit a nearby gas line. Crews stopped the leak and worked to repair the line.

14. *April 21, Associated Press* – (New Hampshire) **4 students, driver, injured when car hits school bus.** Four students and a driver were transported to an area hospital with injuries after a vehicle collided with a school bus at an intersection in Nashua, New Hampshire, April 21.

16. *April 22, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Adobe patches flaw in analytics AppMeasurement for Flash Library.** Adobe release its Analytics AppMeasurement for Flash library version 4.0.1 which patched a Document Object Model (DOM)-based cross-site scripting (XSS) vulnerability after a security researcher discovered the vulnerability when the debugTracking feature was enabled. The flaw affects version 4.0 and earlier platforms.

17. *April 21, Softpedia* – (International) **Law enforcement, government agencies see phishing as main cyber risk.** The Global Cyber Alliance (GCA), a group of government representatives from the U.S. and the United Kingdom, agreed to promote the usage of Domain-based Message Authentication, Reporting & Conformance (DMARC) protocol to make it more difficult for attackers to tamper with original documents as phishing attacks were ranked as the top cyber threat following research that revealed spear-phishing campaigns increased by 55 percent from 2015.

18. *April 21, SecurityWeek* – (International) **DDoS attacks continue to rise in power and sophistication.** Imperva released its Global DDoS Threat Landscape Q1 2016 report which revealed that distributed denial of service (DDoS) attacks were more advanced and sophisticated after an analysis revealed that attackers increased the use of browser-like DDoS bots with capabilities of bypassing security challenges by 36.6 percent and attackers were seen executing new ways to perform application layer assaults including Hypertext Transfer Protocol Secure (HTTPS) POST flood.

No bomb devices or suspicious packages were found and officials stated the casino will reopen April 22.
