1. *August 31, KOKI 23 Tulsa* – (Oklahoma) **Company recalls thousands of barrels of high-ethanol gasoline in Oklahoma.** Magellan Midstream Partners L.P. issued a recall August 31 for approximately 449,400 gallons of its gasoline delivered to retailers across the Oklahoma City metropolitan area August 23 – August 29 after it was discovered the gasoline contained as much as 30 percent ethanol, which can cause engines to run poorly or fail. 2. *August 30, TheCarConnection.com* – (National) **2013 Chevrolet Equinox and GMC Terrain recalled for windshield wiper woes.** General Motors issued a recall August 30 for 367,808 of its model year 2013 Chevrolet Equinox and GMC Terrain vehicles sold in the U.S. due to a problem in the windshield wiper modules where the ball joints may be prone to corrosion and wear, which could cause the modules to slip out of their sockets and the windshield wipers to stop working, thereby reducing visibility and increasing the risk of a crash. 3. *August 31, Orange County Register; Southern California City News Service* – (California) **‘Baggy Eyes Bandit,’ suspected in Anaheim Hills, Placentia bank robberies, has been arrested.** A man dubbed the “Baggy Eyes Bandit” was charged August 30 in connection with 2 bank robberies after he allegedly robbed 6 banks in Los Angeles, Riverside, San Bernardino, and Orange counties and attempted to rob a Citibank branch in Anaheim Hills, California, August 27. 4. *August 30, U.S. Attorney's Office, Northern District of Georgia* – (Georgia) **Investment advisor pleads guilty to stealing from clients.** A former investment adviser and operator of Gist, Kennedy & Associates pleaded guilty August 30 to defrauding more than 30 clients out of \$5 million by falsely informing investors that he would make conservative investments for investors in corporate bonds and other securities, while he used the funds for personal expenses, to fund ENCAP Technologies operations, and to pay other clients proceeds and dividends from the fraudulent investments. Officials stated the adviser also prepared and mailed false account statements to the investors that showed false investment returns in order to continue the fraud scheme.

## Transportation Systems Sector

5. *August 31, New York Daily News* – (New York) **Three people dead, eight injured in multi-vehicle crash on Long Island Expressway exit ramp in Queens.** Eastbound lanes of the Long Island Expressway in Queens, New York, were closed for more than 4 hours August 31 while crews worked to clear the wreckage from 2 multi-vehicle chain reaction crashes that left 3 people dead and 8 others injured.

6. *August 31, Monterey Herald; Santa Cruz Sentinel* – (California) **Fire closes Holman Highway.** Holman Highway near Samuel F. B Morse Gate in Monterey, California, was closed for several hours August 30 while fire crews worked to contain a small wildfire that started after a vehicle accident on Holman Highway near Haul Road caused a power line to drop, leaving more than 6,000 Pacific Gas & Electric Co. customers without power for a short period of time.

7. *August 30, WBMA 58 Birmingham* – (Alabama) **Troopers: 2 dead in wreck on Highway 78 in Walker County.** All westbound lanes of Highway 78 near Sipsey Road in Walker County, Alabama, were shut down for several hours August 30 while crews worked to clear the wreckage from a 2-vehicle crash involving a semi-truck and another vehicle that left 2 people dead and sent 1 other to an area hospital.

8. *August 30, WRDW 12 Augusta/WAGT 26 Augusta* – (South Carolina) **All lanes of I-20 EB back open after tractor-trailer crash.** Eastbound lanes of Interstate 20 in North Augusta, South Carolina, were closed for several hours August 30 while crews worked to clear the wreckage after 2 semi-trucks crashed and blocked both lanes. One person was transported to an area hospital with injuries.

9. *August 30, KEYC 12 Mankato* – (Minnesota) **Semi accident closes Highway 169 at North Star Bridge for over 3 hours.** Both northbound lanes of Highway 169 at the North Star Bridge in Mankato, Minnesota, were closed and southbound traffic on the bridge was restricted to 1 lane for more than 3 hours August 30 after a semi-truck jackknifed and crashed into the median, sending the driver to an area hospital with injuries. The cause of the accident remains under investigation.

