Critical Manufacturing Sector

1. *October 5, TheCarConnection.com* – (National) **2014-2016 Mazda Mazda3 recalled for potential fuel leak & fire risk.** Mazda Motor Corporation issued a recall October 5 for 17,484 of its model years 2014 – 2016 Mazda3 vehicles due to faulty welding on the fuel tanks' valves, which could cause the welding to fail when exposed to road vibrations, thereby causing a fuel leak and increasing the risk of a fire.

2. *October 5, U.S. Department of Labor* – (New Jersey) **New Jersey aluminum company continues to expose employees to machine hazards – resulting in worker injuries, amputations.** The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited Aluminum Shapes LLC with 1 serious and 1 repeat violation September 23 after a worker suffered an amputation while working at the Pennsauken, New Jersey facility, prompting an investigation which revealed that the company failed to install machine guards and failed to report the amputation within the required time frame, among other violations. Proposed penalties total \$89,390.

3. *October 6, WHSV 3 Harrisonburg* – (Virginia) **ATM data-skimmers target the valley.** Virginia authorities are searching October 6 for a group of Romanian nationals suspected of installing four skimming devices on ATMs at banks in Virginia's Shenandoah Valley since March 2016, including the DuPont Community Credit Union in Staunton October 2.

4. *October 5, U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission* – (International) **Credit Suisse paying \$90 million penalty for misrepresenting performance metric.** The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission announced October 5 that Credit Suisse AG agreed to pay \$90 million to resolve charges that it misrepresented how it determined its net new assets (NNA) by applying an undisclosed results-driven approach to determining NNA in order to meet specific targets created by the company's senior executives. As part of the settlement, a former executive agreed to settle charges that he was a cause of the violations.

5. *October 5, U.S. Department of Justice* – (Illinois; Kansas; Missouri) **Owner of tax preparation franchises in Illinois, Kansas and Missouri convicted of tax evasion.** The owner and operator of at least 20 Instant Tax Service (ITS) franchise locations in Illinois, Kansas, and Missouri was convicted October 5 after he filed fraudulent Federal tax returns that underreported over \$1.5 million in income and submitted falsified financial summaries to his tax return preparer from 2010 – 2011 that undervalued the gross receipts generated by his franchises, A&S Tax Service LLC and ERI Enterprises LLC, which his tax preparer used to generate his individual Federal income tax returns. The charges also state that the franchise owner and A&S have been permanently enjoined from operating a tax preparation business and preparing Federal tax returns since 2013.

Transportation Systems Sector

6. *October 6, WLS 7 Chicago; Associated Press* – (National) **Hurricane Matthew path, updated to category 4 by NOAA, approaches Florida.** More than 1,400 flights in the U.S. traveling to and from Florida and Georgia were canceled October 6 in anticipation of Hurricane Matthew. Officials closed the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport to all flights and shut down Walt Disney World theme parks in Florida through at least October 7.

7. *October 6, Newark Star-Ledger* – (New Jersey) **1 dead after tractor-trailer overturns onto pick-up in South Jersey.** Southbound lanes of Interstate 295 in Pennsville Township, New Jersey, were closed for more than 6 hours October 5 – October 6 while crews worked to clear the wreckage after a semi-truck overturned onto another vehicle. One person was killed and the cause of the accident remains under investigation.

8. *October 6, WJTV 12 Jackson* – (Mississippi) **Cleared: 18-wheeler accident on I-20**

- eastbound Edwards Exit 19.** Eastbound lanes of Interstate 20 in Hinds County, Mississippi, were closed for several hours October 6 while crews worked to clear the wreckage after a semi-truck veered off the roadway. The cause of the crash remains under investigation.

9. *October 6, Salt Lake Tribune* – (Utah) **Semitanker rig hauling hazardous material topples on I-15, snarling traffic for an entire workday’s worth of time.** Southbound lanes of Interstate 15 in Murray, Utah, were closed for more than 5 hours October 5, while northbound lanes remained closed for more than 7 hours while HAZMAT crews worked to clear the wreckage after a semi-truck carrying ammonium nitrate was involved in a multi-vehicle collision. Officials also closed Interstate 215 at Union Park and eastbound Interstate 215 at Redwood Road during the clean-up.

10. *October 5, Reuters* – (New York) **Freight train derailment in New York disrupts Amtrak service.** Eight cars from a CSX Corp. freight train derailed in the Bronx in New York October 5, suspending northbound Amtrak service between New York City and New Rochelle for several hours while crews worked to clear the wreckage.

11. *October 5, Joplin Globe* – (Missouri) **Cheese cleanup closes road after truck accident on Highway 43.** Highway 43 north of Seneca, Missouri, was closed for nearly 6 hours October 5 after a semi-truck hauling 40,000 pounds of cheese overturned, spilling the cheese on the roadway. The driver was transported to an area hospital with injuries.

