Top Stories

- Federal officials reached a \$425 million settlement with Tesoro Corporation and Par Hawaii Refining, LLC July 18 resolving Federal Clean Air Act violations at 1 Par Hawaii refinery in Kapolei, Hawaii, and 5 Tesoro refineries in Alaska, Washington, Utah, North Dakota, and California. – *Associated Press*; *KING 5 Seattle* (See item [2](#))

- Crews worked overnight July 18 – July 19 to contain a sewage spill that released at least 1.5 million gallons of sewage into the Los Angeles River July 18, prompting the closure of all beaches in Long Beach. – *Los Angeles Times* (See item [10](#))

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Energy Sector

1. *July 18, Casper Star-Tribune* – (Wyoming) **Crash releases 10,000 gallons of crude near Rawlins.** Crews were working July 18 to clean up approximately 10,000 gallons of crude oil that spilled onto the Interstate 80 on-ramp near Walcott Junction, Wyoming, July 16 after a Peterbilt Motor Company commercial truck transporting the oil tank overturned, spilling the oil on the roadway.

2. *July 18, Associated Press; KING 5 Seattle* – (National) **Federal \$425 million settlement to reduce air pollution at 6 refineries.** The U.S. Justice Department and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency reached a \$425 million settlement with Tesoro Corporation and Par Hawaii Refining, LLC July 18 resolving Federal Clean Air Act violations at 1 Par Hawaii refinery in Kapolei, Hawaii, and 5 Tesoro refineries in Alaska, Washington, Utah, North Dakota, and California. Under the consent decree, the companies are required to spend nearly \$403 million to install emissions control equipment at the refineries, and Tesoro must spend approximately \$12 million for environmental projects in communities harmed by the pollution, as well as pay a \$10.45 million civil penalty.

3. *July 17, Houston Chronicle* – (Texas) **Pipeline leak near Exxon Mobil's Baytown plant prompts evacuations.** ExxonMobil Pipeline Company officials shutdown two chemical product pipelines at its Baytown, Texas facility July 17 after a pipeline leaked dilute propylene, a highly flammable chemical outside of the facility, prompting authorities to evacuate nearby residents and issue a shelter-in-place warning. Officials were investigating the source of the release.

4. *July 18, WPIX 11 New York* – (New York) **\$5K reward offered to stop ‘Americas Bandit’ after 6 Manhattan banks struck in almost a year.** Authorities offered a reward July 18 in exchange for information on a man dubbed “America’s Bandit” who is suspected of robbing six banks in New York City since September 2015, including a Chase Bank branch July 9. The suspect is considered armed and dangerous.

5. *July 19, Corvallis Gazette-Times* – (Oregon) **Head-on crash blocks Highway 20.** Highway 20 near Blodgett, Oregon, was closed for several hours July 18 while crews investigated the scene of a head-on collision that sent four people to area hospitals with serious injuries.

6. *July 19, WBIR 10 Knoxville* – (Tennessee) **Fatal crash closes right lane of I-75 North in Loudon County.** Northbound lanes of Interstate 75 in Loudon County, Tennessee, were closed for approximately 3 hours July 19 while crews worked to clear the wreckage from a two-vehicle crash involving a semi-truck that collided with another vehicle.

7. *July 18, Lower Hudson Valley Journal News*– (New York) **Hutch southbound reopens after potato truck crash.** The southbound lanes of Hutchinson River Parkway in Scarsdale, New York, were shut down for approximately 8 hours July 18 while crews worked to clear the wreckage after a semi-truck carrying potatoes struck an overpass, spilling debris on the roadway.

8. *July 18, WCIV 36 Charleston* – (South Carolina) **JetBlue flight makes emergency landing in Charleston.** JetBlue Flight 1131 en route to Fort Lauderdale, Florida, from Charleston, South Carolina, was forced to turn around and make an emergency landing in Charleston July 18 after the crew noticed smoke and an odor in the cabin. Officials were investigating the source of the smoke.

9. *July 18, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Theo Chocolate issues allergy alert on undeclared milk in Salted Almond 70% Dark Chocolate.** Theo Chocolate Inc., issued a voluntary recall July 18 for its Salted Almond 70% Dark Chocolate bars products sold in 3-ounce packages due to mislabeling and undeclared milk after the firm received a consumer complaint stating that the packaging contained a milk salted almond bar product, which contains milk. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to retail stores in 18 States.

