1. *June 20, Grand Forks Herald* – (North Dakota) **Oil worker killed in fire, 3 others injured.** One worker was killed and three others were seriously injured after a fire ignited at a XTO Energy-owned oil well site in McKenzie County June 18. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

2. *June 19, WSFA 12 Montgomery* – (Alabama) **1,000 AL Power customers in central AL still without power.** The governor of Alabama declared a state of emergency effective through June 21 after more than 50,000 residents lost power across the State June 17 due to a severe storm that knocked down trees and power poles.

3. *June 17, Lower Hudson Valley Journal News* – (New York) **Indian Point 2 reactor back online after shutdown.** Entergy Corp., officials reported June 17 that its Indian Point 2 nuclear reactor was back online June 16 after the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission approved repairs, which caused the plant to remain shut down for more than 3 months. The repairs included the replacement of 278 bolts, the upgrading of certain equipment on the plant's cooling system, and other safety-related enhancements.

4. *June 17, TheCarConnection.com* – (National) **2006 – 2012 Kia Sedona recalled for corrosion troubles – again.** Kia Motors Corporation issued a recall June 17 for 97,884 of its model years 2006 – 2012 Sedona minivan vehicles sold in the U.S. due to a corrosion problem affecting the vehicles' suspension where the front lower control arms may be susceptible to corrosion from saltwater used to de-ice roadways that can lead to road noise and vibration, and potentially cause the arms to break, thereby making it difficult or impossible to control the vehicle. The vehicles were sold or registered in 27 States and Washington, D.C.

5. *June 17, South Florida Sun-Sentinel* – (Florida) **Man arrested in Boca Raton stole more than \$89K using ATM skimmers, police say.** A Colombian citizen was arrested in Boca Raton, Florida, June 16 after he allegedly installed 10 skimming devices at Chase Bank branch ATMs in Miami-Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach counties in order to steal the credit or debit card information of over 300 ATM customers and skim at least \$85,000 from the victims' accounts. The man was arrested when a Chase Bank investigator witnessed the man installing a skimmer and notified authorities.

6. *June 19, Janesville Gazette* – (Wisconsin) **One dead in Highway 59 crash.** Highway 59 in Edgerton, Wisconsin, were closed for more than 3 hours June 19 while officials cleared the scene of a two-vehicle, head-on crash that left one driver dead and sent two others to the hospital with serious injuries.

7. *June 17, WHO 13 Des Moines* – (Iowa) **Truck carrying 8,000 gallons of fuel rolls off Highway 5.** A portion of Highway 5 in west Des Moines was closed for more than 7 hours June 17 due to a rollover accident involving a semi-truck hauling 4,491 gallons gasoline and 3,498 gallons of diesel. The semi-truck leaked fuel into a nearby storm drain and HAZMAT crews worked to clear the scene.

8. *June 17, KFDM 6 Beaumont* – (Texas) **7-year-old one of two killed in double fatality on Hwy 105.** Two people were killed and two others were injured in a multi-vehicle crash that forced the closure of Highway 105 in Liberty County, Texas for approximately 6 hours June 17.

10. *June 17, Associated Press* – (West Virginia) **West Virginia man charged in I-81 wreck that killed one, injured at least a dozen.** Interstate 81 in Spring Mills, West Virginia, was closed for several hours June 17 due to a multi-vehicle accident involving two semi-trucks and 14 vehicles that left one person dead and 12 others injured. 11. *June 19, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (National) **GNP Company recalls chicken products due to possible foreign matter contamination.** GNP Company issued a recall June 18 for approximately 55,608 pounds of its chicken products sold in 18 variations due to potential contamination with extraneous materials after the company found sand and black soil in some of the products. The source of the contamination is under investigation and there have been no confirmed reports of adverse reactions in connection with the products which were shipped for food service and retail distribution nationwide. 12. *June 18, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (New Jersey; New York) **Red Bowl Food Corporation recalls wonton and dumpling products due to misbranding and undeclared allergens.** Red Bowl Food Corporation issued a recall June 17 for approximately 10,198 pounds of its Chicken & Shrimp Wonton, Pork Dumpling, and Pork and Shrimp Dumpling products due to misbranding and undeclared egg discovered by Federal in-facility personnel during routine label verification activities. There have been no confirmed reports of adverse reactions and the products were distributed to retail locations in New Jersey and New York. 13. *June 18, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (Arizona; California; Nevada) **Green Cuisine recalls Pesto Pasta Salad with Arugula sold in select Whole Foods Market stores due to potential health risk.** Green Cuisine issued a voluntary recall June 18 for its Pesto Pasta Salad with Arugula products due to potential *Listeria monocytogenes* contamination after the company's supplier, National Frozen Foods, notified the firms that the frozen green peas used in the products were recalled due to *Listeria*. 14. *June 18, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **National Frozen Foods Corporation recalls frozen green peas and frozen mixed vegetables because of possible health risk.** National Frozen Foods Corporation issued a voluntary recall June 17 for its Not-Ready-To-Eat frozen green peas products and frozen mixed vegetables

- products sold in 45 variations due to potential *Listeria monocytogenes* contamination after a sample tested by the company revealed that the products may be contaminated with *Listeria*. There have been no illnesses reported and the products were distributed to retail stores nationwide.

