1. *August 30, Muscatine Journal* – (Iowa) **Fire at Muscatine Power and Water power plant due to equipment failure.** Muscatine Power and Water officials reported that Unit 9 at its Muscatine, Iowa facility will be offline until further notice after a fire began in the unit August 30 following an equipment failure. Officials stated customers will not experience any decline in services.

Nuclear Reactors, Materials, and Waste Sector

2. *August 31, Casper Star-Tribune* – (Wyoming; Utah) **After two toxic sludge spills in nine months, Wyoming uranium mine ordered to halt shipments.** The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission announced August 31 that Cameco Resources was ordered to cease all shipments of radioactive waste following 2 toxic sludge spills during trips from its Smith Ranch-Highland mining site near Glenrock, Wyoming, to a disposal facility in Utah in August 2015 and March 2016. Officials also stated the company failed to properly package toxic materials, exceeded the legal shipment size for radioactive material, and failed to accurately describe the material.

Critical Manufacturing Sector

3. *September 1, CNN* – (National) **Polaris recalls two off-road models due to fire hazard.** Polaris Industries Inc. issued a recall September 1 for nearly 13,000 of its model year 2016 Polaris RZR XP Turbo and RZR XP 4 Turbo recreational off-road vehicles (ROVs) sold in the U.S. due to a fire hazard where the engine can overheat and the turbo system's drain tube can loosen. Polaris has received 19 reports of the vehicles catching fire and 6 injury reports associated with the flaw.

4. *September 1, U.S. Department of Labor* – (New York) **Syracuse auto parts manufacturer fails to correct electrical, crushing and respiratory hazards.** The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited York Metal Toll Processing Inc. with failure to abate 14 previously cited violations, 4 repeat violations, and 3 serious violations September 1 following 2 follow-up inspections in March 2016 at the Syracuse, New York facility, which revealed that the company failed to prevent recurring amputation hazards, exposed employees to uncorrected electrical, crushing and respiratory hazards, and failed to inspect mechanical power presses, among other violations. Proposed penalties total \$218,502.

5. *September 1, Associated Press* – (Florida) **Thousands of fraudulent cards, crystal meth found in SW Miami-Dade home.** Two southwest Miami-Dade, Florida residents were arrested September 1 after authorities discovered over 2,000 counterfeit gift cards, thousands of fraudulent credit cards, and several laptops in the duo's home, which were used to steal over \$50,000 from victims.

6. *September 1, Staten Island Advance* – (New York) **Staten Island man indicted as 'Mad Hatter' bank bandit.** A man dubbed the "Mad Hatter" was indicted August 30 after he allegedly robbed or attempted to rob 11 banks in Manhattan since March 9, stealing a total of more than \$22,000.

7. *September 2, WTIC 61 Hartford* – (Connecticut) **Rt. 2 reopens after tractor-trailer crash.** Eastbound lanes of Route 2 in Colchester, Connecticut, were closed for several hours September 2 while crews worked to clear the wreckage after a semi-truck overturned and spilled fuel on the highway when the driver lost control and struck a sign.

8. *September 2, South Whidbey Record* – (Washington) **Three people airlifted Wednesday following South Whidbey accident.** Both lanes of Highway 525 in Clinton, Washington, were closed for more than 2 hours August 31 while crews worked to clear the wreckage of a 2-vehicle accident that left 3 people injured.

9. *September 1, KSBW 8 Salinas* – (California) **Greenfield Highway 101 crash snaps power pole.** The northbound lane of Highway 101 in Greenfield, California, was closed for several hours September 1 while crews worked to repair the damage after a vehicle crashed into a power pole, causing the pole to snap and leave electrical wires leaning over the highway. One person was injured and HAZMAT crews responded to clean up fuel that spilled during the accident.

10. *September 1, Southern California City News Service* – (California) **Motorcyclist killed in Moreno Valley was struck by truck on I-215.** Two northbound lanes of Interstate 215 in Moreno Valley, California, were closed for more than 2 hours September 1 while crews worked to clear the wreckage of a two-vehicle accident that killed one person.

 11. *September 1, KTVI 2 St. Louis*– (Missouri) **Gas leak shuts down I-270 between Olive and Page.** Both directions of Interstate 270 between Olive and Page in St. Louis, Missouri, were closed for more than 2 hours September 1 due to a gas leak at a nearby home, prompting officials to evacuate to nearby residents. Crews stopped the flow of gas and were monitoring the situation.

 12. *September 1, Astoria Daily Astorian* – (Oregon) **Two dead in Highway 30 crash.** Highway 30 near Liberty Lane in Astoria, Oregon, was closed for nearly 5 hours September 1 while crews removed the wreckage from a two-vehicle crash that killed two people.

