1. *May 21, Champaign-Urbana News-Gazette* – (Illinois) **Three agencies battling blaze at west Champaign foundry.** Authorities are investigating a 3-alarm fire at Alloy Engineering & Casting Co., that prompted 3 fire departments to remain on site for over 5 hours May 20 – May 21 to contain the blaze. No injuries were reported.

2. *May 20, TheCarConnection.com* – (International) **2012-2016 Fiat 500 recalled for transmission problems: 80,000 cars affected.** Fiat Chrysler Automobiles issued a recall May 20 for 39,217 of its model years 2012 – 2016 Fiat 500 vehicles equipped with manual transmissions sold in the U.S. after it was discovered that excessive clutch travel can damage the vehicle’s transmission, thereby limiting a driver’s ability to change gears. The recall affects 7,834 vehicles in Canada, 7,155 in Mexico, and 26,268 elsewhere.

3. *May 19, Monroe County Republic-Times* – (Illinois) **Columbia man guilty of federal bank, loan fraud.** A former employee at Scott Credit Union in Illinois pleaded guilty May 19 to Federal charges after he defrauded the bank out of \$12 million by embezzling credit union funds, creating fraudulent loans, paying loans through the misapplications of funds from other loans, and increasing credit limits on loans that did not have board approval, among other fraudulent actions from November 2005 – December 2014. Officials stated the man also knowingly submitted a fraudulent report to the bank for the third quarter of 2014 that misstated loan balances, omitted loan amounts, and severely underreported loans.

4. *May 23, Associated Press* – (California) **California bus crash leaves 20 injured, 6 seriously.** A 16-mile stretch of State Route 330 in Highland, California, was shut down for several hours May 22 after a shuttle bus overturned on the highway when it made contact with another vehicle, leaving 14 people with minor injuries and 6 others with serious injuries.

5. *May 23, Corvallis Gazette-Times* – (Oregon) **Philomath man killed in Highway 99 accident.** A fatal 2-vehicle crash left one driver dead May 22 after he crashed head-on into another vehicle forcing the closure of Highway 99W in Benton County, Oregon, for approximately 4 hours.

6. *May 22, KOKI 23 Tulsa* – (Oklahoma) **I-44 lanes reopened after truck spills apples, peaches on highway.** Westbound lanes of Interstate 44 in Tulsa were closed for approximately 5 hours May 22 after a semi-truck blew a tire and hit the center median, causing its load of apples and peaches to spill across the roadway.

7. *May 20, Santa Barbara Noozhawk* – (California) **Highway 166 reopens after big-rig crash causes closure east of Santa Barbara.** Highway 166 near Santa Barbara was closed for more than 3 hours May 20 following an accident involving a semi-truck and another vehicle that left one person injured.

8. *May 23, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Papa John's Salad and Produce recalls Oriental Salad with Sesame Ginger Dressing due to possible Listeria monocytogenes contamination.** Papa John's Salad and Produce Inc., issued a voluntary recall May 21 for its Oriental Salad with Sesame Ginger Dressing products due to a possible Listeria monocytogenes contamination after the company's sunflower kernel supplier, SunOpta, Inc., recalled the kernels due to Listeria contamination. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to four retail chains in eight States.

9. *May 20, Wall Street Journal* – (National) **FDA approves new nutrition panel that highlights sugar levels.** The U.S. Food and Drug Administration approved a new

“Nutrition-Facts” label May 20 that will list the number of grams of sugar that were added to packaged food and beverage products by manufacturers, and what percentage of the recommended daily maximum the numbers represent as part of an effort to pressure companies to make less-fattening products and to help consumers avoid health problems. The new labels must also declare the amounts of potassium and vitamin D, and include larger and easier to read serving size and caloric intake data.

10. *May 20, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Dakota Style Foods, Inc., recalls product because of possible health risk.** Dakota Style Foods, Inc., expanded a previous recall May 20 to include 15,158 cases of its sunflower kernels products due to a potential *Listeria monocytogenes* contamination after the company’s sunflower kernel supplier, SunOpta, Inc., provided the firm with kernels that had been recalled due to *Listeria* contamination. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to 34 customers nationwide and through retail outlets.

