1. *July 21, WABC 7 New York* – (New York) **Crews working to restore power to thousands on Staten Island, Long Island.** Over 19,000 outages were reported July 20 across New York City due to electrical load issues amid high temperatures, and 138,000 customers had their power reduced while utility crews worked to restore service. Staten Island Tech and New Dorp High School were established as cooling centers to provide relief from the heat.

2. *July 20, KEYT 3 Santa Barbara* – (California) **Gas line and oil pipeline rupture in Cuyama Valley.** Approximately 210 gallons of oil spilled at the Russell Ranch oil field in Cuyama Valley, California July 20 after a 3-inch gas line and 4-inch oil pipeline ruptured. The cause of the rupture remains under investigation.

3. *July 20, KMTV 3 Omaha* – (Nebraska) **Ft. Calhoun nuclear plant goes offline.** The Omaha Public Power District reported that Fort Calhoun nuclear power plant was shut down July 20 while crews repaired a water leak on one of the plant's four reactor coolant pumps. No service interruptions will occur to customers while repairs are ongoing.

4. *July 21, Network World* – (National) **Car hackers urge you to patch your Chrysler, Ram, Durango, or Jeep.** Fiat Chrysler Automobiles released a manual service bulletin July 16 for various model year 2013 and 2014 Ram, Cherokee, Grand Cherokee, Durango, and Viper vehicles running Uconnect systems addressing vulnerabilities that could have allowed unauthorized and unlawful access to vehicle systems.

5. *July 21, U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission* – (National) **Target recalls Circo night lights due to fire hazard.** Circo issued a recall July 21 for about 143,000 various battery-operated night light models due to an issue in which the night light could

overheat and melt, posing a fire hazard. The product was sold exclusively at Target stores nationwide.

6. *July 20, U.S. Department of Labor* – (Connecticut) **Employees of New Britain, Conn., heat treatment plant face chemical, fire, explosion and mechanical hazards.** The Occupational Safety and Health Administration issued New Britain-based Metallurgical Processing Inc., July 20 with 24 serious citations for violations including failing to train and properly equip employees who perform live electrical work, a lack of a pressure relief valve on a nitrogen tank, and improper storage of chemicals and combustible materials, among other issues. Proposed penalties total \$77,000.

9. *July 20, Newschannel5.com* – (Tennessee) **Highway 48 reopens near Clarksville after semi-truck overturns.** Southbound lanes of Highway 48 in Montgomery County reopened July 20 after being closed for approximately 7 hours after a semi-truck hauling 26,000 pounds of cement overturned and caused fuel to leak onto the highway. Crews responded to the scene and the driver was extracted from the vehicle with minor injuries.

10. *July 20, WXIA 11 Atlanta* – (Georgia) **Tanker truck explosion causes Clayton Mountain fire.** Highway 76 connecting Clayton and Hiwassee reopened July 20 after being closed for approximately 6 hours while crews responded to a blaze near the bottom of Clayton Mountain after a semi-truck hauling 8,500 gallons of gas overturned and caught on fire. The driver survived with minor injuries.

11. *July 20, Corsicana Daily Sun* – (Texas) **Three dead in I-45 crash.** Interstate 45 near mile marker 209 south of Navarro County was shut down for several hours July 20 while crews investigated and worked to clear the scene of a 2-vehicle head-on collision that killed 3 people and injured several others.

12. *July 20, KREM 2 Spokane* – (Washington) **State fire help requested for I-90 fire near George.** All lanes of Interstate 90 in George were shut down between milepost 138 and 154 July 20 while State fire assistance worked to contain a 900-acre fire that caused a Level 3 evacuation to be implemented for multiple recreational areas along the river. No homes or buildings have been destroyed.

13. *July 20, U.S. Food and Drug Administration* – (National) **Barrel O' Fun Snack Foods Co. issues allergy alert on undeclared milk in Vic's original popcorn (1-1/8oz).** The U.S. Food and Drug Administration reported July 20 that Barrell O' Fun Snack Foods Co. of Perham, Minnesota is recalling a specific lot of Vic's Original Popcorn 1-1/8 ounce-bags due to an undeclared milk allergen. The product was distributed through foodservices and retail stores nationwide.

14. *July 20, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (National) **Recall notification report (salad products).** Huxtable's Kitchen, Inc., a Fife, Washington establishment, issued a recall July 20 for approximately 778 pounds of salad products due to misbranding as the products may contain nitrites in the bacon. The products were shipped to stores nationwide.

15. *July 17, U.S. Department of Agriculture* – (National) **Recall notification report 102-**

2015 (sausage products). The Sausage Factory Inc., a Carson City, Nevada establishment, is recalling approximately 5,960 pounds of sausage products due to misbranding July 16. The products were produced on various dates from March 30 – June 12 and shipped to retail locations nationwide.

16. *July 20, Jacksonville Daily News* – (North Carolina) **Maysville officials: partially treated sewage spilled into river.** About 15,000 gallons of partially treated sewage spilled into the White Oak River in Maysville over the weekend of July 18 due to a malfunction with one of the pumps that transfers wastewater at the town's wastewater treatment plant. Officials ordered a precautionary water advisory for residents to avoid the use of the waterway for swimming and fishing until the town is notified of clear water samples.

17. *July 20, Easton Express-Times* – (Pennsylvania) **Lehigh Valley mental health clinics accused of fraud, unqualified psychotherapy.** The U.S. Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania filed a lawsuit against Lehigh Valley Community Mental Health Centers July 20 in response to allegations of Medicaid fraud. A total of nine clinics under the mental health system were accused of using unqualified stand-ins for psychiatrists and failing to meet the minimum time requirement for medication management visits.

18. *July 20, Chicago Tribune* – (Indiana) **Incident forces VA clinic evacuation.** The Adam Benjamin Jr. Veterans Affairs Outpatient Clinic in Crown Point, Indiana was evacuated July 20 after an individual threw a suspicious package over the front desk and fled the scene. The package was determined to not be a threat, and the clinic will reopen July 21.

23. *July 20, SC Magazine* – (International) **Study: half of critical infrastructure IT professionals believe major attack looming.** Findings from a survey of over 600 critical infrastructure information technology (IT) professionals in Intel Security’s “Critical Infrastructure Readiness Report” revealed that about half of all respondents believe an attack on critical infrastructure in the next three years will down systems and lead to loss of life, and that 90 percent of respondents’ organizations faced an average of 20 attacks in the last year, among other statistics.

24. *July 20, KTVZ 21 Bend* – (Oregon) **Monday woes: Bend crash cuts Internet, TV to thousands.** Thousands of BendBroadband customers were without Internet, TV and phone services for up to 10 hours July 20 after an accident in northeast Bend damaged a fiber-optic data line. Crews worked to repair the outage but numerous businesses and government customers were affected, including the Oregon Department of Motor Vehicles, which closed 4 Central Oregon offices due to the Internet outage.

Fire crews extinguished the flames and damages total \$100,000.

Approximately 50 police officers and fire officials responded to the incident and found no explosive devices or suspicious packages.
