Top Stories

- Nissan Motor Company Ltd., issued a recall April 29 for nearly 3.2 million of its model years 2013 – 2017 vehicles in 11 makes, and model years 2015 – 2016 Chevrolet City Express vehicles sold in the U.S. due to potentially faulty passenger-side air bag sensors. – *Reuters* (See item [7](#))
- A CSX freight train carrying 15,500 gallons of chemicals derailed, sent 14 cars off the tracks, spilled three different chemicals, and closed Rhode Island Avenue-Brentwood Metro Station for several hours May 1. – *WRC 4 Washington, D.C.* (See item [16](#))
- Heavy storms April 30 caused more than 100 power outages, impacted more than 6,000 customers, and knocked out power at 2 water pumping stations, and forced officials to issue a boil water advisory May 1 in Atlanta. – *Associated Press* (See item [23](#))
- A multi-alarm fire caused approximately \$1.5 million dollars in damages to a Mount Vernon commercial block May 1 due to a fire that reportedly began at the Craft Stove. – *KING 5 Seattle* (See item [39](#))

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Energy Sector

1. *May 2, Associated Press* – (North Dakota) **Oil and saltwater spill cleaned up at McKenzie County well.** Buckhorn Energy Services LLC reported April 29 that 10,080 gallons of saltwater and 840 gallons of oil were released, contained, and recovered at an oil well in McKenzie County. North Dakota officials stated that the spill was the result of an equipment failure.

2. *May 1, Associated Press* – (Texas) **Flooding flushes oil, chemicals into Texas rivers.** Texas emergency management officials have documented sheens and plumes of crude oil and toxic fracking chemicals that were released into the State's rivers following the March flood of the Sabine River that tipped tanks and flooded production sites. The Texas Railroad Commission stated that it is taking appropriate measures once it receives notification of releases.

3. *April 30, Harrisburg Patriot-News* – (Pennsylvania) **Feds approve five-county natural gas pipeline to serve new power plant in Shamokin Dam.** The U.S. Federal Energy Regulatory Commission approved April 29 the \$178 million Sunbury Pipeline Project of UGI Energy Services Inc., that will go through Northumberland, Union, Montour, Lycoming, and Snyder counties in central Pennsylvania and will primarily serve the Panda Power Funds Hummel Station generating plant under construction in Shamokin Dam. The pipeline will be completed in November and gas will be available in early 2017.

4. *April 29, Associated Press* – (Pennsylvania) **Man burned while running from exploding pipeline.** A Texas Eastern Transmission natural gas pipeline that exploded April 29 in Salem Township, Pennsylvania, damaged at least four nearby homes, left a homeowner who was fleeing from the fire injured, and prompted a quarter-mile evacuation zone. The cause of the explosion is under investigation after the pipeline was shut off and the fire was brought under control.

5. *April 30, WJON 1240 St. Cloud* – (Minnesota) **Cold Spring firefighters work to contain chemical spill at GNP.** Officials reported April 30 that approximately 260 gallons of organic peroxide leaked from a broken valve at the GNP Company plant in Cold Spring, Minnesota. No injuries were reported and fire crews were working to

contain the spill.

6. *April 29, Associated Press* – (Michigan) **Cook Nuclear Plant offline after routine refueling outage.** Officials from the Donald C. Cook Nuclear Plant in Lake Township, Michigan, reported April 29 that its Unit 1 nuclear reactor was back online after being shut down for a routine refueling and maintenance outage.

7. *April 29, Reuters* – (International) **Nissan to recall 3.53 million vehicles: air bags may not deploy.** Nissan Motor Company Ltd., issued a recall April 29 for nearly 3.2 million of its model years 2013 – 2017 vehicles in 11 makes, and model years 2015 – 2016 Chevrolet City Express vehicles sold in the U.S. due to potentially faulty passenger-side air bag sensors that may register an adult front seat passenger as a child or an empty seat, thereby preventing the air bag from deploying in the event of a crash after the company received 1,271 consumer complaints and warranty claims linked to the issue. The recall also includes 622,110 of Nissan's Sentra vehicles due to a front passenger seat belt bracket issue where the bracket may become deformed if it used to secure a child restraint system.

