1. *September 27, U.S. Department of Justice* – (New Jersey; New York) **Owner of biofuel company pleads guilty to conspiracy and obstruction.** The owner and manager of Unity Fuels, a New Jersey feedstock collector and processor, pleaded guilty September 27 for his role in a \$6 million fraudulent tax credits and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency renewable fuels credits (RIN credits) scheme where he and co-conspirators fraudulently claimed tax credits and RIN credits multiple times on the same fuel loads purchased from a New York-based company.

2. *September 27, U.S. Department of Justice* – (Texas) **Kirby Inland Marine to pay \$4.9 million in civil penalties and provide fleet-wide improvements to resolve U.S. claims for Houston Ship Channel oil spill.** U.S. Department of Justice and U.S. Coast Guard officials announced September 27 that Kirby Inland Marine L.P. agreed to pay \$4.9 million in Clean Water Act civil penalties to resolve claims stemming from a 4,000-barrel oil spill in the Houston Ship Channel in March 2014. As part of the settlement, Kirby Inland Marine must implement fleet-wide operational improvements to vessels operating in the inland waters of the U.S., including the installation of enhanced navigational equipment of vessels, among other improvements.

3. *September 26, Arizona Republic* – (Arizona) **Solana solar plant to pay \$1.5 million in air-quality fines.** The Maricopa County Air Quality Department announced September 26 that the Solana Generating Station near Gila Bend, Arizona, agreed to pay \$1.5 million in fines for 21 air-quality violations dating back to 2014, including exceeding pollution levels allowed by the facility’s permits, failing to conduct performance tests as required, and removing an emissions control system without approval, among other violations.

4. *September 27, TheCarConnection.com* – (National) **2017 Audi Q7 recalled for**

moving seat. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration issued a recall September 27 for 19,205 model year 2017 Audi Q7 vehicles sold in the U.S. due to a faulty part manufactured by AMVIAN Automotive that is associated with the third-row seat, which could cause the seat back to move during a crash, thereby increasing the risk of injury.

5. *September 28, U.S. Attorney's Office, District of Rhode Island* – (International) **Jury convicts two in \$2.6M stolen identity, tax fraud scheme.** Two employees of the Dominican Supermarket in Pawtucket, Rhode Island, were convicted September 27 for their roles in a \$2.6 million Stolen Identity Refund Fraud (SIRF) scheme where the duo and co-conspirators used more than 400 stolen identities, primarily from residents of Puerto Rico, to file falsified tax returns since January 2010. The charges state that counterfeit treasury checks were mailed to various locations in Rhode Island, Massachusetts, and New York and subsequently deposited into 27 different bank accounts controlled by the co-conspirators or others affiliated with the supermarket, and over \$235,000 of the illicit earnings were transferred to a bank in the Dominican Republic.

6. *September 28, U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission* – (International) **SEC charges UBS with supervisory failures in sale of complex products to retail investors.** The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) announced September 28 that UBS Financial Services agreed to pay more than \$15 million to settle charges alleging that the company failed to create and institute policies and procedures intended to properly educate and train sales representatives on the \$548 million in reverse convertible notes (RCNs) it sold to over 8,700 inexperienced retail investors, which caused representatives to make unfit recommendations on RCN sales to certain retail clients regarding their investment profiles. As part of the settlement, the company will be censured by the SEC.

7. *September 28, Eugene Register-Guard* – (Oregon) **Fall Creek woman dies when SUV**

- crashes after leaving Highway 58.** Highway 58 near Black Canyon Campground in Oregon was closed for several hours September 26 while officials investigated the scene of fatal single-vehicle crash that killed 1 person.

8. *September 28, KTLA 5 Los Angeles* – (California) **Big Rig involved in crash on 91 Freeway in Anaheim; temporarily closing westbound lanes.** All westbound lanes of the 91 Freeway in Anaheim, California, were closed for nearly 2 hours September 28 while crews worked to clear the wreckage from 2 separate crashes.

 9. *September 28, WSAW 7 Wausau* – (Wisconsin) **2 hurt in Marathon Co. crash, all lanes now open.** All lanes of Highway 13 at Park Road in Unity, Wisconsin, were closed for 2 hours September 27 while officials investigated a 2-vehicle accident that injured 2 people.

 10. *September 27, San Francisco Chronicle* – (California) **Eastbound Richmond-San Rafael Bridge reopens 9 hours after crash.** Eastbound lanes of the Richmond-San Rafael Bridge in Richmond, California, were closed for 9 hours September 27 while crews worked to clear the wreckage after a semi-truck carrying 24 tons of soil overturned and caught fire after crashing into a guardrail. Officials were working to assess damage to the bridge.

 11. *September 27, Columbia Daily Tribune* – (Missouri) **Clark man killed in Highway 63 crash.** Highway 63 in northern Boone County, Missouri, was closed for more than 3 hours September 27 following a 2-vehicle crash that killed 1 person. The cause of the crash remains under investigation.

 12. *September 27, Rifle Citizen Telegram* – (Colorado) **Crash near Rifle spills 4,000 gallons of oil.** The Colorado 13 bypass between Garfield County Road 244 and Railroad Avenue near Rifle, Colorado, was closed for approximately 6 hours September 27 while officials investigated the scene after a vehicle traveling southbound crossed the center line and struck a semi-truck carrying crude oil, causing the truck to overturn and spill approximately 4,000 gallons of oil on the roadway.

