Energy Sector

1. *June 28, Reuters* – (National) **Fire at Mississippi gas plant halts two U.S. Gulf Coast platforms.** The Destin gas pipeline system was shut down following a June 28 fire at an Enterprise Products Partners LP plant in Pascagoula, Mississippi. The pipeline's closure forced at least two offshore gas platforms in the U.S. Gulf of Mexico to halt operations until the pipeline resumes production.

Chemical Industry Sector

2. *June 28, WBKO 13 Bowling Green* – (Kentucky) **Tompkinsville chemical leak forces evacuation.** The Monroe County Emergency Management Director reported June 28 that dozens of people in Tompkinsville, Kentucky, were evacuated from homes and businesses for several hours due to a chlorine gas leak that released fumes from an area sewer treatment plant. Crews deemed the area safe once the gas levels receded.

3. *June 28, Allentown Morning Call* – (Pennsylvania) **Service restored at Susquehanna nuke plant after 3 weeks.** Talen Energy officials reported June 28 that its Unit 1 nuclear reactor at the Susquehanna Steam Electric Station in Luzerne County was back online June 27 following a 3-week shutdown while officials addressed a water leak inside the unit's containment structure. The Unit 2 nuclear reactor remained online during the outage and all radioactive leaks were contained.

Critical Manufacturing Sector

4. *June 29, Bloomberg News* – (International) **Toyota recalls 3.4 million cars over air bags, fuel tanks.** Toyota Motor Corp., issued a recall June 29 for a total of 3.37 million of its vehicles worldwide including 2.87 million of its model years 2006 – 2015 Prius hybrid and Corolla vehicles due to faulty fuel-emissions control canisters that can crack and cause leaks when the vehicles have full gas tanks. The recall also includes 1.43 million of its model years 2008 – 2012 Prius hybrid and Lexus CT vehicles due to faulty Autoliv Inc.-supplied curtain air bag inflators that may partially inflate in parked vehicles and injure occupants.

5. *June 28, U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission* – (National) **Polaris recalls Ranger ROVs due to fire hazard.** Polaris Industries Inc., issued a recall June 28 for 43,000 of its model years 2015 – 2016 Polaris Ranger 570 recreational off-highway vehicles (ROVs) due to a fire hazard where the vehicles can overheat during heavy engine loading, slow-speed intermittent use, or high outdoor temperatures and catch

fire. The recall was initiated after the company received seven reports of the vehicles catching fire.

6. *June 29, Associated Press* – (Texas) **Authorities: 3 train workers in Texas wreck presumed dead.** Three crew members are presumed dead and another is injured after two BNSF Railway freight trains collided 25 miles northeast of Amarillo June 28, causing several cars to erupt in flames and prompting officials to evacuate nearby residents. In response to the head on crash BNSF officials pledged to adopt technology called positive train control (PTC) that uses GPS, wireless radio, and computers to monitor train positions to automatically slow or stop trains in danger of colliding or derailling.

7. *June 29, NJ.com* – (New Jersey) **7 drivers charged in GWB toll cheat crackdown, cops say.** Seven drivers were arrested June 28 by Port Authority of New York and New Jersey on the George Washington Bridge in New Jersey including 5 who allegedly owe the agency a total of \$203,000 in toll fees after officials caught them in an early morning crack down.

8. *June 28, WWJ 97.1 FM Detroit* – (Michigan) **I-94 shut down for hours after garbage truck spills onto freeway.** Interstate 94 Westbound at M-39 in Allen Park was shut down for 7 hours June 28 after a semi-truck transporting garbage spilled some of its load and caught fire.

9. *June 28, Associated Press* – (Nevada) **Hoover Dam bridge closed nearly 5 hours by threat to jump.** The Hoover bypass bridge in Las Vegas was closed for nearly 5 hours June 28 while officials talked a woman out of jumping into the Colorado River. One police officer was also injured and hospitalized after being hit by a tour bus that was backing up during the traffic jam.

Food and Agriculture Sector

10. *June 27, U.S. Department of Justice* – (California) **District court enters permanent injunction against Sacramento tofu company and senior officers to stop distribution of adulterated and misbranded products.** California officials entered a consent decree of permanent injunction June 27 against Wa Heng Dou-Fu & Soy Sauce International Enterprises and its co-owners prohibiting the company from preparing, manufacturing, and distributing its soy products following a 2015 Federal inspection of the Sacramento facility which revealed that the firm failed to take precautions to ensure that production procedures did not contribute to contamination and failed to adequately clean and sanitize equipment and utensils, among other sanitary violations after testing found the presence of Salmonella Havana in the firm's packing and production areas. The injunction requires the firm to implement remedial measures, notify the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) of measures taken, and receive notification from the FDA that the measures are in compliance with Federal requirements in order to resume production.

11. *June 28, Jacksonville Journal Courier* – (Illinois) **Major leak patched, but next 48 hours crucial for water.** Officials reported June 28 that although crews patched a water main break in Jacksonville, Iowa, a boil water advisory will remain in effect for 48 hours for area residents until final testing of the water is completed.

12. *June 28, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **FDA approves Epclusa for treatment of chronic hepatitis C virus infection.** The U.S. Food and Drug Administration approved Epclusa June 28 to treat adult patients with chronic hepatitis C virus following extensive testing and evaluation which proved the drug's safety and effectiveness.

13. *June 28, Arizona Republic* – (Arizona) **Wildfire near Cordes Junction 50% contained; some residents return.** Crews reached 50 percent containment June 28 of

the Bug Creek Fire which has burned more than 1,000 acres near Cordes Lakes. The fire prompted the partial closure of Interstate 17 at Sunset Point.

16. *June 29, Softpedia* – (International) **Symantec products affected by multiple “as bad as it gets” vulnerabilities.** A security researcher from Google’s Project Zero initiative discovered several vulnerabilities in Symantec’s security products including buffer overflow flaws, memory corruption flaws, and a high-severity flaw that does not require user interaction, affects default configuration, and allows the software to run on the highest privilege levels possible due to a vulnerable code in ASPack. Attackers could exploit the vulnerabilities by sending an email with a malicious file or embed a malicious link inside the email, among other methods.

17. *June 28, Softpedia* – (International) **Alpine Linux 3.4.1 released with Linux Kernel 4.4.14 LTS, latest security fixes.** Alpine Linux project released its Alpine Linux 3.4.1 operating system (OS) which included security updates in its kernel packages and in its core components, as well as other improvements to several other applications within its systems.

18. *June 28, Softpedia* – (International) **LevelDropper Android app infected with autorooting malware.** Lookout researchers identified the LevelDropper app in the Google Play Store which hides malware capable of rooting the user’s device in order to install unwanted applications. Researchers also found two privilege escalation exploits and supporting package files such as busybox and SuperSU, which also have the ability

to root the device.

Authorities deemed the area safe after investigating the incident.
