## Critical Manufacturing Sector

1. *September 8, TheCarConnection.com* – (National) **Ford adds 1.5 million vehicles to door latch recall: Escape, Focus, Mustang, Lincoln MKC, more.** Ford Motor Company expanded a previous recall September 8 to include an additional 1.5 million of its model years 2012 – 2016 vehicles in select makes due to a problem affecting the pawl spring tab in the side door latches where the tabs can break and prevent the doors from closing, or cause the door to open while the vehicle is in motion, thereby increasing the risk of injury. Ford has received three injury reports potentially linked to the recall.

2. *September 8, U.S. Department of Labor* – (Ohio) **OSHA's investigation of life-altering injury at General Aluminum Mfg. finds Ohio foundry continues to expose workers to machine hazards.** The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited General Aluminum Manufacturing Company with two repeated and two serious safety violations September 2 after a March 2016 incident where an employee sustained a hand injury while operating a mold-tilting machine, prompting an investigation at the Conneaut, Ohio facility which revealed that the company failed to follow proper procedures to fully power down equipment to prevent unexpected machine start-ups, among other violations. Proposed penalties total \$218,244.

3. *September 8, U.S. Department of Labor* – (Ohio) **OSHA cites TimkenSteel's Canton, Ohio, plant after worker dies from nitrogen exposure.** The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited TimkenSteel Corporation with two repeated and four serious safety violations September 7 after an employee complaint and a March 2016 incident where an employee was killed while performing fire extinguisher checks prompted two separate March 2016 investigations which revealed that the company failed to protect workers from potentially hazardous atmospheres created by the introduction of nitrogen into the ventilation system, failed to adequately train workers

using pneumatic tools powered by nitrogen, and failed to install guardrails on walkways, among other violations. Proposed penalties total \$113,131.

4. *September 8, Associated Press* – (National) **Wells Fargo fined \$185M on phony accounts, fires 5,300 staff.** California and Federal regulators fined Wells Fargo & Company a total of \$185 million September 8 after the bank's employees allegedly opened more than 2 million bank and credit card accounts and transferred money into those accounts without the authorization of its customers in order to meet projected sales goals. Officials reported that 5,300 Wells Fargo employees were fired in connection with the fraudulent activities.

5. *September 8, Mahwah Patch* – (National) **Former Bergen man admits role in \$65 million identity theft scheme.** A former Demarest, New Jersey resident pleaded guilty September 8 to Federal charges for his role in a \$65 million identity theft scheme where he and co-conspirators stole the birth dates and Social Security numbers from Puerto Rican citizens in order to file fraudulent tax returns and obtain \$4.7 million in tax refund checks, which he deposited into bank accounts controlled by the group. The man also stated he and co-conspirators bribed a mail carrier to intercept the refund checks before they were delivered to the identity theft victims.

6. *September 9, Davenport Quad-City Times* – (Iowa) **DeWitt man dies when semi hits farm tractor on U.S. 61.** Northbound lanes of U.S. 61 near Welton, Iowa, were closed for several hours September 8 while crews worked to clear the wreckage from a two-vehicle crash involving a semi-truck and another vehicle that left one person dead and sent another to an area hospital.

7. *September 8, KSWO 7 Lawton* – (Oklahoma) **Truck transporting turbine topples.** Goad Road in Bray, Oklahoma, was closed for several hours September 8 after a semi-truck carrying part of a wind turbine swerved off the road, causing the turbine to fall off of the truck. No injuries were reported.

8. *September 8, WISN 12 Milwaukee* – (Wisconsin) **Plane makes emergency landing at Mitchell International.** SkyWest Airlines Flight 4594 en route to St. Paul International Airport in Minneapolis, Minnesota, from General Mitchell International Airport in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, was forced to turn around and make an emergency landing at General Mitchell International Airport September 8 after experiencing a mechanical issue. No injuries were reported.

9. *September 8, WTVG 13 Toledo* – (Ohio) **I-75 reopened after semi rollover in Wood County.** Interstate 75 south of Bowling Green, Ohio, reopened after being closed for more than 7 hours September 8 while crews worked to clear the wreckage after a semi-truck rolled over, sending the driver to an area hospital.

10. *September 8, Orlando Sentinel* – (Florida) **Woman killed in crash on John Young Pkwy at SR 408.** Florida Highway Patrol shut down John Young Parkway in Orlando, Florida, for several hours September 8 while crews cleared the wreckage from a two-vehicle crash involving a semi-truck and another vehicle that left one person dead.

11. *September 8, Bradenton Herald* – (Florida) **Bradenton woman charged in U.S. 41 motorcycle crash.** U.S. 41 at northbound 14th Street West and 57th Avenue West in Bradenton, Florida, was closed for nearly 2 hours September 8 while Florida Highway Patrol investigated the scene of a two-vehicle crash involving a motorcycle and another vehicle that sent the motorcyclist to an area hospital.

