1. *July 12, KOAT 7 Albuquerque* – (New Mexico) **Massive fire at San Juan County oil and gas rig.** WPX Energy, Inc., reported July 12 that around 30 oil storage tanks caught fire at an oil and gas rig in San Juan County, New Mexico, July 11, prompting drilling to stop in the area. Fire crews are allowing the fire to burn out before extinguishing the flames.

3. *July 11, U.S. Department of Justice* – (California) **Southern California man pleads guilty for his role as sales manager in fraudulent mortgage modification scheme.** An Orange County, California resident pleaded guilty July 11 for his role as the sales manager of an estimated \$9 million fraudulent mortgage modification scheme where he supervised dozens of telemarketers who made misleading statements and false promises to convince over 1,500 homeowners facing foreclosure to pay up to \$5,500 for the services of Rodis Law Group (RLG) and a successor entity, America's Law Group between October 2008 and June 2009 by falsely claiming RLG consisted of a team of attorneys experienced in negotiating lower interest rates and lowering principal balances, among other misrepresentations. Two co-defendants were also charged for their roles in the scheme.

4. *July 12, WFTV 9 Orlando* – (Florida) **Roadway reopened after overturned ketchup truck snarls I-95 traffic in Malabar.** Interstate 95 in Malabar, Florida was closed for more than 2 hours while crews worked to clear the wreckage from a semi-truck that overturned and blocked all traffic lanes July 11.

5. *July 11, KCNC 4 Denver* – (Colorado) **Cold Springs fire causes road, highway closures.** The Boulder Office of Emergency Management closed Boulder Canyon to all vehicle traffic for several hours July 11 while crews worked to contain the Cold Springs Fire. Officials also closed Highway 119 from Boulder to Nederland and closed south of Nederland to Highway 72.

8. *July 10, ABC News* – (Oklahoma) **Passenger on diverted Delta flight had elevated carbon monoxide levels.** Delta Flight 1817 from Atlanta to Denver was forced to make an emergency landing in Tulsa, Oklahoma July 10 after 12 passengers became sick due to elevated levels of carbon monoxide in their bodies. Officials re-screened passengers and placed them on another Denver-bound plane.

9. *July 11, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **General Mills voluntarily recalls a limited quantity of frozen Beyond Meat Vegetarian Indian Curry with Beyond Chicken.** General Mills, Inc., issued a voluntary recall June 30 for a limited quantity of its frozen Beyond Meat Vegetarian Indian Curry with Beyond Chicken products due to potential *Listeria monocytogenes* contamination after the company's frozen green pea supplier, National Frozen Foods, recalled the peas used in the products due to potential *Listeria* contamination. No illnesses have been reported and

the products were sold at Whole Foods Market Inc., stores nationwide.

10. *July 11, Kennebec Journal/Waterville Morning Sentinel* – (Maine) **Fire at Athens pellet mill halts production for a day.** A July 11 fire at the Maine Wood Pellet Co., facility in Athens, Maine, caused the plant to close until July 12 after the blaze started when a bearing failed inside a hopper, which travels from the roof to the second floor of the mill. No injuries were reported.

11. *July 11, Food Safety News* – (International) **General Mills pulls Betty Crocker mixes because of E.coli.** General Mills, Inc., issued a recall July 11 for its Betty Crocker Delights Super Moist Party Rainbow Chip Cake Mix, Betty Crocker Delights Super Moist Carrot Cake Mix, and Betty Crocker Super Moist Rainbow Bit Cake Mix products due to a 21-State outbreak of E.coli O121 linked to the consumption of raw dough or batter that has sickened 42 people since December 2015. The products were distributed to retailers, restaurants, and bulk buyers nationwide, and in Canada and China.

12. *July 11, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (National) **FSIS to begin posting location-specific food safety data online.** The Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) announced its plan July 11 to begin posting new levels of food safety data specific to slaughter and processing facilities in the U.S. on Data.gov as part of its Establishment-Specific Data Release Plan, which aims to allow customers to make more informed choices, motivate individual establishments to improve performance, and lead to industry-wide improvements in food safety. The FSIS will use the data sets to share information on the processes used at each facility, and release results for Listeria monocytogenes and Salmonella in ready-to-eat products and processed egg products, among other information.

14. *July 12, KDVR 31 Denver* – (Colorado) **Hayden Pass Fire grows to 12,000 acres in Fremont County.** Crews worked July 11 to contain the Hayden Pass Fire that grew to 12,012 acres in Fremont County, Colorado. Residents of more than 100 homes were ordered to evacuate along with Hayden Creek and Coaldale campgrounds and Cutty's Hayden Creek Resort.

15. *July 12, Los Angeles Daily News* – (California) **Sage Fire holds at 1,100 acres, 85 percent contained.** Crews reached 85 percent containment July 11 of the 1,100-acre Sage Fire burning near Santa Clarita. Three firefighters suffered heat-related injuries out of the 700 working to contain the blaze.

17. *July 12, Associated Press* – (Maryland) **Maryland's Montgomery County: 911 system outage investigated.** County officials are investigating after Montgomery County's 9-1-1 system failed for 2 hours overnight July 10 – July 11. Crews responded to two medical emergency calls involving two fatalities during the outage which was attributed to a malfunctioning heating and air conditioning system that caused the main power system and backup system to fail.

20. *July 12, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Code execution flaw plagues Intel Graphics Driver.** Security researchers from Cisco Talos discovered a local code execution vulnerability in Intel HD Graphics Windows Kernel Mode Driver version 10.18.14.4264 that could allow an attacker to run arbitrary code on a victims' system or cause denial-of-service (DoS) by sending a specially crafted D3DKMTEscape request to the Intel DH Graphics drivers. Microsoft removed the NTVDM subsystem from its Windows 8 to mitigate the attack, but researchers stated the mitigations were not foolproof.

21. *July 11, Softpedia* – (International) **Website takeover issue fixed in WordPress' most popular plugin.** A security researcher reported that the All in One SEO Pack WordPress plugin was plagued with a vulnerability that could allow attackers to store malicious code in the Web site's admin panel which could potentially enable attackers to control the Web site.

22. *July 11, SecurityWeek* – (International) **DoS flaw affects Symantec endpoint products.** Symantec released a patch that addressed a denial-of-service (DoS) vulnerability that affected its Norton Security's Portable Executable file scanning functionality as well as its Endpoint Protection products after a security researcher from Cisco Talos found an attacker could exploit the vulnerability by sending a victim a crafted file with a large SizeOfRawData field in a section header due to a flaw in the Client Intrusion Detection System (CIDS) driver, which can cause a system to crash when interacted with a specially-crafted portable executable (PE) file.

23. *July 11, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Backdoored Pokemon Go app infects Android devices.** SimilarWeb data and Proofpoint revealed that attackers were using a malicious version of the popular mobile gaming app, Pokemon GO via third-party portals to disseminate a remote access tool (RAT), dubbed DroidJack, to add Android application package (APK) files and allow attackers to gain full control over the Android users' mobile devices. DroidJack could allow an attacker to read and exit text messages, make phone calls, record audio, modify contacts, and connect to Wi Fi, among other actions.

24. *July 12, Bay Area News Group* – (California) **Fremont: Boy injured in 2-alarm apartment fire.** A Fremont apartment complex sustained about \$500,000 in damages July 11 after a two-alarm fire began in the kitchen on a first-floor apartment unit, injuring one resident and displacing eight others. Fire crews extinguished the blaze.
