1. *October 12, Associated Press* – (North Carolina) **North Carolina governor says more floods on way.** The governor of North Carolina announced October 12 that 143,000 customers across the State remained without power in the aftermath of Hurricane Matthew. The governor reported that the storm killed at least 19 people.

4. *October 11, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency* – (New York) **New York companies fined for Clean Air Act violations.** The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced October 11 a \$154,000 fine against Finger Lakes LPG Storage LLC based in Savona, New York, and a \$40,000 fine against Twin Lakes Chemical Inc. in Lockport, New York, for alleged Clean Air Act violations and violations of rules governing chemical safety and risk management after the EPA found the companies failed to meet hazard identification and equipment safety requirements. The EPA stated Finger Lakes LPG Storage failed to maintain updated and accurate piping instrument diagrams, and Twin Lakes Chemical failed to properly support, secure, and label phosgene equipment and pipes, among other violations.

5. *October 11, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Serious flaws expose AVTECH devices to IoT botnets.** Security researchers from Search-Lab discovered that AVTECH's video surveillance products were plagued with over a dozen vulnerabilities that could allow attackers to take control of the camera and recorder devices and could be exploited by Internet of Things (IoT) botnets to capture the affected devices after finding that the devices lack protection against cross-site request forgery (CSRF) attacks, use Hypertext Transfer Protocol Secure (HTTPS) without certificate verification, and store admin passwords in plain text, among other flaws.

6. *October 11, U.S. Attorney's Office, District of Idaho* – (National) **Member of north Idaho drug trafficking organization pleads guilty to money laundering.** A Las Vegas resident and member of a drug trafficking organization operating in 5 States pleaded guilty October 11 after she laundered nearly \$500,000 in drug proceeds for the organization since 2010 by depositing the organization's earnings into her personal bank accounts and business accounts belonging to a Las Vegas-based hair salon that she and her mother owned. The charges state the woman used a portion of the profits to pay expenses related to the organization.

7. *October 12, WPVI 6 Philadelphia* – (Delaware) **Route 1 reopens in New Castle Co. after truck with live chickens crashes.** The southbound lanes of Route 1 in Smyrna, Delaware, were closed for about 6 hours October 12 following an accident involving 2 semi-trucks that caused 1 of the trucks to overturn and spill its load of live chickens across the roadway.

8. *October 12, Gainesville Sun* – (Florida) **U.S. 301 near Waldo reopens after fuel spill, fatal crash.** U.S. 301 near Waldo, Florida, was closed between State Road 24 and State Road 26 in Orange Heights for several hours October 12 while crews worked to clear jet fuel that spilled on the roadway after a tanker truck overturned. The spill prompted officials to evacuate nearby homes as a precaution.

9. *October 11, Newport News Daily Press* – (Virginia) **Police: One man dies after Isle of Wight crash Monday.** Route 58 in Isle of Wight County, Virginia, was closed in both directions for more than 3 hours October 10 following a 2-vehicle crash that killed 1 person and injured another.

10. *October 11, Salt Lake Tribune* – (Utah) **I-80 crash leaves man wedged under semi trailer, seriously injured.** Eastbound Interstate 80 in Tooele County, Utah, was restricted to 1 lane for several hours October 10 – October 11 while crews worked to clear the wreckage following a 2-vehicle crash involving a semi-truck and another vehicle. One driver was transported to an area hospital with injuries and the cause of the crash remains under investigation.

11. *October 11, Denton Record-Chronicle* – (Texas) **I-35E wreck sends 3 to hospital.** A 3-vehicle crash closed northbound lanes of Interstate 35 East in Corinth, Texas, for several hours October 11 while HAZMAT crews worked to clean up hydraulic fluid that spilled during the crash. Three people were transported to an area hospital with injuries.

12. *October 11, KSCB 1270 AM Liberal* – (Kansas) **Wrong way crash kills two.** A 2-vehicle crash on Highway 54 west of Liberal, Kansas, killed 2 people, sent 1 person to an area hospital, and forced the closure of the roadway for several hours October 11.

13. *October 11, WHSV 3 Harrisonburg* – (Virginia) **Drivers identified in fatal accident which closed Rt. 11 near Mint Spring.** A section of Route 11 near Mint Spring in Augusta County, Virginia, was closed for several hours October 11 while crews worked to clear the wreckage following a head-on collision that killed 1 person and injured another. Officials are investigating the cause of the crash.

14. *October 11, WLWT 5 Cincinnati* – (Kentucky) **4 injured in crash on NB I-71 in Boone County.** Northbound lanes of Interstate 71 in Boone County, Kentucky, were closed for nearly 2 hours October 11 while crews worked to clear the wreckage following a 5-vehicle accident that left 4 people injured.

16. *October 9, CNN* – (New York) **Long Island train derailment: 33 injured, services suspended.** The National Transportation Safety Board is investigating October 9 the derailment of an eastbound Long Island Rail Road commuter train that derailed east of New Hyde Park station in New York after the train collided with part of another work train October 8, injuring 33 people.

17. *October 12, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Publix recalls Publix Premium Chocolate Chip Cookie Dough Ice Cream due to possible Listeria monocytogenes contamination from Aspen Hills, Inc. cookie dough pieces.** Publix Super Markets, Inc. issued a voluntary recall October 10 for its Publix Premium Chocolate Chip Cookie Dough Ice Cream products due to potential Listeria monocytogenes contamination after the company's cookie dough supplier, Aspen Hills, Inc., notified Publix that the cookie dough pieces may be contaminated with Listeria. No illnesses have been reported and the products were sold at Publix stores in six States.