 13. *September 1, Hudson County Jersey Journal* – (New Jersey) **In major milestone, Port Authority, Army Corps complete \$2.1B harbor deepening project.** The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Port Authority of New Jersey and New York announced September 1 the completion of the \$2.1 billion, 50-foot Main Navigation Channel Deepening Program that deepened 7 channels for the Port of New York and New Jersey. The harbor now allows larger ships to access the Port's container terminals including Port Newark, Howland Hook Marine Terminal, and Global Container Terminal Bayonne.

 14. *September 1, WSAW 7 Wausau*– (Wisconsin) **Hwy 97 re-opens after two vehicle crash in Marathon County.** Highway 97 north of Marshfield, Wisconsin, reopened September 1 after being closed for several hours while officials investigated the scene of a two-vehicle crash that left three people severely injured.

15. *September 2, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Summit Import Corporation recalls Yu Yee brand Black Pepper Powder because of possible health risk.** Summit Import Corporation issued a recall August 31 for its Yu Yee brand Black Pepper Powder products sold in 19.4-ounce bottles after samples of the product tested positive for Salmonella. No illnesses have been reported and the products were shipped to retail locations in East Coast States.

16. *September 2, U.S. Department of Agriculture*– (California) **Atherstone Foods recalls poultry products due to misbranding and undeclared allergens.** Atherstone Foods issued a recall September 1 for approximately 422 pounds of its “Greens & Grains Southwestern Style White Chicken Wrap with chimichurri sauce” products sold in 31.2-ounce packages due to misbranding and undeclared soy discovered during routine label verification activities. There have been no confirmed reports of adverse reactions and the products were shipped to retail locations in California.

17. *September 1, U.S. Food and Drug Administration*– (California; Oregon; Washington) **Magic Gourmet Trading Inc. issues allergy alert on undeclared allergens in “Koi Palace Mooncakes.”** Magic Gourmet Trading Inc. issued a recall August 31 for its Koi Palace Mooncake products due to undeclared wheat, gluten, and eggs, among other allergens. There have been no confirmed reports of adverse reactions and the products were distributed at Koi Palace restaurant locations in California and Uwajimaya supermarket locations in Oregon and Washington.

18. *September 1, Baltimore Sun* – (Maryland) **105,000 gallons of sewage spilled in Cockeysville.** A total of 105,000 gallons of sewage spilled into Parks Run in Cockeysville, Maryland, August 31 after utility workers’ equipment became wedged in a sewer pipeline, causing wastewater to back up and spill out of a manhole cover at the intersection of York Road and Recycle Way. Crews worked for 2 hours to stop the spill and dislodge the equipment.

19. *September 1, Milwaukee Journal Sentinel* – (Wisconsin) **Sewer overflow was 200,000 gallons.** Heavy rains caused approximately 200,000 gallons of untreated wastewater to discharge into Lincoln Creek in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, August 30.

20. *September 1, KTVB 7 Boise* – (Idaho) **Still growing, Pioneer Fire prompts closure of Deadwood Reservoir.** Boise National Forest officials closed the Deadwood Reservoir in Valley County, Utah, until further notice September 1 due to the nearly 165,000-acre Pioneer Fire, which remains at 52 percent containment.

21. *September 1, KERO 23 Bakersfield* – (California) **Fresno County felon indicted for growing marijuana in national forest.** An Auberry, California man was charged in a Federal indictment returned September 1 in connection with a 12,746-plant marijuana cultivation operation near Mill Creek in Fresno County in the Sierra National Forest that included over 2,000 pounds of equipment from the site, including irrigation hoses and fertilizers from the site.

22. *September 1, WTAE 4 Pittsburgh* – (Pennsylvania) **Fairview Volunteer Fire's former treasurer charged with theft of \$100,000 from dept.** The former treasurer of the Fairview Volunteer Fire Department near South Fayette, Pennsylvania, was charged September 1 for allegedly stealing more than \$100,000 from the department after he made out 40 department checks to himself between 2013 – 2015 and used the funds for personal expenses.

23. *September 2, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Apple patches spyware-related zero-days in OS X, Safari.** Apple released patches resolving three zero-day vulnerabilities, dubbed Trident affecting its Mac operating system (OS) X including OS X Yosemite, OS X El Capitan, and in Safari for OS X Mavericks that were exploited by Pegasus surveillance software to spy on individuals via iOS devices and could lead to kernel memory disclosure, applications executing arbitrary code with kernel privileges, and arbitrary code execution when a user visits a maliciously crafted Website.

24. *September 1, Softpedia* – (International) **Google fixes Nexus 5X flaw that allowed attackers to dump phone memory via USB.** Google patched a vulnerability affecting Android images deployed on LG Nexus 5X devices with the Android Debug Bridge (ADB) feature turned on after researchers from IBM’s X-Force team discovered the flaw could allow an attacker to infect a victim’s device with malware that exploits the vulnerability and dumps the phone’s memory and extracts sensitive information via a universal serial bus (USB) port.