10. *August 30, KOMO 4 Seattle* – (Washington) **2 women severely injured in Hwy. 2 crash near Sultan.** Highway 2 near Sultan, Washington, was closed for several hours August 29 following a head-on collision that left both drivers severely injured.

11. *August 30, Sioux Falls Argus Leader* – (South Dakota) **Man seriously injured in semi vs. car crash.** South Dakota Highway officials closed Highway 42 near Rowena for several hours August 30 while they investigated the scene of a 2-vehicle crash after a semi-truck rear-ended another vehicle and pushed it into a ditch. One person was transported to an area hospital and officials are investigating the cause of the crash.

12. *August 30, Buford Patch* – (Georgia) **Driver killed backing onto Interstate 85.** One person was killed and another was injured in a 2-vehicle crash that forced the closure of northbound lanes of Interstate 85 near Buford, Georgia, for nearly 3 hours August 29 while crews cleared the scene. The crash remains under investigation.

13. *August 31, Food Safety News* – (National) **Hepatitis A outbreak linked to smoothies spans 5 states; 51 sick.** Federal and State officials are investigating August 31 after a hepatitis A outbreak that has sickened more than 50 people in 5 States was potentially linked to frozen strawberries imported from Egypt that were served at Tropical Smoothie Café locations in Virginia. Tropical Smoothie removed the affected strawberries from all of its locations and health officials urged any recent customers to monitor themselves for symptoms of the illness.

14. *August 30, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Snyder's-Lance issues voluntary recall of 4oz Diamond of California Chopped Macadamia Nuts and 2.25oz Diamond of California Macadamia Halves & Pieces because of possible health risk.** Snyder's-Lance, Inc., issued a voluntary recall August 30 for its Diamond of California Chopped Macadamia Nuts and Diamond of California Macadamia Halves

and Pieces products due to potential Salmonella contamination after testing revealed that a package of the chopped macadamia nut products contained Salmonella. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to retail stores nationwide.

15. *August 30, Salinas Californian* – (California) **Fire destroys Monterey Mushrooms warehouse.** The Monterey Mushrooms Inc., warehouse in Royal Oaks, California, was considered a total loss August 30 following a fire at the facility. No injuries were reported and the cause of the fire remains under investigation.

16. *August 30, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Ton Shen Health/Life Rising expands recalls of “DHZC-2 Tablet” to all lots purchased before August 24 2016 because of possible health risk** Ton Shen Health/Life Rising Corporation expanded a previous recall August 30 for its DHZC-2 Tablets sold in 1.6-ounce bottles after product samples were found to contain elevated levels of lead. Federal officials are investigating six cases of adverse reactions in connection with the products which were sold in retail stores and distributed through mail orders nationwide.

17. *August 30, SC Magazine* – (National) **87K affected in SCAN Health Plan breach.** SCAN Health Plan announced August 30 it is notifying approximately 87,000 members of a data breach after remote attackers, using legitimate employee credentials gained access to the contact sheets system and accessed the names, addresses, and Social Security numbers, among other personal information, of previous and current members between March 2016 and June 2016. Officials believe the stolen information was used for client development for an outside insurance agency.

18. *August 30, WUFT 5 Gainesville* – (Florida) **Buchholz High gets all clear after bomb threat.** Buchholz High School in Gainesville, Florida, was evacuated for several hours August 30 after receiving a bomb threat. Authorities deemed the area safe after no explosives were found.

19. *August 30, WBAL 11 Baltimore* – (Maryland) **14 Baltimore retailers indicted for \$16 million food stamp fraud.** A total of 14 retail store operators in Baltimore, Maryland, were charged in 9 separate indictments returned August 30 alleging that the operators received more than \$16 million in Federal payments for fraudulent U.S. Department of Agriculture Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) transactions by exchanging electronic benefit transfer (EBT) benefits for cash. The charges allege that the operators debited the funds from the EBT card in multiple transactions over a period of days or processed the transactions manually at another store in order to avoid detection.

