Top Stories

- Authorities offered a reward June 10 in exchange for information on a man dubbed the “Bad Eye Bandit” who is suspected of committing six bank robberies in Washington since January. – *KCPQ 13 Tacoma* (See item [2](#))

1. *June 12, Associated Press* – (Minnesota) **Regulators OK coal plant retirements in northern Minnesota.** The Minnesota Public Utilities Commission approved Minnesota Power’s plan June 7 to retire two older coal units at the Clay Boswell plant in Cohasset by 2022, and its plan to stop burning coal permanently by 2020 at the Taconite Harbor plant in Schroeder. The company stated that it will invest more in wind, solar, and natural gas.

The incident caused the closure of Highway 126 for nearly 5 hours.

4. *June 11, KBTX 3 Bryan/College Station* – (Texas) **One dead in Highway 6 wreck in College Station.** Southbound lanes of Highway 6 in College Station, Texas, were closed for nearly 4 hours June 10 following a single-vehicle accident that left one person dead after the driver lost control of the vehicle.

5. *June 11, KBTX 3 Bryan/College Station* – (Texas) **Driver killed after crossing into oncoming traffic on Highway 6 in Bryan.** Officials closed Highway 6 in College, Station for 5 hours June 10 while they investigated the scene of a 2-vehicle crash involving a vehicle that drove across the median and crashed into a semi-truck. One driver was killed while the semi-truck driver was injured.

6. *June 11, Associated Press* – (Minnesota) **Train derailment spills corn in southwest Minnesota.** Crews worked June 11 to clear the wreckage from a northbound BSNF train traveling to Willmar after the train derailed and spilled 23 cars of corn in Cottonwood, Minnesota, June 10. Officials were investigating the cause of the derailment.

9. *June 12, Food Safety News* – (Colorado) **Restaurant linked to E.coli outbreak closes for investigation.** Pho 75 in Aurora, Colorado, was closed until further notice June 10 while authorities investigate an outbreak of E.coli O157 that sickened four people after dining at the restaurant. Health officials advised anyone who has eaten at the restaurant and developed E.coli symptoms to seek medical attention.

10. *June 10, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Post Consumer Brands voluntarily recalls limited quantity of Great Grains Protein Blend – Honey, Oats**

- & Seeds cereal due to possible Listeria contamination.** Post Consumer Brands issued a voluntary recall June 3 for a limited quantity of its Great Grains Protein Blend – Honey, Oats & Seeds cereal products due to potential *Listeria monocytogenes* contamination after the company’s sunflower seed supplier, SunOpta, Inc., issued a recall for the seeds used in the products due to *Listeria*. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to retail stores nationwide.

11. *June 10, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Bounce USA recalls Apple Cinnamon Protein Punch Energy Balls because of possible health risk.** Bounce USA issued a voluntary recall June 10 for its Bounce Apple Cinnamon Protein Punch Energy Balls products sold in two variations due to potential *Listeria monocytogenes* contamination after the company’s sunflower kernel supplier, SunOpta, Inc., expanded a recall for the kernels used in the products due to *Listeria*. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to retail stores nationwide and through Amazon.com.

12. *June 10, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **NoGii voluntarily recalls Nuts About Berries Paleo Bars because of possible health risk related to sunflower seeds.** NoGii issued a voluntary recall June 10 for its Nuts About Berries Paleo Bars products due to potential *Listeria monocytogenes* contamination after the company’s sunflower seed supplier, SunOpta, Inc., issued a recall for the seeds used in the bar products due to *Listeria*. No illnesses have been reported and NoGii ceased the production and distribution of the products, which were shipped to retail stores nationwide and sold via the Internet.

13. *June 10, WTVC 9 Chattanooga* – (Tennessee) **Thanks to a pest, TN Dept. of Agriculture quarantines ash trees in Marion County.** The Tennessee Department of Agriculture placed Marion County under quarantine June 10 after the Emerald Ash Borer, which infests and destroys ash trees, was found in the Kimball area of the county. The quarantine includes 47 other counties in the State and prohibits the transportation of ash trees and ash tree products within Tennessee.

14. *June 13, Grand Rapids Press* – (Michigan) **3000+ gallons of untreated sewage leak into Grand Traverse Bay.** Traverse City officials issued a no-contact order for 4 Traverse City beaches and 2 waterways until further notice after approximately 3,000 gallons of untreated sewage leaked into Grand Traverse Bay June 11. The no-contact order applies to Clinch Park Beach, Sunset Park Beach, Bryant Park Beach, Traverse City Senior Center Beach, Kids Creek near Cedar Street, and Boardman River near

Wadsworth Street.

15. *June 11, Erie Times-News* – (Pennsylvania) **Lake City wastewater operator admits dumping pollution.** The former Lake City Borough wastewater treatment plant operator admitted June 10 that he failed to properly test and treat wastewater, dumped pollutants into Lake Erie tributary Elk Creek, and falsified records to conceal his actions from 2010 – 2012 after an investigation conducted by the Erie County Department of Health found the wastewater test results reported levels of pollutants that did not match the reports of the former treatment plant operator, which were submitted to the U.S. Department of Environmental Protection.

16. *June 10, Camdenton Lake Sun Leader* – (Missouri) **Swimming advisory issued for Grand Glaize Beach at Lake of the Ozarks State Park; no advisory for PB#1.** Officials from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources issued a swimming advisory June 10 for the Grand Glaize Beach at Lake of the Ozarks State Park in Missouri after test results of the beach water revealed levels of E. coli above the maximum limit. The beach is still considered open; however, officials advised residents against swimming as a spike in bacteria level could be due to renewed use of the beaches during the summer season.

17. *June 12, Missoula Missoulian* – (Montana) **Fire destroys University Villages apartment complex; students evacuated.** Dozens of University of Montana students and their families were displaced June 11 due to a fire at the University Villages apartment complex in Missoula that destroyed three apartments. The cause of the fire remains under investigation.

Officials lifted all evacuations June 11 and reopened Highway 89.

Officers used non-lethal bullets and tear gas to quell the riot before the inmates were transferred to other facilities and the facility was placed on lockdown.

24. *June 12, Softpedia* – (International) **Email server glitch exposes email addresses for 7,618 Let's Encrypt users.** The Let's Encrypt project, launched by Mozilla Foundation and the Electronic Frontier Foundation, reported June 11 that a glitch in its email newsletter system inadvertently exposed the email addresses of 7,618 users, which were 1.9 percent of the entire subscriber base. Let's Encrypt officials stated they will provide an incident report on what transpired.

25. *June 12, Softpedia* – (International) **Hackers find clever way to bypass Google's two-factor authentication.** A security researcher from Clearbit.com reported that a Google two-factor authentication, or 2FA, attack was active after discovering attackers were disguising themselves as Google notifications in order to trick victims into sending the 6-digit verification code associated with each email account.

27. *June 13, CNN* – (Florida) **Orlando shooting: what motivated a killer?** The FBI is investigating a mass shooting June 13 that took place at the Pulse nightclub in Orlando after an alleged Islamic State attacker opened fire, killed 49 people, injured at least 53 others, and caused a standoff with police while the attacker took several hostages June 12. The shooter was shot and killed by police after an armored vehicle and stun grenades were used to infiltrate the nightclub.
