SUSPENSION AND DEBARMENT PROGRAM

I. Purpose

This Directive establishes the Department's program for Suspension, Debarment, and related actions.

II. Scope

This Directive applies throughout the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), with the exception of the Office of Inspector General.

III. Authorities

IV. Responsibilities

- A. The **DHS Suspension and Debarment Official (SDO)**:
 - 1. Oversees, manages, directs, and guides the Department's Suspension and Debarment Program;
 - 2. Serves as the Department's representative to the Interagency Suspension and Debarment Committee; and
 - 3. Delegates authority to each Component Suspension and Debarment Official, based on actual or projected suspension and debarment cases.
- B. The <u>Component Suspension and Debarment Officials</u> oversee, manage, direct, and guide the Component suspension and debarment activities.
- C. The <u>Component Suspension and Debarment Directors (SDD)</u> receive information pertaining to potential suspension and debarment cases from any source, analyze the information, and oversee the preparation of the administrative record with recommendations to the appropriate SDO.
- D. The <u>DHS Chief Procurement Officer</u>, as appropriate, grants waivers/limited exceptions to let an excluded person participate in covered procurement transactions, including prime and subcontracts.

E. The **DHS Chief Financial Officer**.

1. As appropriate, grants waivers/limited exceptions to let an excluded person participate in covered non-procurement transactions including grants and direct loans.

- 2. Provides financial assistance policy guidance on enforcement actions and System for Award Management review for program and Grants Officers.
- F. The <u>Office of the General Counsel or Component Counsel</u> provides legal support to the SDDs and the SDOs.

V. Policy and Requirements

- A. The Department's Suspension and Debarment Program:
 - 1. Provides the organizational structure, policies, procedures, and training necessary to identify, research, and process referred suspension and debarment cases.
 - 2. Ensures that referrals are processed in compliance with statutes and regulations that protect the Government's interests.
- B. Components that award contracts, grants, cooperative agreements, Letters of Intent, exercise Other Transaction Authorities, or provide financial assistance designate a person to serve as the Component's SDD. Each Component SDD processes referrals and tracks the status of the Component's potential administrative actions.
- C. There are suspension and debarment Centers of Excellence within DHS. Those Operational Components, and the Management Direcorate, with delegated SDO authority are considered Centers of Excellence. Each Operational Component Center of Excellence has an SDO, in addition to the SDD and supporting staff.
- D. A DHS-wide case tracking system is maintained for the Suspension and Debarment Program, which tracks suspension and debarment activities, case documentation, and provides for statistical reporting. Operational and Maintenance costs are shared equally by each Operational Component and the Management Directorate, if not accounted for through other means.
