1. *March 3, Salt Lake Tribune* – (Utah) **Leaking propane tank blamed for fiery Unitah County explosion.** A truck delivering two 250 gallons of propane caused an explosion that left one building destroyed and damaged 11 others in Unitah County March 1. Officials believe the leak valve of the tank was stuck open and once the gas entered the building it was delivered to, it expanded and ignited.

2. *March 1, KAIT 8 Jonesboro* – (Arkansas) **Police: Monette man admits to stealing 300 lbs. of copper from Entergy.** Authorities from the Craighead County Sheriff's Department arrested a man who confessed to stealing about 300 pounds of copper, valued at \$7,500, from Entergy over the course of several months in order to sell the items for scrap.

The tractor-trailer was carrying 41,000 pounds of mixed corrosives and Emergency Response Teams responded to the leak.

- YMCA, ski bowl.** A 12-inch water main break in a line coming from a water filtration plant causes a dune washout near a YMCA parking lot, leading to the building's closure.

15. *March 3, KOMO 4 Seattle* – (Washington) **'Don't touch the water': Sewage spill shuts popular Seattle beach.** A blown cap at a pump station near a ferry dock caused an unknown amount of sewage to flow into Puget Sound. The incident caused the county to shut down a popular beach and post signs warning people of possible medical dangers.

16. *March 3, Associated Press* – (Louisiana) **Power failure blamed in New Orleans water issues.** A 24-hour boil water advisory was given to 300,000 residents along the east bank of the Mississippi River after a boiler-room at a water treatment facility lost power. The cause of the power failure is unknown, but caused a loss of water pressure and concerns over water contamination.

17. *March 2, El Centro Imperial Valley Press* – (California) **Brawley faces \$1.7 million penalty for water code violations.** The Colorado River Basin Regional Water Quality Board recommended the city of Brawley to pay a fine of \$1.7 million for their alleged consistent violation of wastewater treatment plant waste discharge requirements as well as the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System's permit. The majority of the violations in the formal complaint come from a slaughterhouse's inadequate treatment of industrial wastewater.

18. *March 1, Half Moon Bay Patch* – (California) **5,800 gallons of sewer water overflows near Highway 1.** A crack in an old sewer main's piping led to approximately 5,800 gallons of wastewater overflowing onto a highway. Nearly 1,800 gallons was not contained by work crews and flowed into the Pacific Ocean, resulting in the closure of a local beach.

Charges were filed once authorities discovered the breach.

The threat proved to be a hoax as police did not uncover any bombs.

Nitrites were responsible for the illnesses according to investigations, though it has yet to be determined how they entered the water supply.

The cordoned off building is several blocks southeast of a recent gas line rupture at a restaurant which killed one and injured several others.
