1. *June 8, Associated Press* – (North Dakota) **Nearly 700 barrels of crude spill at New Town oil well site.** Authorities are investigating after the North Dakota Department of Health announced that about 690 barrels of crude oil spilled June 6 from a Bridger Pipeline-owned underground pipeline at an oil gathering site near New Town, North Dakota. About 640 barrels were recovered by June 7.

2. *June 8, Associated Press* – (North Dakota) **Pipeline trenching operation causes spill of about 300 barrels of oil; oil has been recovered.** North Dakota officials reported June 8 that a 300-barrel spill of crude oil was recovered and berms were put in place after a pipeline trenching operation damaged a Belle Fourche Pipeline in McKenzie County, causing the spill.

3. *June 6, Wilkes-Barre Times-Leader* – (Pennsylvania) **Family embroiled in insurance fraud case.** Six family members and six family businesses were charged June 6 by the Pennsylvania Attorney General for allegedly unlawfully disposing of or burying solid waste into the ground, disposing of waste from well drilling operations into the ground, overbilling several businesses for contract work, and committing healthcare fraud by having ghost employees on the payroll. Those charged were said to have gained significant financial benefits from the crimes.

## Chemical Industry Sector

4. *June 9, WOWK 13 Huntington* – (West Virginia) **Freedom Industries set to begin demolition of chemical storage tanks.** Contracting crews will begin June 10 dismantling and removing all piping, machinery, and storage tanks at Freedom Industries' Charleston facility following a January 9 chemical spill into the Elk River that contaminated the water supply of 300,000 people. The company halted operations at the facility after the spill and is focusing on environmental remediation and demolition, which could cost the now-bankrupt company at least \$160,000.

The report pointed to stolen trade secrets and intellectual property as the largest source of losses to legitimate companies, as well as the potential for market manipulation and insider trading, among other findings.