18. *October 12, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Nutrisystem retail division voluntarily recalls one product containing chocolate cookie dough pieces purchased from third party supplier due to a possible health risk.** Nutrisystem, Inc. issued a voluntary recall October 11 for 455 cases of its Nutricrush Chocolate Chip Cookie Dough bar products manufactured by Noble Foods, Inc., after a third-party supplier of the chocolate chip cookie dough ingredient notified Nutrisystem that the ingredient may be contaminated with Listeria monocytogenes. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to ShopRite and Hannaford Brothers Company stores in 12 States and via the Internet.

19. *October 11, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Chocolate Shoppe Ice Cream Company recalls select products containing chocolate chip cookie dough pieces purchased from outside supplier Aspen Hills due to possible health risk.** Chocolate Shoppe Ice Cream Company, Inc. issued a recall October 11 for 4,183 of its ice cream products sold in 3-gallon cartons and 5,296 of its ice cream products sold in pints due to potential Listeria monocytogenes contamination in the chocolate chip cookie dough ingredient supplied by Aspen Hills, Inc. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to ice cream shops, online retailers, and limited grocery stores in 25 States.

20. *October 11, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Blue Bunny Hoppin’ Hollidoodle ice cream voluntary recall.** Wells Enterprises, Inc. issued a voluntary recall October 10 for 2 lots of its Blue Bunny Hoppin’ Hollidoodle ice cream products after the company’s snickerdoodle cookie dough pieces supplier, Aspen Hills, Inc., notified the firm that the ingredients have the potential to be contaminated with *Listeria monocytogenes*. 21. *October 11, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Outside supplier Aspen Hills expands cookie dough recall; Blue Bell recalls all products made with Aspen Hills cookie dough due to potential health risk.** Blue Bell Creameries issued a voluntary recall October 10 for all of its products that were made with a cookie dough ingredient provided by a third-party supplier, Aspen Hills, Inc., due to potential *Listeria monocytogenes* contamination. 22. *October 11, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (International) **Roland Foods, LLC, initiates a voluntary recall of Roland Preserved Lemons due to undeclared sulfites in product.** Roland Foods, LLC issued a voluntary recall October 11 for 2 lots of its Roland Preserved Lemons and Roland Preserved Lemons – Beldi products due to the presence of undeclared sulfites after the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets notified the company that the product was distributed in packaging that did not declare the presence of sulfites. No illnesses have been reported and the products were distributed to food distributors, food service customers, and grocery store chains nationwide and in Canada. 23. *October 12, WKOW 27 Madison* – (Wisconsin) **Richland School District bus catches fire, students evacuated.** About 15 students were evacuated from a Richland School District bus in Richland Center, Wisconsin, October 11 when the bus caught fire. 25. *October 12, Softpedia* – (International) **Microsoft patches four zero-days used in live attacks.** Microsoft released a security bulletin addressing 4 zero-day vulnerabilities in several of its products, including an information disclosure bug in Internet Explorer, remote code execution (RCE) flaws in Edge’s scripting engine and Windows graphics device interface (GDI), and a memory corruption vulnerability in Office, among other vulnerabilities. 26. *October 12, SecurityWeek* – (International) **SAP patches multiple implementation flaws.** SAP released security patches resolving 48 vulnerabilities affecting its products, including a denial-of-service (DoS) flaw in SAP ASE that could be exploited to terminate a process in a vulnerable component, a Structured Query Language (SQL) injection issue in SAP ST-PI component that allows an attacker to read and alter sensitive database information, and a cross-site scripting (XSS) flaw in SAP Messaging System Service that enables a malicious actor to inject script into a page to access all session tokens, cookies, and other critical information, among other vulnerabilities. 27. *October 11, SecurityWeek* – (International) **Adobe patches critical flaws in Flash Player, PDF apps.** Adobe released patches resolving 71 critical vulnerabilities affecting its Acrobat, Reader, Flash Player, and Creative Cloud desktop application products, including a security bypass vulnerability, an unquoted search path vulnerability that could lead to local privilege escalation in Creative Cloud for Microsoft Windows, and several memory flaws that could allow arbitrary code execution, among other vulnerabilities. 28. *October 11, SecurityWeek* – (International) **DXXD ransomware encrypts files on unmapped network shares.** Security researchers from BleepingComputer reported a new ransomware family, dubbed DXXD was spotted targeting and encrypting files on

both mapped and unmapped network shares, and was abusing Remote Desktop Services and brute-forcing passwords on infected devices for distribution. DXXD changes a Microsoft Windows Registry setting in order to display a notice when a victim logs in to their infected device, ensuring that the user sees the ransom note. 29. *October 11, Reuters* – (National) **Comcast will pay \$2.3 million to settle U.S. billing probe.** The U.S. Federal Communications Commission announced October 11 that Comcast Corporation will pay \$2.3 million to resolve a Federal investigation into allegations that the company wrongfully billed thousands of cable TV customers for unauthorized services and equipment, including premium channels, set-top boxes, and digital video recorders. As part of the consent decree, Comcast must implement a 5-year compliance plan, offer a detailed program for responding to consumer complaints, send customers a separate order confirmation of new services, and implement additional employee training for workers placing excessive unauthorized charges on customer bills, among other requirements.

30. *October 12, NJ.com* – (New Jersey) **Firefighter, several police officers injured battling church complex fire.** Around 30 people were evacuated and temporarily displaced from St. Michael's Villa in Englewood Cliffs, New Jersey, October 12 following a fire that also forced the evacuation of a nearby satellite campus of St. Peter's University. A firefighter and several police officers sustained minor injuries and the cause of the fire remains under investigation.