8. *April 29, Newark Star-Ledger* – (National) **Man in \$5M ATM 'skimming' ring pleads guilty.** A Romanian man pleaded guilty April 29 to Federal charges for his role in a \$5 million ATM skimming ring where he and co-conspirators allegedly installed skimming devices on ATMs at banks in New Jersey, New York, Connecticut, and Florida, and transferred the stolen data onto blank ATM cards which were used to withdraw funds from customers' accounts. Officials stated that a total of 16 people were charged for their involvement and one suspect remains at large.

9. *April 29, WJW 8 Cleveland* – (Ohio) **Cleveland FBI asks for help identifying**

'breakdown lane bandit.' FBI officials and local police departments in Cleveland are searching April 29 for a man dubbed the "BDL Bandit" who is suspected of committing three bank robberies in the Cleveland area since March, including a PNC Bank branch, a First Merit Bank branch, and a US Bank branch. Authorities stated that the suspect is armed and believed to have an accomplice.

10. *April 29, Bergen County Record* – (New Jersey) **Police seeking Garfield bank robber who may be 'Count Down Bandit.'** Authorities are searching for a man suspected of robbing an M&T Bank branch in Bergen County, New Jersey, April 28. Officials stated that the suspect is believed to be the "Count Down Bandit," a man allegedly responsible for seven other bank robberies in Bergen and Passaic counties since July 2015.

12. *May 2, Southern California Press-Enterprise* – (California) **Pinyon Pines: 5-month-old girl dies in Highway 74 crash.** A single-vehicle crash that killed one person and injured two others May 1 forced officials to shut down Highway 74 in Riverside County for nearly five hours while crews investigated and cleared the wreckage.

13. *May 2, WTVF 5 Nashville* – (Tennessee) **Man in custody after threats made at DHL warehouse.** Fifty employees from a DHL-Exel distribution warehouse in Rutherford County were evacuated for several hours May 1 after a man allegedly called 9-1-1 dispatch and falsely stated one person entered the facility armed with a bomb while four others entered the building armed with handguns. Officials determined the building was safe and arrested one employee for making the false report and for unlawful use of 9-1-1 services.

15. *May 2, WKOW 27 Madison* – (Wisconsin) **All lanes of I-39/90 back open after shooting incident.** All lanes of Interstate 39 reopened May 2 after a highway shooting accident shut down southbound lanes of Interstate 39 near DeForest, Wisconsin for more than two hours May 1.

16. *May 1, WRC 4 Washington, D.C.* – (Washington, D.C.) **CSX: Train derails in DC, leaks 3 different chemicals.** Rhode Island Avenue-Brentwood Metro Station was closed for several hours May 1 and Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (Metro) service on the Red Line was suspended after a CSX freight train carrying 15,500 gallons of chemicals derailed, sending 14 cars off the tracks and spilling its load of ethanol, sodium hydroxide, and calcium chloride. The train derailment also ruptured an underground gas line, forcing officials to turn off gas for the surrounding area.

17. *April 30, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (National) **Greencore USA recalls meat, poultry products produced without benefit of inspection.** Greencore USA, Inc., issued a recall April 29 for approximately 1,341 pounds of its meat and poultry products sold in 6 variations after Federal inspection program personnel discovered that the products were produced without the benefit of Federal inspection and outside of inspection hours following a review of establishment records during verification activities. There have been no confirmed reports of adverse reactions and the products were shipped to distributors for retail sale in seven States.

18. *April 30, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (National) **Foster Poultry Farms recalls poultry products due to possible foreign materials contamination.** Foster Poultry Farms issued a recall April 29 for approximately 220,450 pounds of its Breast Nuggets – Nugget Shaped Breaded Chick Breast Patties with Rib Meat products sold in 5-pound packages and its Fully Cooked Breast Nuggets – Nugget Shaped Chicken Breast Patties with Rib Meat Fritters products sold in 10-pound boxes due to a potential contamination with blue plastic and black rubber pieces following several consumer complaints regarding extraneous materials found in the products. There have been no confirmed reports of adverse reactions and the items were shipped to distributors in Alaska, Arizona, California, Utah, and Washington.