12. *September 8, Boston Globe* – (Massachusetts) **2 killed, 4 injured after van rolls over on I-495.** Two northbound left lanes of Interstate 495 near the Broad Street interchange in Merrimac, Massachusetts, were closed for about 2 hours September 8 while officials investigated the scene after a vehicle overturned, killing two people and injuring four others.

13. *September 8, Palm Springs Desert Sun* – (California) **American Airlines plane makes emergency landing in Palm Springs.** American Airlines Flight 3064 en route to Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport in Phoenix, Arizona, from Palm Springs International Airport in Palm Springs, California, was forced to make an emergency landing in Palm Springs September 8 after the pilot reported a potential situation involving mechanical issues shortly after departure. No injuries reported.

14. *September 8, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Voluntary recall of Whole Wheat Flour product due to possible foreign matter.** The Morrison Milling Company issued a recall September 8 for its The Baker’s Scoop HEB 100% Whole Wheat Flour products sold in 5-pound packages due the potential presence of soft nylon fragments of mesh from a faulty screen at the company’s production facility discovered during a routine production line check. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed through retail HEB Grocery Company, LP supermarkets in several States.

15. *September 8, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (National) **Paradise Valley Market, Inc. (Carnival Supermarket) recalls ground beef products due to possible E. coli O157:H7 adulteration.** The Paradise Valley Market, Inc. issued a voluntary recall September 8 for approximately 35 pounds of its ground beef products due potential E. coli O157:H7 contamination discovered when a product sample collected at the firm tested positive for the bacteria. There have been no confirmed reports of adverse reactions and the products were sold at Carnival Supermarkets.

16. *September 8, U.S. Department of Justice* – (Florida) **Florida doctor indicted for role in \$13.8 million Medicare fraud scheme.** The former medical director of several Orlando, Florida-based clinics, including Legend Medical & Rehabilitation Inc., Incare Medical & Rehab Center Inc., and CKD Health Care Inc., among others, was charged in an indictment filed September 8 for his alleged participation in a \$13.8 million Medicare health care fraud scheme where he and a co-conspirator caused the submission and concealment of false and fraudulent claims to Medicare for expensive prescription drugs and physical therapy that were not provided or medically necessary from July 2008 – December 2011.

17. *September 9, WFMZ 69 Allentown* – (Pennsylvania) **Quakertown high school dismissed due to bomb threat.** The Quakertown Community Senior High School and

Freshman Center in Quakertown, Pennsylvania, were evacuated and dismissed September 8 after the campus' administrative office received a bomb threat. The incident remains under investigation.

18. *September 8, Rockford Register Star* – (Illinois) **10 Belvidere Central Middle School students taken to area hospitals after bus crash.** About 10 students from Belvidere Central Middle School in Belvidere, Illinois, were transported to area hospitals September 7 after the school bus collided with another vehicle and overturned near Orth and Beloit roads in Boone County. Officials stated both drivers were also transported to the hospital with minor injuries.

19. *September 8, Miami Herald* – (Florida) **Hundreds of inmates riot at Florida prison.** The Holmes Correctional Institutional in Bonifay, Florida, remained on lockdown September 8 after more than 400 inmates rioted September 7 and caused damage to multiple dormitories in the facility, prompting the response of officers from 5 other prisons and special Rapid Response Teams. One inmate was injured during the disturbance and authorities transferred the inmates to other prisons while they assessed the damage.

## **Information Technology Sector**

20. *September 9, Softpedia* – (International) **New Linux trojan discovered coded in Mozilla's Rust language.** Dr. Web security researchers discovered a new trojan coded in Mozilla's Rust programming language was targeting Linux-based platforms and found that an attacker in control of an Internet Relay Chat (IRC) channel can send a message to the channel's public chat that forces all connected bots to parse the message and execute the malicious action. The researchers believe this is a testing version of the malware as the trojan infects victims and gathers information about the device's local system and sends it to its command and control (C&C) center.

21. *September 8, SecurityWeek* – (International) **DropboxCache cross-platform backdoor targets OS X.** Kaspersky Lab security researchers discovered that the DropboxCache, known as Mokes.A or Backdoor.OSX.Mokes now targets Apple Mac operating system (OS) X devices and establishes a connection to the command and control (C&C) server using Hypertext Transfer Protocol (HTTP) on Transmission Control Protocol (TCP) port 80 in order to set up its backdoor features on an infected device, which include capturing audio, monitoring removable storage, scanning the file system for Microsoft Office documents, as well as creating a series of temp files with

the collected data when the C&C server is not available, among other features. Researchers warned the malware's operator can execute arbitrary commands on the infected system and define own file filters to improve its monitoring of the file system.
