Executive Summary

In FY 2018, U.S. Customs and Border Protection sponsored two conferences and the Federal Law Enforcement Training Centers sponsored one conference at which nonfederal participants were charged a fee to attend. The three conferences were conducted at a total cost of \$455,861, and nonfederal participants were charged \$264,197. A detailed breakdown of these events is provided in the report.

I. Legislative Language

This report is in response to the reporting requirements set forth in Section 554 of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2010 Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Appropriations Act (P.L. 111-83), which states:

For fiscal year 2010 and thereafter, the Secretary of Homeland Security may collect fees from any non-Federal participant in a conference, seminar, exhibition, symposium, or similar meeting conducted by the Department of Homeland Security in advance of the conference, either directly or by contract, and those fees shall be credited to the appropriation or account from which the costs of the conference, seminar, exhibition, symposium, or similar meeting are paid and shall be available to pay the costs of the Department of Homeland Security with respect to the conference or to reimburse the Department for costs incurred with respect to the conference: Provided, That in the event the total amount of fees collected with respect to a conference exceeds the actual costs of the Department of Homeland Security with respect to the conference, the amount of such excess shall be deposited into the Treasury as miscellaneous receipts: Provided further, That the Secretary shall provide a report to the Committees on Appropriations of the Senate and the House of Representatives not later than January 5, 2011, providing the level of collections and a summary by agency of the purposes and levels of expenditures for the prior fiscal year, and shall report annually thereafter.

II. Background

The enclosed report provides information on the number of DHS-sponsored conferences at which nonfederal participants were charged a fee to attend. The information was collected from DHS Components that reported conferences that they sponsored at which nonfederal participants were charged fees to offset the conference costs. Both U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) and the Federal Law Enforcement Training Centers (FLETC) reported conferences for FY 2018. For each such event, CBP and FLETC provided the total amount of fees collected from nonfederal participants (and federal participants, if any), the total conference-related costs, and the amount of fees returned to the Department of Treasury, if any (i.e., fees collected from nonfederal participants that exceeded the conference costs). This information is aggregated and incorporated into the Data Report (Section III).

¹Fees collected from nonfederal sources in excess of actual costs for individual participation are returned to the Department of Treasury (Treasury). CBP collected no excess fees from its two conferences. The amount being returned for the FLETC Cybercrime and Technical Investigations Conference reflects only the excess in fees collected from nonfederal sources. Excess collected from other federal agencies was returned to the individual agencies. Specifically, FLETC collected \$18,625 from both federal and nonfederal sources; of which, \$6,820 was excess. Of the \$6,820, \$3,103 was received from nonfederal sources and was returned to Treasury.
