1. *June 7, TheCarConnection.com* – (National) **2015 – 2016 Land Rover Discovery Sport recalled to fix exterior lighting.** Jaguar Land Rover Limited issued a recall June 7 for 14,731 of its model years 2015 – 2016 Land Rover Discovery Sport vehicles sold in the U.S. due to a problem in the vehicles’ exterior lighting systems where the license plate illumination lamp, supplied by Hella KGaA Hueck & Co., may fall out, making it difficult for other drivers to identify the vehicle at night.

2. *June 6, U.S. Department of Justice* – (Kansas) **Kansas tax return preparer pleads guilty to stealing more than \$2 million in government funds.** A Kansas tax return preparer pleaded guilty June 6 to Federal charges after he obtained over \$2 million in fraudulent tax returns from the U.S. Internal Revenue Service (IRS) by filing false tax returns in the names of his clients without their knowledge and directing the refunds into bank accounts he controlled.

3. *June 8, WJW 8 Cleveland* – (Ohio) **Highway reopens after truck hits median, leaks fuel.** State Route 8 in Akron, Ohio, was closed for several hours June 8 while HAZMAT crews worked to clear a fuel spill after a semi-truck hit the median wall and spread debris on the roadway, causing flat tires to several other vehicles.

4. *June 8, Fox News* – (California) **Onion truck crash closes California highway.** Crews worked for more than 4 hours June 7 to clean an onion spill from a three-vehicle accident that closed Interstate 10 in Yucaipa, California. The driver was sent to an area hospital for non-life threatening injuries.

5. *June 7, KSBW 8 Salinas* – (California) **Highway 1 in Monterey reopens after fatal crash.** A fatal single-vehicle crash left one person dead and closed southbound lanes of Highway 1 in Monterey, California, for several hours June 7 after the driver lost control, veered off the highway, and crashed into trees.

6. *June 7, Denver Post* – (Colorado) **Interstate 70 westbound reopens in Golden after deadly crash.** A four-vehicle crash involving a semi-truck and three other vehicles forced the closure of Interstate 70 in Golden, Colorado, for 4 hours June 7 while officials investigated the scene and crews worked to remove the wreckage. One driver was killed in the accident and another was sent to an area hospital.

7. *June 7, KMVT 11 Twin Falls; KSVT 14 Twin Falls* – (Idaho) **Multi-vehicle fatality crash leads to highway being shut down, all lanes now open, names released.** A dust storm in Hazelton, Idaho, June 6 caused a multi-vehicle crash that prompted the closure of Interstate 84 for approximately 10 hours overnight June 6 – June 7, killed one person, and sent seven others to nearby hospitals with various injuries.

8. *June 6, WTVA 9 Tupelo* – (Mississippi) **Train tracks in Amory expected to reopen at midnight.** BNSF Railway officials closed the main rail line through Amory, Mississippi, June 6 after 5 of 40 cars carrying automobiles and the locomotive derailed. No injuries were reported and no hazardous materials were spilled.

9. *June 7, WTMJ 4 Milwaukee* – (Wisconsin) **5 injured, hundreds evacuated after chemical spill at Gehl Foods in Germantown.** A chemical spill at Gehl Guernsey Farms in Germantown, Wisconsin, June 7 caused 5 people to be sent to area hospitals and prompted the evacuation of hundreds of workers while authorities worked to clean the spill after a contractor inadvertently mixed acid and sodium chloride in a tank. Fire crews flushed the building, completed air monitoring checks, and are working to

restore normal operations at the facility.

10. *June 7, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Frito-Lay issues voluntary recall of select Rold Gold Tiny Twists, Rold Gold Thins, Rold Gold Sticks and Rold Gold Honey Wheat Braided due to potential undeclared peanut allergen.** Frito Lay, Inc., issued a voluntary recall June 6 for select lots of its Rold Gold Tiny Twists, Rold Gold Thins, Rold Gold Sticks, and Rold Gold Honey Wheat Braided products due to a potential undeclared presence of peanuts after the company's flour supplier recalled certain lots of the flour it provided the firm due to undeclared peanut residue. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to retail stores and via foodservice and vending customers nationwide.

11. *June 7, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **The Body Shot Bar issues voluntary nationwide recall of Step 2 due to undeclared Sibutramine.** The Body Shot Bar issued a voluntary recall June 7 for all lots of its Step 2 60 gold capsule dietary supplement products after Federal sampling and testing revealed the presence of unapproved Sibutramine in the products. No adverse reactions have been reported and the products were distributed via the company's Web site nationwide.

12. *June 7, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Herr Foods Inc., announces voluntary recall of Waffle Works Brand of 4 oz. Double Chocolate Waffle Sandwiches due to undeclared milk: allergy concern for those with milk allergy.** Herr Foods Inc., issued a voluntary recall June 6 for its Waffle Works Brand Double Chocolate Waffle Sandwiches products sold in 4-ounce packages due to mislabeling and undeclared milk after a quality assurance review of the ingredient declaration revealed that milk was not included on the product's ingredient and allergen statement. No illnesses have been reported and the products were shipped to retail stores, distributors, and vending sales nationwide.