12. *October 5, U.S. Attorney’s Office, Western District of Washington* – (Washington; Oregon) **Long time manager of Hoquiam wood shavings business convicted of mail fraud, tax evasion, money laundering and interstate transportation of stolen property.** The former manager of a Long Beach Shavings Company (LBS) plant in Hoquiam, Washington, was convicted October 5 for stealing more than \$1.3 million from the business after he sold wood shavings directly to customers in Washington and Oregon without reimbursing the company, and created M & R Lumber, a fictitious entity that LBS paid in order to get free wood chips from a Montesano, Washington lumber mill. The charges state the former manager generated fraudulent invoices to bill LBS for the shavings and kept the profits for personal use.

13. *October 5, WFLA 8 Tampa* – (Florida) **1 million gallons of raw sewage leaked from ruptured Palm Harbor pipe.** Authorities are investigating after approximately 1 million gallons of raw sewage spilled from a ruptured pipe in Palm Harbor, Florida, October 4. Pinellas County Utilities crews stopped the leak and officials advised residents to avoid the affected areas and to limit water usage until the pipe is repaired. 14. *October 4, Medford Mail Tribune* – (Oregon) **Gold Hill residents told to boil water.** The mayor of Gold Hill, Oregon issued a boil water advisory for the city's residents October 4 due to a potential bacteria contamination after a construction crew struck a waterline, causing a loss in water pressure. 15. *October 5, WKMG 6 Orlando* – (Wisconsin) **Patients evacuated from Health First's Cape Canaveral Hospital.** About 63 patients were evacuated from the Health First Cape Canaveral Hospital in Cocoa Beach, Florida, October 4 – October 5 in preparation for Hurricane Matthew. Hospital officials stated new patients will be accepted once the storm passes and damages are assessed. 16. *October 4, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Vascular Solutions, Inc. issues recall of Twin-Pass Dual Access catheters.** Vascular Solutions, Inc. issued a recall October 4 for 5,784 of its Twin-Pass Dual Access catheter products due to the potential presence of excess manufacturing material at the tip of the catheter or in the distal portion of the rapid exchange lumen. Vascular Solutions advised all healthcare facilities with the devices to remove them from their inventory and no illnesses have been reported in connection with the products which were distributed nationwide. 17. *October 4, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Nurse Assist initiates nationwide voluntary recall of all unexpired lots of I.V. Flush Syringes.** Nurse Assist, Inc. issued a voluntary recall October 4 for all unexpired lots of its I.V. Flush Syringe products sold in four variations due to a potential association with Burkholderia cepacia bloodstream infections after patients developed the infections when receiving intravenous care using the firm's saline flushes. The infections remain under investigation and Nurse Assist urged all healthcare facilities with the flush syringes to return the product to the supplier. 18. *October 4, Bend Bulletin* – (Oregon) **Fire closure are in Ochoco Forest reduced.** Crews reached 38 percent containment October 3 of the 1,561-acre East Maury Fire burning in the Ochoco National Forest near Prineville, Oregon, which initially began as a prescribed burn in the Maury Mountains before spreading. U.S. Forest Service officials stated the Elkhorn campground remained closed.

19. *October 5, WTAE 4 Pittsburgh* – (Pennsylvania) **Vehicles destroyed in Wampum fire station fire.** Authorities are investigating the cause of a fire at the Wampum Volunteer Fire Department in Wampum, Pennsylvania, October 4 that destroyed 3 vehicles and caused an estimated \$100,000 in damage.

20. *October 6, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Mac malware can abuse legitimate apps to spy on users.** A security researcher from Synack discovered that Apple Mac operating system (OS) X malware can monitor an infected system for legitimate user-initiated video sessions on applications such as FaceTime, Skype, and Google Hangouts, and piggyback on those legitimate sessions to record video and spy on users without their knowledge or authorization.

21. *October 5, Softpedia* – (International) **New backdoor trojan spreads through RDP brute-force attacks.** GuardiCore security researchers discovered a new malware family, dubbed Trojan.sysscan was being leveraged as a backdoor trojan to collect data and credentials used for accounts on banking, gambling, and tax Websites from compromised systems and transfer the information to an attacker's remote server by carrying out brute-force attacks on open Remote Desktop Protocol (RDP) ports. GuardiCore reported the trojan is coded in the Delphi programming language and is equipped with support for dumping passwords from locally installed applications including databases, point of sale (PoS) software, and Web browsers.

22. *October 5, SecurityWeek* – (International) **iMessage URL preview exposes user data.** A security researcher discovered that Apple's iMessage service could leak user data including the message receivers Internet Protocol (IP) address, device type, and operating system (OS) version when the user receives a Uniform Resource Locator (URL) in a message due to a feature available in MacOS and iOS that enables the

service to extract metadata from the URL and display it as an accessible link. The researcher stated the iMessage implementation sends requests from each of the devices the receiver has, which could allow an attacker sending the URL to determine the victim's physical location based on the IP address.
