Energy Sector

1. *February 22, Associated Press* – (Alaska) **Coast Guard finds 16 violations on Shell Arctic drill ship, forwards investigation to DOJ.** A U.S. Coast Guard investigation on the Royal Dutch Shell PLC Arctic drill ship turned up 16 violations after the ship was done drilling the summer of 2012. The investigation was handed over to the Department of Justice February 22 for further examination.

2. *February 22, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency* – (National) **Man sentenced to more than 12 years in prison for selling \$9 million in fraudulent renewable fuel credits/owner of “Clean Green Fuel” falsely claimed his company produced 23 million gallons of renewable fuel.** A Maryland man was sentenced after he and his company engaged in a massive fraud plot from March 2009 through December 2010 where he sold over 23 million gallons of bio-diesel fuel to brokers and oil companies and falsely sold \$9 million in renewable fuel credits, undermining the government program. Authorities discovered his company did not produce any fuel nor did he own a facility capable of production.

3. *February 21, Associated Press* – (National) **Flawed fracking air pollution data is hindering EPA efforts to police drilling, new report says.** A report released February 21 by the Inspector General claimed the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has failed to accurately capture data and estimates regarding air pollution from oil and natural gas production, which in turn has limited the EPA’s efforts in regulating drilling. The EPA vowed to reevaluate their strategy for gathering metrics and to develop a comprehensive plan.

4. *February 22, CNN* – (Washington) **Radioactive waste leaking from 6 tanks at Washington nuclear site.** The Washington governor raised concerns over all 149 of

the single-shell underground tanks at the Hanford Nuclear Reservation after it was discovered six of them were leaking radioactive waste instead of just one as recently reported.

5. *February 25, Associated Press* – (National) **Feds to probe Ford cars and SUVs for stalling.** Over 1,500 complaints of stalls and surging engines caused the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) to investigate roughly 725,000 Ford vehicles from 2009 to 2011 model years. Some cars have unexpectedly entered a limp mode causing a reduction in power, which could potentially lead to an accident.

6. *February 22, Associated Press* – (National) **AP sources: Boeing proposes battery fix for 787s.** Boeing is working on a long-term solution to address the problem it experienced with lithium ion batteries overheating on the grounded 787 Dreamliner. The plan, proposed to the Federal Aviation Administration, involves revamping the batteries with a more robust ceramic isolation around each of the cells to contain short circuits and thermal runaway.

A crack was found on a low pressure turbine blade in the F-35 engine as part of an inspection of a test aircraft February 19.

14. *February 22, Food Safety News* – (National) **Gold Coast expands recall of Seafood spreads for Listeria risk.** Gold Coast Salads of Naples, Florida updated an existing voluntary recall of its Blue Crab Spread to include Maine Lobster Spread, Lobster and Shrimp Spread, and Smoked Salmon Spread, all sold in 1 pound or 8 ounce containers. 15. *February 22, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (Virginia; Minnesota) **Bruce Foods Corporation recall Food Club Red Enchilada Sauce because of possible health risk.** Bruce Foods Corporation recalled 10 ounce cans of Food Club Red Enchilada Sauce because it could contain Green Enchilada sauce instead, which has soy and wheat and could potentially cause an allergic reaction for those with sensitivities. 16. *February 22, Food Safety News* – (Alaska) **18 Now ill with Campylobacter from raw milk in AK.** Public health officials in Alaska have now linked 18 cases of illness to the ongoing Campylobacter outbreak tied to raw milk consumption, including two people who were hospitalized. 20. *February 24, Guardian Express* – (National) **FDA recalls anemia drug Omontys due to reports of anaphylactic shock.** Omontys injections, a drug used for anemia, was voluntarily recalled by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, as well as Affymax, Inc. and Takeda Pharmaceutical Company Limited, after receiving 19 reports of the drug causing hypersensitive reactions, three of which resulted in death. Patients were requested to stop all usage while the companies investigate.
