1. *September 22, USA Today; Associated Press* – (Puerto Rico) **Most of Puerto Rico still in the dark after power plant fire.** Nearly 1.5 million people in Puerto Rico lost power September 21 following a large fire at an Electric Power Authority electrical plant that prompted officials to shut off power for the entire island as a precaution and close all of the island's schools September 22. Officials were working to restore power and the cause of the fire remains under investigation.

2. *September 21, WBRC 6 Birmingham* – (Alabama) **Colonial Pipeline restarts flow of gasoline in Line 1.** Colonial Pipeline officials restarted the flow of gasoline through Line 1 in Shelby County, Alabama, September 21 after the pipeline was shutdown September 9 when more than 300,000 gallons of gasoline leaked from the pipe. Colonial Pipeline officials stated it may take several days for the fuel supply to return to normal.

3. *September 22, WTMJ 4 Milwaukee* – (Wisconsin) **Card skimmers found at 3 Kenosha ATMs.** Wisconsin authorities are searching September 21 for 2 men suspected of installing credit card skimmers on ATMS at 3 banks in Kenosha, including a North Shore Bank branch and 2 TruStone Financial Federal Credit Union locations. Officials stated the duo also allegedly installed cameras on the ATMs in order to read bank customers' PIN numbers.

4. *September 21, U.S. Attorney's Office, District of New Jersey* – (International) **Connecticut man admits conspiring to conceal income in undeclared Panamanian bank account.** A Weston, Connecticut resident pleaded guilty September 21 to concealing over \$1.5 million in income from the U.S. Internal Revenue Service after he and co-conspirators allegedly hid profits from duty-free alcohol and tobacco sales in an undeclared bank account in Panama from 2006 – 2012. The charges allege that the defendant used a registered Panamanian corporation, Centennial Group, to purchase and sell the duty-free products, shipped the alcohol via a warehouse in Florida and the tobacco products through a warehouse in New Jersey, and used the illicit proceeds for personal expenses.

Transportation Systems Sector

5. *September 22, La Crosse Tribune* – (Wisconsin) **Washout causes derailment near Ferryville; no injuries reported.** Two locomotives and 5 rail cars of a BNSF train derailed near Ferryville, Wisconsin, September 22 and spilled approximately 3,000 gallons of diesel fuel, some of which may have leaked into the Mississippi River. BNSF crews installed an absorbent boom around the site to prevent the diesel from seeping into the water.

6. *September 22, Arlington Patch* – (Virginia) **15-year-old girl struck on Lee Highway in Arlington.** Lee Highway between Glebe Road and George Mason Drive in Arlington, Virginia, was closed for several hours September 22 after a vehicle struck a pedestrian. The pedestrian was transported to an area hospital with injuries.

7. *September 22, KTVZ 21 Bend*– (Oregon) **Highway 97 reopens after semi-crash S. of Madras.** Both directions of U.S. Highway 97 near Madras, Oregon, were closed for nearly 8 hours September 21 while HAZMAT crews worked to clear a large diesel spill after a vehicle crossed the center line and struck a semi-truck head-on. Two people were transported to area hospitals with injuries.

8. *September 22, KSTP 5 Saint Paul* – (Minnesota) **Shorewood teen hit, killed crossing Highway 7 in Minnetonka.** The westbound lanes of Highway 7 in Minnetonka, Minnesota, were closed for about 3 hours September 21 while officials investigated the scene after a vehicle struck and killed a pedestrian.

9. *September 22, Alaska Dispatch News; KUCB 89.7 FM Unalaska* – (Alaska) **Official blames fish-meal dust in \$100K explosion at Dutch Harbor plant.** The Westward Seafoods Inc. plant in Dutch Harbor, Alaska, was closed until further notice September 19 following an explosion that was reportedly caused by the ignition of fine fish-meal dust. Officials estimated the explosion caused more than \$100,000 in damage and no injuries were reported.

10. *September 22, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (National) **502 Boundary Blvd. recalls black forest ham products due to possible foreign matter contamination.** 502 Boundary Blvd. Inc., formerly known as Fletcher’s Fine Foods Ltd., issued a recall September 21 for approximately 8,694 pounds of its “Fletcher’s Fine Foods Classics Black Forest Brand Ham with Natural Juices” products due to potential contamination with rubber fragments after a retail location received a consumer complaint stating rubber was found in the product. There have been no confirmed reports of adverse reactions and the products were distributed nationwide.

11. *September 21, Modesto Bee* – (California) **Citrus pest quarantine expands with Manteca find.** California officials reported that northwest Manteca was added to the Asian citrus psyllid quarantine September 21 after 3 of the insects were found near North Union and Lathrop roads the week of September 12. The quarantine prohibits the movement of oranges, lemons, and other citrus fruits from the quarantine zone without removing the leaves and stems.

12. *September 20, Superior Telegram* – (Wisconsin) **EAB found in Sawyer County quarantine in process.** Officials from the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection placed Sawyer County under quarantine September 20 after a single adult emerald ash borer, which infests and destroys ash trees, was found in Radisson. The quarantine prohibits ash wood products and hardwood firewood from being transported out of Sawyer County and into non-quarantined areas.