Water and Wastewater Systems Sector

10. *July 19, Los Angeles Times* – (California) **Sewage spill in L.A. grows to 1.5 million gallons and forces closure of beaches in Long Beach.** Crews worked overnight July 18 – July 19 to contain a sewage spill that released at least 1.5 million gallons of sewage into the Los Angeles River July 18 after the top of a sewer pipe collapsed, prompting the closure of all beaches in Long Beach. Officials were testing ocean water samples to ensure there were no health risks to the public.

11. *July 18, WRDW 12 Augusta/WAGT 26 Augusta* – (Georgia) **Estimated 2.8 M gallons of diluted wastewater released into Butler Creek.** The Augusta Utilities Department announced July 18 that approximately 2.8 million gallons of diluted wastewater was released into Butler Creek in Augusta, Georgia, following heavy rainfall July 16. Officials were working to design and implement projects to remove significant amounts of rainwater from the wastewater collection system.

12. *July 18, WBFF 45 Baltimore* – (Maryland) **More than 750,000 gallons of sewage leak into Back River following Saturday storm.** More than 750,000 gallons of sewage leaked from the Essex Sewage Pumping Station into the Back River in Baltimore County, Maryland, July 16 after severe thunderstorms caused a power outage at the facility. Health officials were testing the water for bacteria at Rocky Point Beaches, Hart Miller Island, and Back River.

13. *July 18, WGRZ 2 Buffalo* – (New York) **Police: woman stole over \$100,000 from hospital.** A former employee at United Memorial Medical Center (UMMC) in Batavia, New York, was charged July 14 after she allegedly stole over \$100,000 in medical supplies while working at the medical center and sold them via an online auction Web site.

14. *July 19, KIFI 8 Idaho Falls/KIDK 3 Idaho Falls* – (Wyoming) **Cliff Creek Fire burning 6,700 acres.** Teton County Emergency Management issued an evacuation order July 18 for Granite Creek, including Granite Hot Springs and Campground, Jack Pine Summer Homes, and the Safari Club International due to the Cliff Creek Fire that has burned nearly 6,700 acres in Teton County, Wyoming.

15. *July 18, Grand Rapids Press* – (Michigan) **Power outage forces GRPS to cancel class at Lincoln campus.** Classes were cancelled July 19 at the Lincoln School and Lincoln Developmental Center in Grand Rapids, Michigan, due to a power outage that caused the air conditioning system at the schools to break following a physical plant issue July 18. Crews were working to restore power and repair the air conditioning system.

Information Technology Sector

16. *July 19, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Apple patches tens of vulnerabilities in iOS, OS X.** Apple Inc., released security updates for several of its products including OS X El Capitan version 10.11.6, which patched a total of 60 security bugs affecting components such as audio, FaceTime, and CFNetwork, among others after a Zscaler researcher discovered the flaws could allow unprivileged applications to access cookies stored in the Safari browser. Apple also released iOS version 9.3.3., resolving 43 vulnerabilities, one of which could allow an attacker with physical access to the device to abuse Siri and view private contact information, among other patches.

17. *July 18, Softpedia* – (International) **HTTProxy vulnerability affects CGI-based apps in PHP, Python, and Go.** A developer from Vend discovered CGI applications written in Hypertext Preprocessor (PHP), Python, and Go were plagued by a HTTProxy vulnerability after finding that CGI-based environments receiving incoming Hypertext Transfer Protocol Secure (HTTP) requests containing a “Proxy” header were dropping the header’s content in the HTTP_PROXY environment without sanitization, which could allow an attacker to force a vulnerable CGI-based application to use a malicious proxy for its outgoing HTTP requests, carry out Man-in-the-Middle (MitM) attacks, and poison servers.

18. *July 18, SecurityWeek* – (International) **CryptXXX now being distributed via spam emails.** Security researchers from Proofpoint warned that the CryptXXX malware was leveraging a spam email campaign after discovering that the emails, using subjects such as “Security Breach – Security Report #123456789,” were tricking users into activating malicious macros embedded in the emails’ document attachments, which were designed to download and install the ransomware when the victim interacted with them. 19. *July 18, Softpedia* – (International) **Steemit social network hacked, user funds stolen, DDoS attack ensued.** Steemit, a social networking platform, announced July 14 that an unknown attacker exploited the network’s browser-side vulnerabilities to steal \$85,000 worth of Steem Dollars and Steem Power from approximately 260 users’ funds after a user reported mysterious transactions that transferred funds from his account to another Bittrex account, a Bitcoin trading portal. Steemit’s servers also faced a distributed denial-of-service (DDoS) attack, prompting the network to bring down its servers for maintenance and service upgrades.