19. *April 30, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **The Republic of Tea issues voluntary recall of Organic Turmeric Ginger Green Tea.** The Republic of Tea issued a voluntary recall April 29 for its Organic Turmeric Ginger Green Tea products sold in four variations due to a potential Salmonella contamination after a supplier notified the company that one lot of its organic ginger ingredient may be contaminated with Salmonella following a report from another customer. The company stated that the recall is a precautionary measure and no illnesses have been reported in connection with the products that were sold at specialty retailers nationwide.

20. *April 29, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (Florida) **Bakery Express of Central FL., Inc. issues allergy alert on undeclared peanuts in 7-Eleven Fresh To Go Cookies.** Bakery Express of Central FL., Inc., issued a recall April 29 for its 7-Eleven Fresh To Go Sugar Cookie made with M&M chocolate candy, and Fresh To Go Peanut Butter Cookie products due to the presence of undeclared peanuts after a supplier notified the company that three different pre-bagged dry cookie mix bases used in producing the cookies were potentially contaminated with peanuts. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to 7-Eleven convenience stores in Florida.

21. *April 29, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Making It a Lifestyle, L.L.C. issues a voluntary nationwide recall of 3rd Degree, Black Gold X Advanced, and Black Label X due to presence of undeclared sibutramine and sildenafil.** Making It A Lifestyle, L.L.C. issued a voluntary recall April 29 for all lots of its 3rd Degree, Black Gold X Advanced, and Black Label X products due to the presence of undeclared sibutramine and sildenafil after laboratory analysis revealed that the 3rd Degree and Black Gold X Advanced products contained sibutramine, and that the Black Label X products contained sildenafil. The products were distributed via the Internet nationwide.

22. *April 29, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (Missouri; South Carolina; Texas) **7-Eleven issues allergy alert on undeclared peanut in fresh fully baked chocolate chunk, sugar and oatmeal raisin cookies.** 7-Eleven, Inc., issued a recall April 28 for its fully baked chocolate chunk, sugar, and oatmeal raisin cookie products produced by CSM Bakery Solutions frozen cookie pucks due to undeclared peanuts after a supplier notified the company that the products may contain peanut allergens. The company removed the products which were distributed to 7-Eleven stores in Missouri, South Carolina, and Texas.

23. *May 1, Associated Press* – (Georgia) **Boil water advisory issued for large part of Atlanta.** Heavy storms April 30 caused more than 100 power outages, impacted more

than 6,000 customers, and knocked out power at 2 water pumping stations, forcing officials to issue a boil water advisory May 1 for several parts of Atlanta. The Department of Watershed Management was flushing the system as a precaution to ensure no contamination in the water system.

24. *May 1, WWL 4 New Orleans* – (Louisiana) **LaPlace under boil water advisory.** Officials issued a boil water advisory May 1 for residents of LaPlace, Louisiana, after a motorist hit a main water line near Woodland Water Plant and caused a water main break. Crews temporarily repaired the water line, but officials advised customers to refrain from using the water system.

31. *May 2, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Serious flaw found in “PL/SQL Developer” update system.** Allround Automations released a new version of its PL/SQL Developer product after an application security consultant discovered that version 11.0.4, and earlier versions, used Hyper Text Transfer Protocol (HTTP) updates and did not validate the downloaded file’s authenticity, allowing a man-in-the-middle (MitM) attacker to replace the authentic Uniform Resource Locator (URL) with another URL that leads to a malicious file, as well as replace the download link with an arbitrary command that will execute in a user’s context during the PL/.SQL Developer update process.

32. *May 2, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Microsoft adds Nano server to bug bounty program.** Microsoft reported April 29 that it is offering large monetary rewards for vulnerabilities found in the Nano Server installation option of its Windows Server 2016 Technical Preview 5 and all subsequent releases after stating that the product was ideal for a compute host for Hyper-V virtual machines, a storage host for Scale-Out File Server, a Domain Name System (DNS) server, and a host for cloud apps, and if infected, could pose severe damages to each component.

