1. *July 29, U.S. Department of Labor* – (Texas) **Releasing highly hazardous chemicals lands Gregory, Texas, energy facility in hot water with OSHA.** The Occupational Safety and Health Administration cited Gregory-based Southcross Energy Partners GP LLC July 29 with 1 willful and 6 serious safety violations for failing to train operators, update operating procedures, and other issues, following an investigation into an incident that caused a pressure-release valve to release flammable gas and liquid into the atmosphere for 2 hours. Proposed penalties total \$112,000.

2. *July 30, KSAT 12 San Antonio* – (Texas) **Firefighters battle large fire at steel mill near Seguin.** Firefighters from Guadalupe County and surrounding areas were battling a fire July 30 at a Commercial Metals Company TX steel mill near San Antonio that reportedly started in one of its material feedstock piles. The cause of the incident is under investigation.

3. *July 30, WWJ 62 Detroit* – (Michigan) **Ford Romeo engine plant evacuated over bomb threat, workers sent home.** Morning shift workers were evacuated and sent home July 30 following a bomb threat placed to the Ford Engine Plant in Romeo. Local law enforcement was investigating the threat, while plant officials planned to resume operations with the afternoon shift.

4. *July 29, U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission* – (National) **Whirlpool recalls Jenn-Air Wall Ovens due to risk of burns.** The Whirlpool Corporation issued a recall July 29 for about 33,000 Jenn-Air brand single and double wall ovens, and combination microwave/wall ovens with an extendable roller rack with handle, due to an issue in which the extendable roller rack can unexpectedly disengage, posing a burn hazard. The products were sold at Sears, Pacific Sales, and other stores nationwide, and by wholesalers from March – June 2015.

5. *July 29, Autoblog* – (International) **Mini recalls 30K Hardtops to improve side-impact protection.** Mini is recalling 30,456 various two-door model year 2013 - 2015 Mini Cooper Hardtop vehicles to add more energy-absorbing material in the space between rear interior panels and hatchback exteriors to meet Federal impact requirements.

6. *July 30, U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission* – (National) **SEC charges operators of fraud based in Upstate New York.** The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission charged 2 men and 8 companies July 30 with allegedly defrauding over 125 investors out of at least \$8 million through misleading statements about company prospects, and through the sale of purported “charitable gift annuities” falsely claimed to have been backed by reputable insurance companies.

7. *July 30, ABC News* – (National) **AK-47 Bandit strikes again, robs credit union in Iowa.** Authorities offered a \$100,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of a suspect dubbed the “AK-47 Bandit”, who allegedly robbed a credit union in Mason City Iowa July 28, shot a police officer in a robbery in California in 2012, and is linked to 4 other bank robberies in multiple States.

8. *July 29, Associated Press* – (National) **Investment adviser pleads guilty in \$1.2B Ponzi scheme.** A Florida investment adviser pleaded guilty July 29 to charges surrounding his role in a \$1.2 billion Ponzi scheme that collapsed in 2009, in which he allegedly lured investors to the scheme’s mastermind through deception and false assurances. Over two dozen other suspects have been convicted in connection to the scam.

9. *July 29, Consumer Affairs* – (Florida) **“Thin green line” scam allegedly made millions for scam artists.** Authorities indicted 8 South Florida individuals who allegedly solicited about \$2.4 million from over 200 investors by claiming their company, Thought Development Inc., had invented a device that generated a green laser line on football fields for easier first-down measurement, as well as a scheme in which the suspects fraudulently sold stock in a fee-based gaming serviced called Virgin

Gaming.

10. *July 30, KCRA 3 Sacramento* – (California) **Union Pacific train derails near Galt cemetery.** Crews worked overnight to clear about 1,300 feet of damaged track after a Union Pacific train headed to Illinois from Lathrop derailed in Galt July 29. There was no impact on the Union Pacific train system.

11. *July 30, NBC News* – (Wisconsin) **Two die after small plane crashes at Milwaukee airport.** Two people were killed after a small airplane crashed while trying to land at Timmerman Airport in Milwaukee July 29. The U.S. National Transportation Safety Board plans to investigate the cause of the crash.

14. *July 30, Food Safety News* – (Wisconsin) **70 sickened in Wisconsin Salmonella outbreak linked to pork carnitas.** Wisconsin officials reported July 30 that the final count for the Salmonella outbreak in Kenosha County was raised to 70 people after a May 14 investigation found pork carnitas sold at Supermercado Los Corrales had sickened 10 people.

15. *July 29, University of Wisconsin Daily Chronicle; Associated Press* – (Wisconsin) **First bird flu quarantines lifted.** The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture reported

July 29 that three quarantines surrounding commercial poultry farms were lifted in Barron, Chippewa, and Jefferson Counties following the H5N2 bird flu found in early April, allowing each farm to restock its bird population.

An investigation is ongoing to determine other infected deer.

17. *July 29, WESH 2 Orlando* – (Florida) **Boil water advisory affects 7,500 Volusia County homes.** Approximately 7,500 Volusia County homes are under a boil water notice July 29 after a water treatment plant in Debary lost water pressure due to a mechanical failure.

18. *July 30, Associated Press* – (Missouri) **First computer outage, then water main break causes headaches for Barnes-Jewish Hospital.** A 20-hour computer outage at Barnes-Jewish Hospital in St. Louis, Missouri prevented access to email, medical records, and scheduling July 28. A water main break on Kingshighway which closed all northbound lanes forced 130 patients to be moved to other parts of the hospital later that day after water entered the basement and impacted the hospital's electrical equipment.

22. *July 29, WABC 7 New York City* – (New York) **Fire engine crashes into casino bus in Yonkers; 10 injured.** A Yonkers, New York fire engine on route to an emergency crashed into an Empire City Casino bus, leaving 10 people injured. Four firefighters sustained minor injuries, while 6 bus passengers sustained injuries ranging from minor to serious.

23. *July 30, The Register* – (International) **Cisco IOS-XE update time: squash that DoS bug.** Cisco released a patch for a vulnerability in its IOS-XE operating system (OS) in which an attacker could cause a denial-of-service (DoS) condition by sending a series of Internet Protocol version 4 (IPv4) or IPv6 fragments designed to trigger an error message.

24. *July 30, Help Net Security* – (International) **More than a third of employees would sell company data.** Loudhouse released results from a survey on enterprise security practices polling over 500 Internet technology (IT) decision-makers and 4,000 employees across the U.S., Europe, and Australia, revealing that 25 percent of employees polled would sell company data for less than \$8,000, citing the ready access most employees have access to valuable data, among other findings.

25. *July 30, Help Net Security* – (International) **Most malvertising attacks are hosted on news and entertainment Web sites.** Bromium Labs released an analysis of malware evasion technology revealing that over 50 percent of malware is hosted on news and entertainment Web sites, and reported an 80 percent increase in new ransomware

families since 2014, among other findings.

26. *July 29, Securityweek* – (International) **Shellshock flaw still actively exploited: Solutionary.** Solutionary’s Security Engineering Research Team released findings from a report revealing that the Shellshock bug discovered in 2014 has been actively exploited by threat actors, identifying about 600,000 Shellshock-related events from over 25,000 Internet Protocol (IP) addresses, mostly in the U.S. Researchers noted that education organizations were the most targeted, among other findings.