13. *September 22, U.S. Attorney's Office, District of Minnesota* – (Minnesota) **Five indicted for massive fraud perpetrated against Starkey Laboratories.** Five people were indicted on Federal charges September 21 for allegedly conspiring to steal more than \$20 million from Eden Prairie, Minnesota-based Starkey Laboratories, Inc. and its principal owner after the group misappropriated money and business opportunities belonging to Starkey and Sonion, a supplier of hearing aid components to Starkey Laboratories by controlling a network of fake companies, awarding themselves restricted stock in Starkey's retail affiliate, and embezzling money from the company between 2006 and 2015.

14. *September 22, Norfolk Virginian-Pilot* – (Virginia; North Carolina) **School closings and delays in Hampton Roads and N.C. for Thursday.** Virginia officials closed or delayed Portsmouth Public Schools, Suffolk City Public Schools, and Virginia Beach City Public Schools, among 2 other South Hampton Roads area schools September 22 due to heavy rains and flooded roads in the area. The heavy rains also prompted North Carolina officials to close or delay Bertie County Schools, Currituck County Schools, and 2 others in the northeastern part of the State September 22.

15. *September 22, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Flaws in Cisco Cloud Services Platform allow command execution.** Cisco notified its customers that its Cloud Services Platform (CSP) 2100 version 2.0 was plagued with two vulnerabilities, one of which is a critical vulnerability caused by insufficient sanitization of user input that could allow an unauthenticated attacker to remotely execute arbitrary commands on the operating system with root privileges. Cisco reported the second vulnerability could allow an unauthenticated attacker to execute arbitrary code on a targeted system remotely by sending a malicious “dnslookup” request.

16. *September 22, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Restriction bypass, XSS flaws patched in Drupal 8.** The developers of the Drupal content management system (CMS) released versions 8.1.10 and 8.2.0-rc2 patching three serious vulnerabilities, including two restriction bypass issues and one cross-site scripting (XSS) flaw after researchers discovered an attacker could exploit the flaws to execute arbitrary code in the victim's browser if a targeted user accesses a maliciously crafted Universal Resource Locator (URL) due to inadequate sanitization in Hypertext Transfer Protocol (HTTP) exceptions. Drupal developers also patched a critical vulnerability in the feature that allows Drupal users to export their site's configuration to a file, which could allow an attacker to download full configuration exports without administrative privileges, among other vulnerabilities.

17. *September 21, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Firefox 49 patches critical, high severity vulnerabilities.** Mozilla released Firefox 49 resolving several critical vulnerabilities, including multiple memory safety bugs that could be exploited to execute arbitrary code, as well as a high severity certificate pinning flaw caused by flaws in the process Mozilla uses to update Preloaded Public Key Pinning, which could allow a Man in the Middle (MitM) attacker to replace legitimate add-on updates with malicious versions and execute arbitrary code on a targeted system, among other vulnerabilities.

18. *September 22, Maryland Gazette* – (Maryland) **Four businesses closed after Festival at Riva fire.** A kitchen fire at the Cheeburger Cheeburger restaurant at the Festival at Riva shopping center in Annapolis, Maryland, September 22 caused more than \$150,000 in damage to the restaurant and 3 surrounding businesses. No injuries were reported.

19. *September 22, MassLive.com* – (Massachusetts) **Paradise Pizza shop in Chicopee closed after cleaning chemicals cause hazmat scare.** Paradise Pizza and 3 apartments

above the restaurant in Chicopee, Massachusetts, were evacuated and closed until further notice September 21 after cleaning solutions being used to clean the pizza oven triggered a chemical reaction that produced unsafe levels of carbon monoxide.

Approximately 20 HAZMAT crews worked to contain the release.

20. *September 21, Topeka Capital-Journal* – (Kansas) **Two hospitalized in early-morning apartment fire at 1317 S.W. Western; estimated damage loss is \$150k.** An apartment building in central Topeka, Kansas, sustained an estimated \$150,000 in damage September 21 following a fire that reportedly began after a resident improperly discarded smoking materials. Two people were sent to area hospitals with injuries.

21. *September 21, KXNT 840 AM North Las Vegas; Associated Press* – (Nevada) **LVMPD: Suspicious item at Stratosphere not a threat; casino reopens.** The Stratosphere casino in Las Vegas was partially evacuated for 2 hours September 21 after a suspicious package was found, prompting officials to close surrounding roads. Officials deemed the area safe after determining the device was a hotel guest's backpack containing medical supplies.

Dams Sector

22. *September 21, Cody Enterprise* – (Wyoming) **City's raw water shut down to fix leak in Cody Canal.** Wyoming officials ordered an emergency shutdown of the raw water system in Cody, Wyoming, September 19 and temporarily shut down Sage Creek and areas of the South Fork September 20 in order to complete repairs to the Cody Canal after a leak was detected during a routine inspection. Officials stated that repair crews plan to implement a temporary fix to the Cody Canal until it shuts down for the season in October.

23. *September 21, KNSD 39 San Diego* – (California) **San Vicente Reservoir reopens to public after 8-year closure.** San Diego County officials announced September 21 that the San Vicente Reservoir would reopen to the public September 22 after authorities determined that the water level was high enough following a massive dam raise in 2008 that doubled the reservoir's capacity. During the shutdown, crews also modernized the marina and recreation area, updated the docks, and added space for fishing boats and kayak rentals, among other improvements.