33. *May 1, Softpedia* – (International) **Valve fixes steam crypto bug that exposed**

- passwords in plaintext.** Valve updated its Steam gaming client after a security researcher found that the lack of Message Authentication Code (MAC) in its application's crypto package allowed an attacker to carry out man-in-the-middle (MitM) attacks, enabled victims to become Valve Anti-Cheat (VAC) banned, or potentially exposed users' passwords in plaintext.

34. *May 1, Softpedia* – (International) **Decrypter for Alpha ransomware lets victims recover files for free.** A team of security researchers discovered and decrypted a new ransomware version called Alpha ransomware, which demands targets pay \$400 worth of iTunes gift cards to decrypt encrypted files by using AES-256 encryption to lock files, change each file's name with the .encrypted extension, add a ransom note in text format in each folder, change the target's wallpaper, and delete itself to avoid detection. Researchers found a weakness in the ransomware's encryption routine and released a decrypter to help victims retrieve locked files.

35. *April 29, Softpedia* – (International) **Crooks deliver android malware via Fake Google Chrome updates.** Security researchers from Zscaler discovered that cyber criminals were distributing fake Google Chrome update packages disguised as Android application package (APK) files affecting Android users to steal a target's credit card information, terminate the device's antivirus software, monitor incoming and outgoing calls and Short Message Service (SMS) messages, as well as start or end calls, among other actions. Attackers were seen using large collections of domain names to host the malware, which were changed a regular intervals.

36. *April 29, Softpedia* – (International) **BPlug trojan hides in Chrome Extensions and Spams your Facebook friends.** Security researchers from Dr. Web discovered that over 12,000 users were infected with the trojan titled, Trojan.BPlug.1074 or BPlug after the bug was seen hiding in Google Chrome's extensions and collecting a target's Facebook user identifier (UID) and their cross-site request forgery (CSRF) token to execute actions on a Facebook users' behalf. Attackers can send out malicious links disguised as YouTube videos to Facebook friends in an aim to increase the trojan's infection.

37. *April 29, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Malware leverages Windows "God Mode" for persistency.** Researchers from Intel Security reported that the malware dubbed, "Dynamer" was abusing the Microsoft Windows Easter Egg called "God Mode" function to gain persistency on an infected machine by installing itself into a folder inside the %AppData% directory, creating a registry run key, and executing its

capability normally. Researchers advised affected users to terminate the malware's process via Task Manager and run a specially crafted command from the command prompt.

38. *May 1, WPIX 11 New York City* – (New York) **Massive fire engulfs Orthodox Cathedral in Manhattan hours after thousands attend services.** A 4-alarm fire May 1 at the Serbian Orthodox Cathedral in Manhattan destroyed the facility and prompted more than 168 firefighters to remain on site for several hours containing the incident. The cause of the fire was unknown and no injuries were reported.

Fire crews remained on site for several hours containing the incident and no injuries were reported.

Seven employees were evacuated and four people were sent to area hospitals.

42. *April 29, WFAA 8 Dallas* – (Texas) **Three units damaged in 3-alarm apartment fire.** A 3-alarm fire at the Carrolton Park Apartments severely damaged 3 apartment units and prompted about 60 firefighters to contain the incident after the fire began in a kitchen when a maintenance worker accidentally torched the wall insulation while conducting hot work repair on a water line. One person was injured.

43. *April 29, WMTW 8 Poland Spring* – (Maine) **Power plant pays \$300,000 after rust spews on cars.** The Calpine Corporation plant in Westbrook, Maine, is paying \$300,000 to detail 300 vehicles April 29 after the plant restarted and sent particles of rust up the boil exhaust stacks, which piled onto vehicles parked in a nearby parking lot in early April. The Maine Department of Environmental Protection reported that the residue posed no health risks, but could cause damage to a vehicle's paint and windows.