 13. *September 27, WTOV 9 Steubenville* – (Ohio) **28-year-old man killed in Harrison County crash.** County Road 8 in Bowerston, Ohio, was closed for several hours

September 27 while crews worked to clear the scene after a vehicle veered off the road and struck a tree and a guardrail, killing 1 person. The crash remains under investigation.

14. *September 27, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (National) **Tyson Foods Inc. recalls chicken nugget products due to possible foreign matter contamination.** Tyson Foods Inc. issued a recall September 27 for approximately 132,520 pounds of its “Tyson Fully Cooked Panko Chicken Nuggets” products sold in 5-pound packages and its “Spare Time Fully Cooked, Panko Chicken Nuggets, Nugget Shaped Chicken Breast Pattie Fritters with Rib Meat” products sold in 20-pound packages due to potential contamination with hard plastic fragments discovered after the firm received consumer complaints regarding foreign materials found in the products. There have been no confirmed reports of adverse reactions and the products were distributed to retail locations nationwide.

15. *September 27, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Café Valley Inc. issues allergy alert on undeclared (walnuts) in 12ct Banana Nut mini muffins labeled as 12ct Lemon Poppy Seed mini muffins.** Café Valley Inc. issued a recall September 26 for 543 cases of its Banana Nut mini muffins products due to mislabeling and undeclared walnuts after it was discovered the products were labeled as Lemon Poppy Seed mini muffins due to a printing error. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to wholesale distributors in nine States.

16. *September 27, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (Texas) **Caviness Beef Packers recalls beef products due to possible E.coli O103 contamination.** Caviness Beef Packers issued a recall September 27 for approximately 2,100 pounds of its boneless beef trim products and ground beef products sold in 3 variations due to potential E.coli O103 contamination after Federal personnel were notified that a sample of the products tested positive for E.coli O103. There have been no confirmed reports of adverse reactions and the products were shipped to retail locations in Texas.

17. *September 27, U.S. Department of Labor* – (Illinois) **Global meat-casing manufacturer continues to expose workers to unsafe conditions at Illinois plant, OSHA says.** The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited Viscofan USA Inc. with 1 repeated and 1 serious safety violation September 27 after reports of unsafe working conditions prompted an inspection at the Danville, Illinois facility which revealed that the company exposed workers to slip, trip, and fall hazards, and failed to mount, locate, and identify portable fire extinguishers. Proposed penalties total \$86,225.

18. *September 28, KNTV 11 San Jose* – (California) **Loma Fire scorches 2,250 acres, evacuations mandatory.** Crews reached 10 percent containment September 27 of the more than 2,250-acre Loma Fire burning in the Santa Cruz Mountains in California, which has destroyed 1 home and 6 outbuildings, threatens 300 more structures, and prompted mandatory evacuation orders for all residents on Croy Road and the Loma Prieta ridgeline area.

19. *September 28, KCRA 3 Sacramento* – (California) **Wildfire in Tuolumne County grows to 1,000 acres.** Crews reached 25 percent containment September 27 of the roughly 1,000-acre Marshes Fire burning in Tuolumne County, California, which prompted officials to lift all mandatory evacuation orders. Officials stated Highway 49 from Moccasin to Coulterville remains shut down.

20. *September 26, U.S. Department of Justice* – (National) **Department of Justice awards over \$20 million to law enforcement body-worn camera programs.** The U.S. Attorney General awarded September 26 more than \$20 million to 106 State, city, tribal, and municipal law enforcement agencies as part of the Office of Justice Programs' Bureau of Justice Assistance's Fiscal Year 2016 Body-Worn Camera Policy and Implementation Program that aims to help law enforcement organizations implement body-worn camera policies, practices, and evaluation methods in order to positively impact the quality of policing in communities nationwide.

21. *September 28, SecurityWeek* – (International) **High severity DoS flaw patched in**

BIND. The Internet Systems Consortium released updates for the Domain Name System (DNS) software BIND addressing two vulnerabilities, including a high severity denial-of-service (DoS) flaw affecting all servers that can receive request packets from any source, which can be exploited using maliciously crafted DNS request packets. The updates also resolved a medium severity DoS flaw that can cause a targeted server to terminate due to an error.

22. *September 28, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Locky ransomware drops offline mode.** Security researchers reported that the Locky ransomware adopted new methods after a BleepingComputer researcher spotted the malware appending the .ODIN extension to encrypted files, instead of the .zepto extension, and researchers from Avira found the ransomware switched back to the use of a command and control (C&C) server and dropped the use of an offline mode. The updated Locky version is still distributed via spam email campaigns that contain malicious code in the file attachments, which infects a system in order to deliver a ransom note.

23. *September 27, U.S. Department of Justice* – (International) **American living in Australia charged in securities fraud case involving scheme to fraudulently inflate by nearly \$100 million the cost of Santa Monica software company being purchased by Computer Sciences Corp.** A former executive at Commonwealth Bank of Australia (CBA) was charged September 26 after he and several co-conspirators in Australia and the U.S. allegedly defrauded Computer Sciences Corporation (CSC) out of \$98 million by inflating revenues for ServiceMesh, Inc., a Santa Monica, California-based cloud computer management software company that CSC planned to purchase from 2013 – 2014. The charges also allege that CBA employees received more than \$630,000 in undisclosed kickbacks from a senior executive of ServiceMesh, Inc. involved in the scheme.