15. *June 17, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **GMJ Natural Products, Inc., issues allergy alert on undeclared whey protein in “Jugo Moringa Plus Antioxidant 32 fl oz Jug.”** GMJ Natural Products Inc., issued a recall June 17 for its “Jugo Moringa Plus Antioxidant” products due to undeclared whey protein after it was discovered that the label did not list the presence of whey protein in the products following a temporary breakdown in the company’s production and packaging processes. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to retail stores and through mail orders nationwide.

 16. *June 17, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Earnest Eats recalls Earnest Eats Dark Chocolate Almond Chewy Granola Bars because of possible health risk.** Earnest Eats issued a voluntary recall June 17 for select lots of its Earnest Eats Dark Chocolate Almond Chewy Granola Bars sold in four variations due to potential *Listeria monocytogenes* contamination after the company’s sunflower seed supplier, SunOpta, Inc., recalled the seeds used in the granola bar products due to *Listeria*. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to retail stores nationwide and via the Internet.

 17. *June 17, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (Ohio) **Gardner Pie Company issues allergy alert on Cheesecakes and Key Lime Pies sold between 4/11/16 and 6/14/16 due to potential undeclared peanut residue.** Gardner Pie Company issued a recall June 17 for its Cheesecakes and Key Lime Pies products due to undeclared peanut residue after the company’s supplier, Kellogg Company, recalled certain lots of its Graham Crumbs used in the cake and pie products, which was made with flour that has the potential to contain low levels of peanut residue. No illnesses have been reported and the products were sold at one of the company’s retail outlet stores in Akron, Ohio.

 18. *June 17, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Tippin’s Gourmet Pies, LLC announces the recall of Tippin’s Key Lime Pie for the presence of undeclared peanut residue due to supplier recall.** Tippin’s Gourmet Pies, LLC issued a voluntary recall June 17 for its Key Lime Pies products sold in 8-ounce packages due to undeclared peanut residue after the company’s supplier, Kellogg Company, recalled the graham cracker crumbs used in the pie products, which were made with flour that has the potential to contain low levels of peanut residue. No illnesses have been reported and the products were shipped to distributors in seven States.

19. *June 17, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **HP Hood LLC voluntarily recalls protein drinks from its Sacramento facility due to premature spoilage.** HP Hood LLC issued a recall June 17 for select lots of its Muscle Milk protein drink products sold in 13 variations due to potential premature spoilage after the company identified a potential packaging defect that may cause product spoilage during transport and handling. There have been no confirmed reports of adverse reactions.

20. *June 19, WCVB 5 Boston* – (Massachusetts) **Water contaminated with E. coli, Uxbridge DPW says.** The Department of Public Works in Uxbridge issued a water advisory June 18 after a water sample tested positive for E. coli bacteria June 17. The advisory prompted the closure of schools in the town and crews worked to flush the system.

21. *June 17, WCIV 36 Charleston* – (South Carolina) **2,000 gallons of sewage believed spilled into creek near Stono River in West Ashley.** Charleston Water System announced that it is monitoring and testing the water after about 2,000 gallons of sewage leaked into a small creek in West Ashley near the Stono River June 17.

22. *June 17, KING 5 Seattle* – (Washington) **Virginia Mason contacting 650 patients possibly exposed to hepatitis B.** Virginia Mason Medical Center in Seattle began notifying approximately 650 patients treated in the dialysis unit since February 2011 of inconsistent screenings for hepatitis B after a review found that the hospital had been conducting inconsistent screening for patients who came into the clinic and for every 30 days that they stayed in the hospital. Patients are being encouraged to contact their doctors for an additional screening.

23. *June 20, KSWB 69 San Diego* – (California) **3 firefighters injured in wildfire near border.** Crews reached 5 percent containment June 20 of a wildfire that burned about 1,900 acres, destroyed 4 outbuildings, and prompted officials to evacuate the community of Potrero in California. The fire also prompted the cancellation of classes at Mountain Empire Unified School District campuses until further notice.

24. *June 20, KTLA 5 Los Angeles* – (California) **Sherpa Fire in Santa Barbara County spreads to 7,893 acres; containment increases to 51%.** Crews reached 51 percent containment June 19 of the Sherpa Fire which has burned 7,893 acres in Santa Barbara County. The fire threatens approximately 270 structures and prompted officials to declare mandatory evacuations and issue a red flag warning through June 21.

28. *June 17, Softpedia* – (International) **Losses from business email scams reach a whopping \$3 billion.** The FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) reported that global Business Email Compromise (BEC) scams and campaigns were increasing with companies losing over \$3 billion in global scams and over \$960 million in U.S.-targeted scams from October 2013 – May 2016. Many targeted companies stated that the fraudulent actions occurred by hacking into the chief financial officer's or chief executive officer's email accounts.

29. *June 17, Minden Press-Herald* – (Louisiana; Texas) **Copper theft leads to two arrests.** The Webster Parish Sheriff's Office announced the arrest of two individuals June 17 in connection to an alleged spree where the pair stole copper wire from at least four cell phone tower sites in Louisiana, causing up to \$40,000 in damage at each site in order to re-sell the copper in Texas.