20. *August 30, Los Angeles Times* – (California) **1,000-acre Bogart fire in Riverside County was caused by ‘juvenile activity’ near public park, officials say.** Officials reached 10 percent containment August 30 of the 1,000-acre Bogart Fire burning near Beaumont, California, which has destroyed at least 1 building, injured 1 firefighter, and prompted officials to issue a brief evacuation order for about 700 residents in rural communities in Riverside County.

21. *August 29, KFSN 30 Fresno* – (California) **Some evacuation orders lifted in Cedar Fire.** Crews reached 45 percent containment August 29 of the more than 29,000-acre Cedar Fire burning in Tulare County, California, which prompted officials to lift or downgrade evacuation orders for Posey, Idlewild, Manter Meadow, Pine Mountain Ranch, and Rainbow Ranch.

## **Information Technology Sector**

22. *August 31, SecurityWeek* – (International) **68 million exposed in old Dropbox hack.** Dropbox, Inc. began prompting password resets for more than 68 million users potentially exposed in a July 2012 data breach where user email addresses and hashed and salted passwords for Dropbox accounts may have been improperly accessed after a Dropbox employee’s password was stolen and used to access an employee account that contained a document containing the user information. Dropbox officials do not believe any account was improperly accessed during the breach.

23. *August 31, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Vulnerabilities found in CryptWare BitLocker enhancement tool.** CryptWare released CryptoPro Secure Disk 5.2.1 for BitLocker addressing two serious vulnerabilities, one of which can be exploited to

access a root shell at boot and execute arbitrary commands, as CryptoPro Secure Disk improperly blocks terminal access, and a second serious flaw that can be exploited to modify files on the system and bypass the verification process, which can be leveraged to backdoor the system and steal sensitive information such as domain credentials and BitLocker, among other information, due to inadequate verification mechanisms.

24. *August 31, Softpedia* – (International) **Unsophisticated Revenge RAT released online for free.** Security researchers discovered a malware coder named Napoleon released a new remote access trojan/tool (RAT), dubbed Revenge v0.2 online for free via underground hacking forums. Researchers found the RAT is able to access the user's Webcam, open a remote shell, initiate remote desktop sessions, interact with the victim's file manager, and manage operating system (OS) services, among other malicious actions.

25. *August 30, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Site of BitTorrent app "Transmission" again used to deliver OS X malware.** Security researchers from ESET reported that the official Website for the BitTorrent client, Transmission was being exploited to distribute an Apple Mac operating system (OS) X malware, dubbed OSX/Keydnep that steals the content of the OS X keychain and maintains a permanent backdoor on an infected system after finding that cybercriminals compromised the Transmission site and replaced the legitimate app with a malicious version, which was available for download as Transmission v2.92 between August 28 and August 29. Researchers stated users can determine if their systems are infected by checking if files associated with the malware are present on their system.

## Communications Sector

26. *August 30, U.S. Attorney's Office, Southern District of Florida* – (International) **Miami Gardens resident pleads guilty to participating in sophisticated international cellphone fraud scheme.** A Miami Gardens, Florida resident pleaded guilty August 29 for his role in an international cellphone fraud scheme where he and co-conspirators stole access to and fraudulently opened new cellphone accounts with the personal information of various U.S. residents, trafficked in nearly 11,000 cellphone customers' telecommunication identifying information, and reprogrammed the cellphones to

transmit thousands of international calls to countries with high calling rates, which were billed to the victims' compromised accounts. Officials reported that the scheme caused at least \$1 million dollars in losses.

27. *August 30, WVIT 30 New Britain* – (Connecticut) **Manchester residents return to apartments after crew hit gas line.** Residents from 22 apartment units at Squire Village in Manchester, Connecticut, were evacuated for 2 hours August 30 after construction crews struck a 2-inch gas line. No injuries were reported and crews were monitoring the amount of natural gas in the air, the building, and the surrounding area.