13. *June 7, Food Safety News* – (Texas) **Possible Salmonella outbreak traced to Texas restaurant.** Ajuua's Mexican Restaurant in Odessa, Texas, shut down until further notice June 7 after 2 confirmed cases of Salmonella and 18 potential cases were linked to the restaurant. Health officials advised customers who recently ate at the restaurant and were experiencing Salmonella symptoms to consult their doctors and undergo testing for the bacteria.

14. *June 6, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (Indiana; Ohio) **Butterfield Foods, LLC. recalls Broccoli Salad Kit products due to possible Listeria contamination.** Butterfield Foods, LLC issued a recall June 3 for approximately 15,966 pounds of its

Butterfield Foods Custom Food Production Broccoli Salad Kit dressing products sold in 22 variations due to a potential *Listeria monocytogenes* contamination after the company's sunflower kernel supplier, SunOpta Inc., notified the firm that the kernels used in the dressing products were recalled due to possible *Listeria* contamination. There have been no confirmed reports of adverse reactions in connection with the products which were distributed to retail locations in Indiana and Ohio.

15. *June 8, Tampa Bay Reporter* – (Florida) **City of St. Petersburg discharging partially treated wastewater into Tampa Bay.** Tropical Storm Colin and the overflow of the Albert Whitted wastewater facility from processing wastewater for St. Pete Beach, Gulfport, and Treasure Island prompted the City of St. Petersburg to discharge partially treated wastewater from the plant directly into Tampa Bay June 7. City officials advised residents to avoid contact with water in the Tampa Bay area.

16. *June 7, WFSB 3 Hartford* – (Connecticut) **5 State park beaches closed.** The Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection closed the following five beaches June 7 due to high levels of bacteria as a result of storm water runoff: Chatfield Hollow in Killingworth, Indian Well in Shelton, Kettletown in Southbury, Wadsworth Falls in Middlefield, and Wharton Brook in Wallingford.

17. *June 7, WMBB 13 Panama City* – (Florida) **4500 gallons of raw sewage spilled into the bayou.** The Florida Department of Health announced June 7 that approximately 4,500 gallons of raw sewage was released from a manhole in Panama City and flowed into a storm drain that empties into Johnson Bayou. Officials advise people against swimming in all of Johnson Bayou and St. Andrews Bay until further notice.

18. *June 7, Associated Press* – (National) **FDA: people are overdosing on anti-diarrhea drugs.** The U.S. Food and Drug Administration warned doctors and patients June 7 that the primary ingredient in prescription Imodium and similar over-the-counter drugs intended to control diarrhea can cause potentially deadly heart problems and lead to overdose as abusers sometimes try to achieve heroin-like effects by taking massive doses. The administration stated that it is monitoring the issue and considering next steps.

20. *June 8, Associated Press* – (Georgia) **Air National Guard F-16 fighter pilots collide over Georgia, eject safely.** The Air National Guard reported June 8 that two South Carolina Air National Guard F-16 fighter pilots safely ejected after a midair collision June 7 over a military operating area in Jefferson County, Georgia, during a training mission. The two pilots were transported to an area hospital for observation and the incident remains under investigation.

23. *June 7, KTVU 2 Oakland; San Francisco Bay City News* – (California) **SFPD chase stolen ambulance to Treasure Island; pursuit ends in fiery crash.** Police apprehended a suspect near Treasure Island June 7 after the driver stole an ambulance while it was responding to a call at a hotel in San Francisco and crashed it into a cement guardrail on a Bay Bridge off-ramp. 24. *June 8, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Critical vulnerabilities patched with release of Firefox 47.** Mozilla released version 47 of its Firefox Web browser which patched more than a dozen flaws including a heap buffer overflow vulnerability that can be exploited when parsing Hypertext Markup Language 5 (HTML5) fragments, several memory safety bugs, a use-after-free flaw, a pointer lock permission bypass issue, and an out-of-bounds write flaw, among other vulnerabilities.

25. *June 7, Threatpost* – (International) **Uber pays researcher \$10K for login bypass exploit.** Uber Technologies Inc., recently patched a flaw in its Web site after a security researcher found a hacker could bypass the OneLogin system used for employee authentication and potentially compromise its internal network hosted on Atlassian's Confluence collaboration software. In addition, the security researcher stated that the flaw could be exploited to compromise a server that uses WordPress plugins.

26. *June 7, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Critical vulnerabilities patched in Android Mediaserver, Qualcomm drivers.** Google released security updates for its Android operating system (OS) which patched a total of 40 vulnerabilities in the platform including 15 security vulnerabilities in the Mediaserver component, 16 flaws in the Qualcomm drivers, and 9 bugs in other components and drivers.
