1. *June 29, Whitehouse.gov* – (International) **Leaders’ statement on a North American climate, clean energy, and environment partnership.** The Canadian prime minister, U.S. President, and president of Mexico announced June 29 that they share a commitment to a competitive, low-carbon, and sustainable North American economy and society, and strive to achieve 50 percent clean power generation by 2025. The plan to achieve the goal of clean power will be accomplished through collaborating on cross-border transmission projects, enhancing trilateral collaboration on greening of government initiatives, and strengthening and aligning efficiency standards across all three countries, among a range of other initiatives.

2. *June 29, Reuters* – (Georgia) **Bonnell Aluminum shuts production at Georgia plant after blast.** Bonnell Aluminum in Newnan, Georgia, was shutdown June 29 until further notice following an explosion in the casting area of the plant that left five employees injured. The cause of the explosion remains under investigation and authorities stated no hazardous materials were involved.

3. *June 29, U.S. Department of Labor* – (Ohio) **Ohio auto parts manufacturer faces \$3.42M in fines after OSHA finds company willfully exposed temporary workers to machine hazards.** The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited Sunfield Inc., with 46 egregious willful, 8 serious, 2 willful, and 1 repeated safety violations and placed the company in its Severe Violator Enforcement Program June 29 after incidents in January and February where 2 workers were injured while operating machine presses, prompting an investigation at the Hebron, Ohio facility which revealed that the company failed to disconnect machinery from a power supply before maintenance and service, failed to adequately train workers on how to operate machine presses safely, and failed to install adequate safety guards on operating machinery, among other violations. Proposed penalties total \$3,426,900.

4. *June 29, U.S. Department of Labor* – (Wisconsin) **OSHA finds Waupaca company lacked proper precautions for using sulfur dioxide at its foundry core manufacturing, metal coating facility.** The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited Alliance Industries Inc., with nine serious and on other-than-serious safety violations June 27 after a February complaint investigation revealed that the company failed to conduct a process hazard analysis of its sulfur dioxide delivery system, failed to develop written procedures for operating the delivery system, and failed to conduct an annual inspection of energy control procedures, among other violations. Proposed penalties total \$41,580.

5. *June 29, Associated Press; Laramie Boomerang* – (Colorado; Wyoming) **6 arrested in fast-food credit card scheme in northern Colorado.** Six New York residents were arrested and indicted June 15 for allegedly using fraudulent credit cards to purchase more than \$10,000 worth of gift cards at McDonald's Corp., restaurants and other fast-food chain restaurants in Wyoming and Colorado. Authorities confiscated over 1,000 gift cards, a credit card reader, and a machine used for printing credit cards during the groups' arrest.

6. *June 30, WJAX 47 Jacksonville* – (Florida) **Train derailment in Jacksonville blocked intersection.** A CSX train carrying pulpwood derailed June 30 blocking the intersection of Airport Center Drive and North Main Street near Jacksonville International Airport for more than 5 hours.

7. *June 30, Chicago Sun-Times* – (Illinois) **Lanes reopened after semi rollover, fuel leak on Skyway.** All lanes of the inbound Chicago Skyway were closed for more than 6 hours June 30 while crews worked to clear the wreckage from an overturned semi-truck that leaked fuel onto an embankment on the South Side.

9. *June 29, WTVC 9 Chattanooga* – (Tennessee) **Two crashes, one deadly, close I-75 northbound near Ooltewah.** One person was killed and at least one other person was injured in two separate crashes involving several vehicles on northbound Interstate 75 near Chattanooga, prompting the interstate’s closure for several hours June 29. 10. *June 29, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Raw dough’s a raw deal and could make you sick.** The U.S. Food and Drug Administration’s Center for Food Safety and Applied Nutrition warned consumers June 29 against eating raw dough and batter after Federal testing confirmed that dozens of people across the country were sickened by a strain of Shiga toxin-producing E.coli O121 after consuming or handling raw dough made with General Mills, Inc., unbleached, all-purpose, and self-rising flours. 12. *June 30, Boston Herald* – (Massachusetts) **MGH hack exposes info of 4,300 patients.** Massachusetts General Hospital announced June 29 that the personal and medical information of 4,300 patients may have been exposed after its third-party vendor, Paterson Dental Supply Inc.’s, computer server was breached in February. Following the breach, the third-party vendor enhanced security protocols and began notifying all affected patients. 13. *June 30, KBOI 2 Boise* – (Idaho) **Brush fire scorches more than 1,000 acres in Idaho.** Crews worked June 30 to contain a fire that burned over 1,000 acres in the Boise Foothills and destroyed two structures.

14. *June 29, KCRA 3 Sacramento* – (California) **More than 2,000 structures threatened by Foresthill wildfire.** Crews reached 12 percent containment June 29 of the Trailhead Fire which has burned 1,000 acres near Foresthill, California, and threatens 2,600 structures. Mandatory evacuations were issued for several areas and 1,900 firefighters worked to contain the blaze.

15. *June 29, San Gabriel Valley Tribune* – (California) **San Gabriel Complex fires still burning, fire fighting crews downsized.** Officials planned to reopen Highway 39 June 29 after firefighters reached 96 percent containment of the Reservoir Fire and 88 percent containment of the Fish Fire which have collectively burned 5,399 acres in the San Gabriel Valley.

17. *June 30, Softpedia* – (International) **Google adds SEO spam notifications to Google analytics dashboard.** Google reported that it will be enhancing its security notifications for compromised Web sites by integrating the Safe Browsing application programming interface (API) into the Google Analytics dashboard, which will help detect malware and warn the Webmaster of a search engine optimization (SEO) spam on their Web site.

18. *June 29, Softpedia* – (International) **Android ransomware quadrupled in the past year.** Kaspersky Lab released a study which revealed that in 2016, Android ransomware infections grew 4 times the amount of previous years, increasing from 35,413 victims in 2015 to 136,532 victims in 2016. Security researchers stated the attacks were attributed to four Android ransomware strains including Small, Fusob, Pletor, and Svpeng.

19. *June 29, Hartford Courant* – (Connecticut) **Firefighter burned in Hartford apartment building fire, 12 displaced.** A Hartford apartment fire displaced 12 families and injured 1 firefighter June 29 after the fire started on the first floor and spread to surrounding floors. The incident was contained.

Officials shut down electrical power throughout the building and were investigating the cause of the pipe failure.

Officials believe cyber criminals may have been using the malware to steal customers' credit and debit card information since January 2016.