11. *May 20, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (Mississippi) **The Caramel Factory, LLC issues an allergy alert.** The Caramel Factory, LLC issued a recall May 19 for select types of its candy and baked goods products due to misbranding and undeclared peanuts, tree nuts, soy, milk, and wheat after it was discovered the products were distributed in packaging that did not declare the allergens. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed from the company’s retail store in Mississippi.

12. *May 20, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **TreeHouse Foods expands voluntary product recall due to possible health risk.** TreeHouse Foods, Inc., expanded a previous recall May 19 to include an additional 100 of its products containing sunflower kernels due to a potential *Listeria monocytogenes* contamination after the company’s sunflower kernel supplier, SunOpta, Inc., recalled the kernels due to *Listeria* contamination. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed through retail stores nationwide.

13. *May 23, Lower Hudson Valley Journal News* – (New York) **High lead levels found in**

- Briarcliff schools' water.** Five water sources at Todd Elementary School and one at Briarcliff High School in New York were shut off May 20 after district-wide testing revealed high levels of lead that exceeded the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's "action level." The fountains will remain off until further testing is conducted.

14. *May 22, KSBW 8 Salinas* – (California) **Soledad wildfire spreads nearly 4,000 acres; 20 percent contained.** Crews reached 20 percent containment May 22 of a 4,000-acre wildfire burning off Metz Road south of Soledad, which prompted the evacuation of parts of Pinnacles National Park.

15. *May 21, WVEC 13 Hampton* – (Virginia) **Statewide Virginia DMV outage resolved, offices to open Monday.** A Statewide technical outage prompted the closure of all Virginia DMV customer service centers May 21 after online transactions became unavailable. Officials reported that the issue was repaired and that the centers will open as scheduled May 23.

16. *May 22, Albuquerque Journal* – (New Mexico) **20 inmates charged in 'riot' at BernCo jail.** Three guards at the Bernalillo County Metropolitan Detention Center in Albuquerque suffered minor injuries May 22 after they were attacked by three inmates in a day room while at least 17 other inmates used sheets and towels to cover security cameras and block doors. The inmates surrendered after Community Emergency Response Team officers arrived, and all 20 inmates involved in the attack are facing charges.

17. *May 23, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Exploit for recently patched flash flaw added to Magnitude EK.** A French security researcher discovered that attackers were integrating the Magnitude exploit flaw against previously patched Flash Player 21.0.0.213 installations to potentially deliver various pieces of malware, including Locky and Cerber ransomware. The exploit was not fully implemented in Magnitude and researchers advised users to be cautious of the exploit.

18. *May 21, Softpedia* – (International) **Ransomware adds DDoS capabilities to annoy other people, not just you.** Security researchers from Invincea reported that the Cerber

ransomware was discovered to have a new payload capability to launch network packets to a network subnet, which is a specific capability to distributed denial-of-service (DDoS) botnets. The ransomware was detected by 37 out of the 57 antivirus engines and spreads via weaponized rich text format (RTF) files.

19. *May 21, Softpedia* – (International) **Crooks used SQL injections to hack Drupal sites and install fake ransomware.** Chief executive officer (CEO) and co-founder of Forkbombus Labs reported that attackers were leveraging a structured query language (SQL) injection vulnerability in Drupal 7.x installations prior to version 7.32 content management system (CMS) platform to compromise Web sites and install Web-based ransomware by scanning the Drupal site version and leveraging the flaw to break into the affected Web sites and change the admin user's password.

20. *May 23, Detroit News* – (Michigan) **5 plead guilty in MotorCity Casino cheating scheme.** Michigan State Police charged five of seven suspects May 23 for their alleged roles in a gambling activities scheme to steal funds from the MotorCity Casino in Detroit following a 2014 investigation which revealed one suspect, a former card dealer at the casino, along with six outside co-conspirators agreed to make payouts or not collect on lost bets on the Texas Hold'em game.

21. *May 23, Minneapolis Star Tribune* – (Minnesota) **Fire damages restaurant, coffee shop near Lake Calhoun.** A May 22 fire damaged a Noodles & Company restaurant and an adjacent Caribou Coffee outlet in Minneapolis, Minnesota following a two-alarm blaze which began in the back area of the restaurant. No injuries were reported and the Noodles & Company restaurant was closed until further notice due to severe smoke damage.
